A.P. SINGH INTERNATIONAL PRESIDENT A.P. Singh, of Kolkata, India, was elected to serve as international president of Lions Clubs International at the association's 107th international convention, held in Orlando, Florida from July 13 through July 17, 2025.

International President Singh is a practicing chartered accountant and has family business interests in automobile dealerships.

A Lion since 1984 and a member of the Calcutta Vikas Lions Club, International President Singh has held many positions within the association, including district governor and council chairperson. He has served as GMT international coordinator for four years and as a member on a number of ad hoc board committees. He was chairperson for the 2017 DGE seminar in Chicago, USA, and has served as faculty at more than 50 ALLIs/RLLIs, RLLIs, FDIs and LCIP certification programs. He has also served as multi-national coordinator for Campaign SightFirst II, CA leader for Campaign 100, member of the LCIF Steering Committee and as chairperson of the National SightFirst Committee of India.

International President Singh has participated in and presented seminars at area forums in all constitutional areas. He was the co-chairperson of the Organizing Committee for the ISAAME Forum in Kolkata, India.

In recognition of his service to the association, International President Singh has received numerous awards, including multiple International President's Awards, as well as the Ambassador of Good Will Award, the highest honor the association grants its members. He is a major gift donor for Campaign SightFirst II and Campaign 100, and a progressive Melvin Jones Fellow. In addition to his Lion activities, International President Singh is accredited with the initiation of various service programs in collaboration with other trusts, foundations and corporate houses. He has worked on establishing a web-based Lion leadership development platform, a micro-finance program, and has organized multiple large-scale online events to keep Lions engaged. International







IT'S COOL TO BE A LION IN ALASKA

The first Lions Club in Alaska was formed in Anchorage. They are part of District 49-A Zone 3.

During the year 1944, LCIF was actively involved in supporting the Allied effort during WW 11 and looking ahead to the establishment of a lasting peace.

LCIF had a significant impact during the war and played a role in the formation of the United Nations. In 1943 Lions Clubs International endorsed a resolution advocating for the creation of an international

peacekeeping organization once the war ended.

Lions Clubs International was among the first non-governmental organizations invited to help draft the UN Charter in San Francisco California.

LIONS 5M9 YOUTH OUTREACH SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION

The Youth Outreach Committee of Lions District 5M9 is offering up to \$12,000.00 in college scholarships. The scholarships will be awarded in January for the 2025-2026 school year

To be eligible to apply for a scholarship a student: 1. Must be currently attending the last year of an accredited 2-year program, or final two years of a degreed college program, or final year of obtaining a graduate degree, that leads toward a career which involves <u>directly working with youth</u>. 2. Have graduated from a high school that is within District 5M9 or their home is in District 5M9. The student can only receive this scholarship one time.

The Youth Outreach co-chairpersons of District 5M9 shall do the final selecting and awarding of scholarships.

Required scholarship application enclosures:

- **1.** A transcript of your college grades for all the years you have attended college.
- **2.** Two letters of recommendation. One should be from your college; an instructor or an adviser and the second letter from a member of your community or a Lions Club member.
- **3. Recent photograph**; to be used for the awards ceremony if you are selected.
- **4.** Completed scholarship application including the essay.

Criteria used to select recipients:

- 1. College GPA
- 2. Involvement in college and outside activities
- 3. The two letters of recommendation
- 4. The essay portion of the application

All letters and submissions must be in print form. No hand-written documents will be accepted.
