

Through the Years: A Journey in Time by District 5m9 Historian Lion Zelda Novak LIONS HEAD STATUTE IN BAGUIO PHILLIPINES

The Lion's Head monument was conceived by the Lions of Bagulo in the late 1960's and formally unveiled to the public in 1972, with PDG Luis Lardizabal, DG Robert John Webber and then-president Pedro Z. Dlaravil spearheading the project. The 40-foot sculpture was carved out of natural limestone by Cordilleran artist Reynaldo Lopez Nanyac.

The original Lion's Head was financed partly through generous donations by the Lions members and from proceeds generated by the recently-concluded Convention in Bagul City.

The statute is located along Kennon Road, a major highway in Luzon, Philippines

1971 in District 5m9: There were two District Governors, Ernie Dorn and Frank Callister which was likely a consequence of a mid-year realignment or a change of leadership.

I was unable to find much history of this year.

LIONS 5M9 YOUTH OUTREACH SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION

The Youth Outreach Committee of Lions District 5M9 is offering up to \$12,000.00 in college scholarships. The scholarships will be awarded in January for the 2025-2026 school year

To be eligible to apply for a scholarship a student: 1. Must be currently attending the last year of an accredited 2-year program, or final two years of a degreed college program, or final year of obtaining a graduate degree, that leads toward a career which involves <u>directly working with youth</u>. 2. Have graduated from a high school that is within District 5M9 or their home is in District 5M9. The student can only receive this scholarship one time.

The Youth Outreach co-chairpersons of District 5M9 shall do the final selecting and awarding of scholarships.

Required scholarship application enclosures:

- **1.** A transcript of your college grades for all the years you have attended college.
- **2.** Two letters of recommendation. One should be from your college; an instructor or an adviser and the second letter from a member of your community or a Lions Club member.
- **3. Recent photograph**; to be used for the awards ceremony if you are selected.
- **4.** Completed scholarship application including the essay.

Criteria used to select recipients:

- 1. College GPA
- 2. Involvement in college and outside activities
- 3. The two letters of recommendation
- 4. The essay portion of the application

All letters and submissions must be in print form. No hand-written documents will be accepted.

District 5M9 Youth Outreach Poster Contest 2025-2026

Your Youth Outreach chairpersons are asking that each club sponsor this contest in their school by awarding some prizes at the local level and to bring your winning poster to the Mid-Winter Convention.

Contest Rules:

- 1. Eligibility: Contest open to 6th, 7th, & 8th grade students in all schools in District 5M9.
- 2. Dates: Contest runs from now to the 5M9 Midwinter Convention.
- 3. Sponsoring clubs should plan to conduct the contest in November or December.

 Allow enough time for the students to complete the posters and for the collection of the posters so the club members can vote for their local winners at a meeting. The 1st place poster is brought to the convention.
- 4. <u>Size: 18"x24"</u> poster quality material. We recommend Pacon Tagboard; Item #5220; available at office supply stores and online. (@\$30 per 100) All others sizes will be disqualified.
- 5. Medium: Any <u>directly applied</u> paint, crayon, marker, pencil, etc. Nothing may be glued, stapled or attached to the artwork in any way.
- 6. Suggested Subjects: Drug/Alcohol abuse, Anti-bullying, Peer pressure, Healthy living choices, Positive messages, Current and relevant topics, etc.
- 7. **NO COPYRIGHT SUBJECTS! NO LICENSED IMAGES!** (Cartoon characters).
- 8. Large lettering on the poster is encouraged, because it will show up better.

 Keep the message simple. Posters should be similar to a highway billboard sign.
- 9. Have students put their name on the **back** of the poster, along with their school, grade, and sponsoring club. One student per poster; no partnering.
- 10. Judging: Each Lions club is to submit their winning poster to the District Youth Outreach Chairperson on or before 10:30 a.m. on Saturday of the Mid-Winter Convention in January. Everyone attending the convention will have a chance to vote for his or her favorite.
- 11. Winners will be announced prior to the close of the convention.
- 12. Prizes to be awarded by 5M9 Youth Outreach: 1st place \$100, 2nd place \$75, 3rd place \$50. All other participants will receive a \$25 gift card.
- 13. Poster images become the property of District 5M9 and may be used for display, etc.
- 14. Posters and prizes will be released to the sponsoring clubs at the end of the convention.


