## Early Childhood Matters



# Child and Family Support



**789** children from **496** families received child care financial assistance and related services<sup>1</sup>



**351** families had **383** children enrolled in state funded programs to support kindergarten preparation<sup>2</sup>



**31** families received housing services<sup>3</sup>



**57** children received mental health services<sup>4</sup>



**150** children aged 0-3 from **147** families were enrolled in state funded child care programs<sup>5</sup>
