Child and Family Support



5,817 children from **3,569** families received child care financial assistance and related services¹



4 foster children from **3** families received child care financial assistance and related services²



17 families had **17** children enrolled in state funded programs to support kindergarten preparation³



260 families received housing services⁴



3 families received developmental screening services⁵



133 adults received mental health services⁶



1,066 children aged 0-3 from **589** families were enrolled in state funded child care programs⁷
