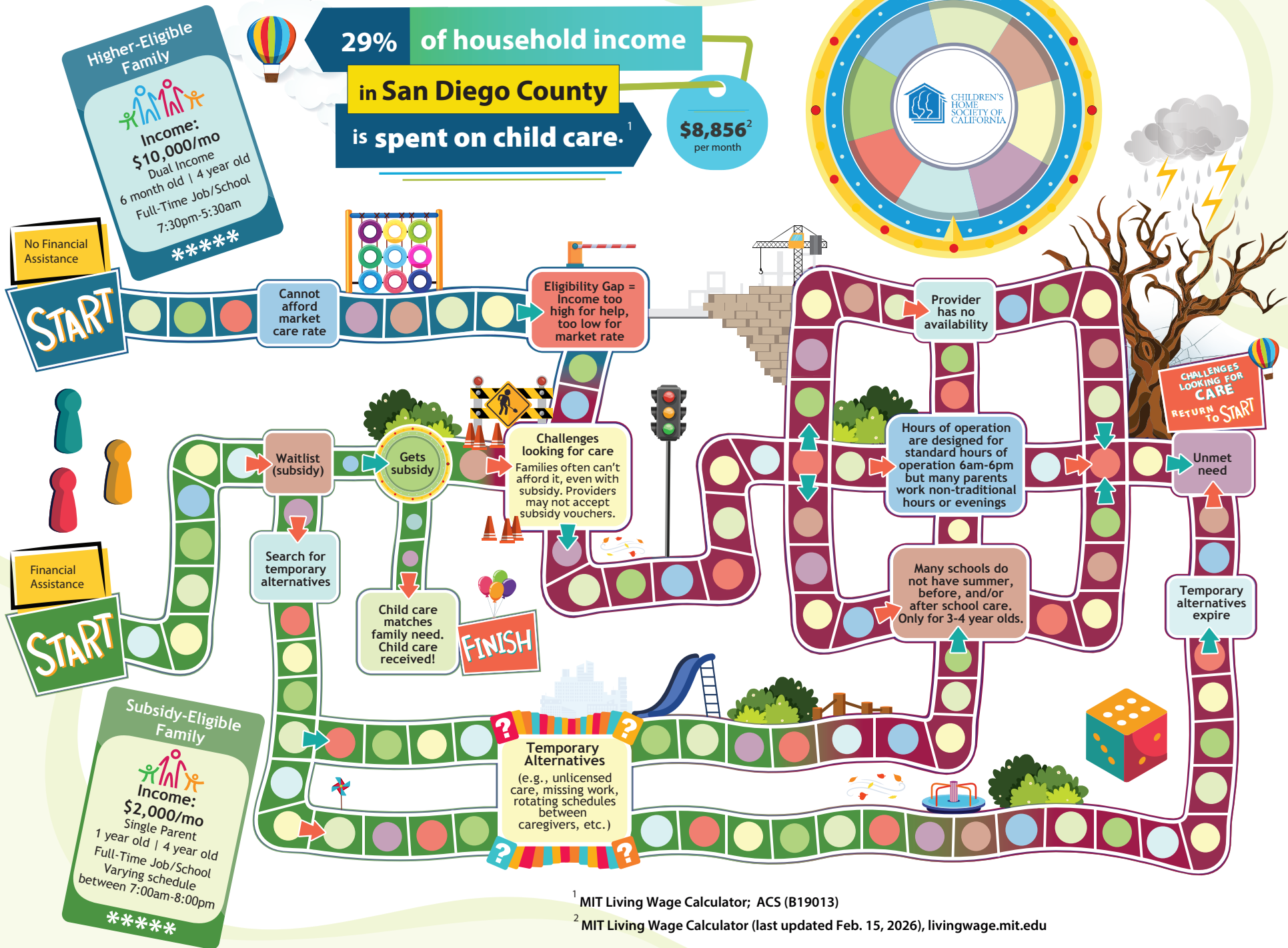

Families Can't Find Affordable Child Care

FY24-25

Now is the time to expand and strengthen the community-based child care system, so families can access the care that meets their unique needs.

The system provides licensed spaces for only
1 in 4 children
with working parents³

Child care costs more than in-state college tuition
Child Care (1 child): **\$16,085/year**
SDSU In-state: **\$6,084/year**

Child Care (2 children): **\$30,581/year** = 29% of their income

207,955 working caregivers of children under 5 in San Diego County.⁴

20,130 Available Licensed Home Spaces ⁶ 71,388 Available Licensed Center Spaces	16,679 Children are enrolled in Transitional Kindergarten (TK) ⁷ TK expansion reduced the licensed child care workforce, shrinking available supply for infants, toddlers, and families who need non-traditional hours.

The current child care system is unable to meet demand.
