

Data Protection Notice for Whistleblowers pursuant to Art. 13 GDPR

1. Data Controller

2. Purposes of processing

Your personal data are processed to receive, assess, and handle reports concerning possible legal violations, irregularities, or breaches of internal policies.

This includes, in particular, compliance with legal obligations under Legislative Decree 24/2023 (whistleblowing) and Directive (EU) 2019/1937.

3. Legal basis for processing

- Art. 6(1)(c) GDPR (legal obligation)

4. Categories of personal data

Depending on the content of your report, the following data may be processed:

- Identity and contact details (if you do not report anonymously)
- Information about observed facts
- Data relating to criminal allegations (Art. 10 GDPR)
- Attachments and documents you provide

5. Recipients of the data

Your data will only be disclosed to parties that require it for the purposes stated above.

- Within Wieser Construction, access to your report is granted exclusively to explicitly authorized persons (“recipients”).
- External recipients:
 - o Whistleblowing Solutions – data processor (system operation)
 - o Seeweb – sub-processor (IaaS infrastructure)
 - o Transparency International Italia – sub-processor (operational support)
 - o Authorities and law enforcement agencies

6. Transfers to third countries

No personal data are transferred to countries outside the European Union.

7. Retention period

We retain personal data only for as long as required by law or operational needs.

- Standard retention period: 12 months
- Possibility of shortening or extending by the recipients

8. Rights of data subjects

You have comprehensive rights under the GDPR to protect your data:

- Right of access (Art. 15 GDPR): access to your stored personal data
- Right to rectification (Art. 16 GDPR): correction of inaccurate or incomplete data
- Right to erasure (Art. 17 GDPR): deletion of your data where no overriding obligations apply
- Right to restriction (Art. 18 GDPR): limitation of processing under certain conditions
- Right to data portability (Art. 20 GDPR): receipt of your data in a structured, machine-readable format
- Right to object (Art. 21 GDPR): objection to processing based on your particular situation
- Right to lodge a complaint (Art. 77 GDPR): filing a complaint with the supervisory authority
