Here are a few reminders:

Send your camper with her bathing suit on under her clothes, as we have swim lessons during the first half of the day. It will make the transition to the pool quick and easy! If she would like to bring a dry bathing suit for free swim later in the day, please pack one as well. An extra towel and extra clothes should also be in her bag.

Send your camper with sunscreen on. Please also send some in their bag, as we are out in the sun a lot, and we will take time to reapply during the day! Bug spray can also be packed and applied throughout the day.

Send your camper with sneakers/closed-toed shoes on, as well as flip-flops or sandals packed in their bag. We go back and forth between pool, sand, grass, and blacktop, so it is great to have both at camp.

Separate bag with lunch for camper in a will not be refrigerated, so make sure it is something that can stay in her bag. Snacks should be small and easy to eat!

Send your campers lunch in a bag or box that is labeled with their name

and group, if possible. If the lunch contains any nuts, please also make a note of that for campers with allergies. Lunches will be stored in the fridge every day.

Make sure everything is labeled! Goggles, towels, clothes, and water bottles should be labeled, as things can get lost easily.

Pick-ups and early dismissals: Please send a note with your camper if there are any changes to the camper's day. Such as getting picked up early or getting different transportation home. Make sure to call the camp office if so that they know something different is happening. If there is no note and no one in the office knows, we will have to follow the regular pickup procedure.

Gadgets and valuable items: Make sure all personal belongings stay at home. This includes cellphones, any other electronics, fidget toys, jewelry, etc. I know it can be exciting to bring fun belongings to camp, but we do not want them to be lost or stolen, so home is the safest place. Cell phones and other electronics are not allowed at camp at any point.
