THE PRIVATIZATION ACT, 2025

AN ACT of Parliament to provide a regulatory framework for the privatization of public entities; to establish the Privatization Authority; and for connected purposes

ENACTED by the Parliament of Kenya, as follows—

PART I—PRELIMINARY

1. This Act may be cited as the Privatization Act, 2025.

Short title.

2. (1) In this Act, unless the context otherwise requires—

Interpretation.

“Authority” means the Privatization Authority established under section 8;

“Board” means the Board of the Authority constituted under section 10;

“Cabinet Secretary” means the Cabinet Secretary responsible for matters relating to the Act;

“Corporation Secretary” means the Secretary appointed in accordance with section 11;

“divestiture” means the disposal of assets or shares of a public entity;

“Managing Director” means the Managing Director of the Authority;

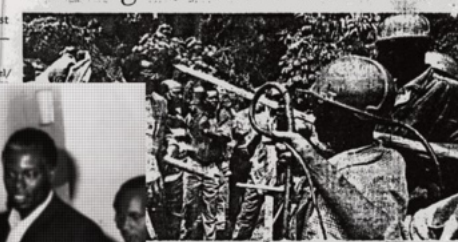

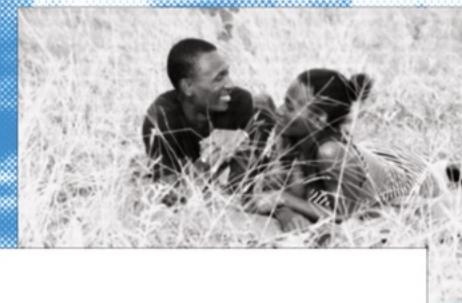
Later, my friend N tells me about the Kenya they hope for. "I always think about what it might mean to move through your city/town/ country without the imposition of the cost, and how that might change people's (including strangers) relationship with each other. Imagine what it might do for our economic wellbeing too. Less costs of travel but also fewer barriers to work, to gather, how much time saved or better spent..."

Remember:

1. What is public should serve the public and not a few individuals.
2. Running services for profit will never serve the people. The people come first!
3. Higher costs result in reduced access, loss of control, reduced quality of life, and in many cases death.
4. Selling public services to profit-makers ni decision za representatives wetu na wanaweza make decisions that prioritise us.
5. Kenya is for all Kenyans and not just the wealthy few.
