



ERP Recovery Checklist: Is Your Implementation Headed for Trouble?

Before you can rescue your ERP project, you must recognize that it's in trouble and understand why that is the case. Most ERP failures don't happen all at once. They emerge slowly: from disjointed processes, scope creep, missed milestones, manual workarounds, and eroded trust in the system.

This quick self-check can help you identify the warning signs early and determine whether your ERP requires a strategic reset.

If you answer **YES** to 3 or more, it may be time to reassess your implementation.

- Are decisions still being made using outdated, inconsistent, or manual reports?
- Do key stakeholders lack visibility into live operations or performance metrics?
- Are teams relying on spreadsheets or shadow systems to complete critical tasks?
- Have you experienced delays or errors during month-end or quarterly reporting?
- Does your ERP feel more like a blocker than a business enabler?
- Have you heard "It's just the way the system works" more than once this month?
- Are end users creating manual workarounds just to get things done?
- Do new hires struggle to understand how to use the ERP without informal guidance or extra support?
- Is your ERP built around outdated business processes that no longer reflect how your company operates?
- Have business needs outpaced the current configuration or capabilities of your system?
- Are you unsure what success with your ERP should look like anymore?
- Have stakeholders lost trust in the accuracy or usefulness of ERP-generated data?
- Are concerns being raised by teams, but change feels slow or uncertain?
- Is there ongoing confusion about who owns key workflows, data integrity, or process handoffs?
- Do executives and operational leaders seem misaligned on ERP priorities or objectives?
- Has user adoption stalled or declined since go-live?
- Is your implementation partner avoiding hard conversations or underdelivering on commitments?
- Are workflows undocumented or inconsistent, leading to daily improvisation?
- Are you constantly reacting to problems instead of planning proactively?
- Are budgets continuing to grow without clear, measurable outcomes or ROI?
