

Overview of the USOPC Compliance Audit Process





USA Surfing's Contended Remediation Progress since June 2025














	FINDING: USOPC Audit noted that USA Surfing does not have audited financial statements, which would include an attestation by an independent, external auditor that reasonable assurance¹ was obtained over the fair and accurate presentation of the financial information presented therein. However, USOPC Audit reviewed USA Surfing's 2024 unaudited financial statements, 2025 budget-to-actual variance analysis through June 2025, and 2026 financial forecast. USA Surfing provided unaudited financial statements that reported financial stability for current operations, however unaudited financial statements do not provide the level of assurance necessary for USOPC Audit to make a definitive determination.					
	In addition, USA Surfing does not currently manage the high-performance program for the Olympic discipline of shortboard surfing. At this time, USOPC Audit is unable to assess if USA Surfing has sufficient cash flows to maintain operations should the high-performance program for the Olympic discipline of shortboard surfing be overseen by USA Surfing.

Report on the Audit of the Financial Statements









2022-24 USOPC High Performance Investment \$1.1M











BACK TO BACK GOLD MEDALS

Caroline Marks continued the tradition begun in 2021 by Carissa Moore at the Tokyo games by winning Olympic Gold at Teahupo'o. The top three women in the world for several years running have been USA Surfing alumnae.



WORLD LEAGUE SURF CHAMPIONS

USA Surfing alum are also World Surf League Champions. Caity Simmers won the title as the youngest champion in history, and John John Florence won the WSL world title while representing his country on back-toback Olympic teams.

EXEMPLARY RISING TALENT

In 2024, USA had the most rookies on the WSL Championship Tour in history: more than any other nation. Surfer magazine called it "America's delta force." The camaraderie and commitment to progression stems from their USA Surfing competition years and is setting a positive example for the next generation of American surfers.

Sawyer Lindblad and Crosby Colapinto were named WSL Rookies of the Year for their excellent season debuts.
