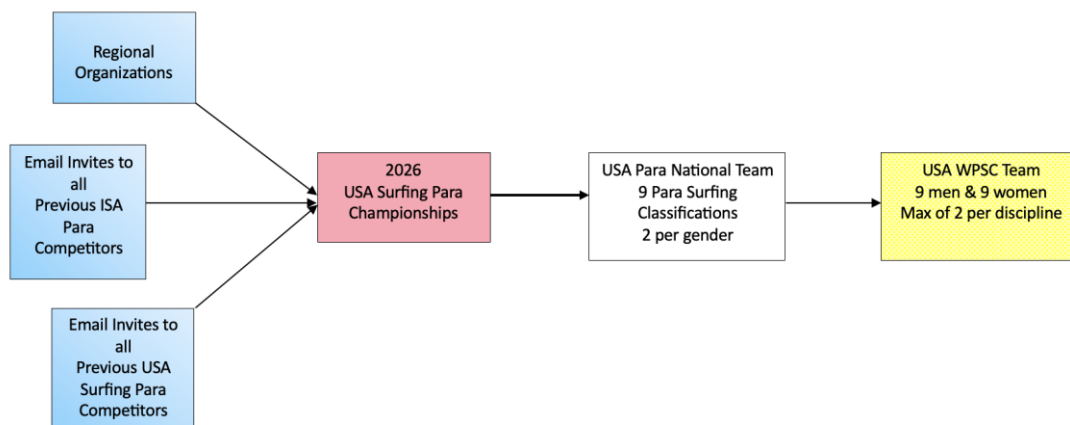

SECTION 1: OVERVIEW

These procedures outline the pathway for selection to the 2026 USA Surfing Para National Surf Team & 2026 ISA World Para Surfing Championship “WPSC” Team for USA Surfing.

The USA Para National Surf Team size can be a maximum of two (2) men and two (2) women per the nine (9) Para Surfing classifications for a total team size of 36 athletes.

Per the ISA Rule book, the WPSC quotas allotted per division are allocated to each National Federation to field a team of up to nine (9) men athletes and nine (9) women athletes across the nine (9) Para Surfing Sport Classes, for a total of eighteen (18) eligible athletes.



SECTION 2: ATHLETE REQUIREMENTS

1. Nationality/Passports Requirements:
 - Have a valid United States passport at the time of nomination that does not expire for six months after the conclusion of the Event.
2. Minimum ISA Requirements:
 - Abide by the rules in the ISA, including nationality/citizenship requirements.
 - Comply with all rules and policies implemented by the Local Organizing Committee.
 - Comply with all ISA eligibility requirements found here: [https://isasurf.org/wp-content/uploads/2024/09/2024-WPSC-Rulebook-Insert-9_2024.pdf].
 - **PARALYMPIC ONLY** At the time of selection, an athlete must have an ISA International Classification with an international sport class status of R-Review, FRD-Fixed Review Date or C-Confirmed, or if there has been no opportunity for the athlete to undergo international classification evaluation, the athlete must be evaluated by the NGB’s medical and/or Paralympic

staff and determined likely to classify in the sport class in which they would be qualified for the Team; provided that the ISA rules allow athletes without an international sport class status to be submitted on the official team entry into this competition]. 3. NGB Requirements:

- Athlete must have an active USA Surfing membership.
- Comply with the USA Surfing Athlete Agreement.
- Comply with the USA Surfing Code of Conduct. [link](#)
- Comply with the USA Surfing SafeSport Policy [link](#) and the [U.S. Center for SafeSport Code](#) including education and training requirements.
- Athlete does not have an active suspension from the U.S. Center for SafeSport that would make the Athlete ineligible to participate in the Event.
- Athlete does not have an active sanction for an anti-doping rule/policy violation that would make the Athlete ineligible to participate in the Event.
- Meet all health and safety protocols, to include vaccine requirements and/or testing requirements set forth by the government, local laws, USOPC, ISA and/or the Local Organizing Committee.

4. Anti-Doping Requirements:

- Agree to be bound by and adhere to all WADA, ISA, USADA and USOPC anti-doping protocols, policies and procedures, as applicable. This includes participation in Out-of-Competition Testing and an agreement to be bound to the results management authority of the WADA, ISA, USADA, or other Anti-Doping Organization as applicable.

SECTION 4: SELECTION PROCESS

Provide a step-by-step description of the selection process including an overview of the ISA Qualification System.

4.1 TOTAL QUOTA PLACES:

4.1.1. The USA Para National Surf Team allocates quotas to fulfill each discipline with a maximum of two (2) surfers, per gender to field the best National Team in preparation for international competition.

4.1.2. Per the ISA Rule book, quotas allotted per division are allocated to each National Federation to field a team of up to nine (9) men and nine (9) women surfers across the nine (9) Para Surfing Sport Classes, for a total of eighteen (18) eligible athletes.

4.1.3. The ISA states that each National Federation can determine which disciplines and how many surfers per discipline can comprise the team of nine (9) men and nine (9) female surfers with no more than two athletes in any one Para Surfing Sport Class.

ISA Para Surfing Sport Classes		
Sport Class		Description
Para Surfing Stand 1	PS-S1	Surfers who ride waves in a standing position with an upper body impairment.
Para Surfing Stand 2	PS-S2	Surfers who ride waves in a standing position with a lower body impairment below the knee
Para Surfing Stand 3	PS-S3	Surfers who ride waves in a standing position with a lower body impairment above the knee.
Para Surfing Kneel/Upright	PS-K	Surfers who ride waves in a kneeling or upright position.
Para Surfing Sit	PS-S	Surfers who ride waves in a sitting position
Para Surfing Prone 1	PS-P1	Surfers who ride waves in a prone position.
Para Surfing Prone 2	PS- P2	Surfers who ride waves in a prone position and need assistance to paddle into waves and while in the water
Para Surfing Visual Impairment 1	PS-VI1	Surfers who have a visual impairment defined by IBSA Sport Class B1.
Para Surfing Visual Impairment 2	PS-VI2	Surfers who have a visual impairment defined by IBSA Sport Class B2 and B3

4.2 EVALUATION EVENT QUALIFICATION PATHWAY:

4.2.1. Para surfers qualify for the 2026 USA Surfing Championships via the regional and international organizations; Western Surfing Association “WSA”, Hawaii Surfing Association “HSA”, Association of Adaptive Surfing Professionals “AASP”, Para Surf League “PSL”, Access Surf, or as a previous 2025 ISA Para Surf Team Member.

4.2.1.1. The para surfer must bring their own support team as needed per their division.

4.3 **NOMINATION TO THE TEAM:**

4.3.1. The two (2) highest placed surfers per discipline, per gender from the 2026 USA Surfing Championships will be nominated to the USA Para National Surf Team.

4.3.2. If all 9 divisions per gender achieve the max 2 quota per division, discretionary criteria will be applied for the ISA WPSC Team Selection

In the event of a conflict between this overview and the ISA Qualification System, the ISA Qualification System will take precedent.

SECTION 5: DISCRETIONARY CRITERIA TO NOMINATE ATHLETES

5.1 **RATIONALE FOR UTILIZING DISCRETIONARY SELECTION:**

Discretionary criteria will be used when the USA Para National Surf Team size has exceeded the ISA WPSC Team size per gender and ISA team nomination must occur for the 9 men and 9 women to fulfill the allocated disciplines for maximum team points and competitive advantage.

5.2 **DEFINE THE DISCRETIONARY CRITERIA TO BE USED:**

The order of criteria is in no particular order, and all criteria will contribute to team nomination.

5.2.1. 2026 USA Surfing Championships heat score totals

- All surfer's wave scores will be summed for a representation of their performance at the 2026 USA Surfing Championships.

5.2.2. Performance metrics from previous ISA WPSC(s)

5.2.2.i 2025 ISA WPSC (Oceanside November 2-7, 2025) final result score

5.2.2.ii. 2025 ISA WPSC heat score totals

- All surfer's wave scores will be summed for a representation of their performance at the 2025 ISA WPSC.

5.2.2.iii Previous medal performance at ISA WPSC within the last 4 years.

5.2.2.iv Total sum of years competing as an ISA WPSC team member.

5.3 **SELECTION COMMITTEE**

The committee that will be responsible for making discretionary selections or other decisions and recommendations directly impacting athletes in the selection process.

SECTION 6: MANDATORY TRAINING AND/OR COMPETITION

Specify the location, schedule, and duration of all mandatory training and/or competition for athletes who are nominated to the Team.

Team trainings and camps will be communicated via the Team WhatsApp channel with a minimum of 30 days notice.

SECTION 7: DATE OF TEAM NOMINATION

USA Surfing will nominate the USA Para National Team and ISA WPSG including any replacements/alternates on or before July 1, 2026.

SECTION 8: REMOVAL OF ATHLETES FROM THE TEAM NGB JURISDICTION

- a. An athlete who is nominated to the Team may be removed for any of the following reasons, as determined by NGB:
 - i. Voluntary withdrawal. Athlete submits a written letter to USA Surfing's CEO or High-Performance Director requesting to voluntarily withdraw from the Team.
 - ii. Injury or illness. A physician (or medical staff) approved by USA Surfing provides certification that the Athlete has a debilitating condition. If Athlete refuses to provide verification of their illness or injury by a physician (or medical staff), their injury will be assumed to be debilitating, and they may be removed from the Team.
 - iii. Failure to participate. Athlete does not participate in all Mandatory Training and/or Competition as defined in these procedures.
 - iv. Code of Conduct Violation. Athlete violates the NGB Code of Conduct: [link](#)
 - v. Athlete Agreement. Athlete violates a term in their signed USA Surfing Athlete Agreement.
 - vi. Non-compliance. Athlete does not meet the athlete eligibility requirements listed in Section 2 of these selection procedures.
- b. An Athlete may be removed as a nominee to the Team or from the Team if found to have violated WADA, ISA, USADA and/or, the U.S. Center for SafeSport Code and the USA Surfing SafeSport Policy, as applicable.
- c. Additional factors for Paralympic Athletes:
 - i. ISA removes the event in which the athlete qualified for the Team from the medal event program.

- ii. Reclassification by the ISA such that the athlete's qualifying performance would not have qualified them for the Team.

SECTION 9: SELECTION PROCESS IF ATHLETE VACANCY OCCURS PRIOR TO SUBMISSION OF ENTRIES BY NAME TO THE LOCAL ORGANIZING COMMITTEE

- 9.1 Should a vacancy occur prior to submission of Entries by Name to the Local Organizing Committee, the next highest ranked athlete from 4.3 will fulfill the quota.
- 9.2. If the athlete is unable to fulfill the quota, the next highest ranked athlete will fulfill the quota and continue the rankings until the quota is fulfilled.
- 9.3 All replacement athletes must meet all requirements listed in Section 2.

SECTION 10: SELECTION PROCESS IF ATHLETE VACANCY OCCURS AFTER SUBMISSION OF ENTRIES BY NAME TO THE LOCAL ORGANIZING COMMITTEE

- 10.1 Should a vacancy occur after submission of Entries by Name to the Local Organizing Committee, if allowed, the athlete replacement will follow Section 9.1- 9.3.
- 10.2 Any replacement of athletes must comply with these selection procedures in addition to PASA regulations including applicable Late Athlete Replacement (LAR) policies.
- 10.3 All replacement athletes must meet all requirements listed in Section 2.

SECTION 11: RIGHT TO A HEARING

An athlete who is removed from the Team has the right to a hearing per the NGB's complaint procedures [link here](#) and the USOPC Bylaws (applies only for a Protected Competition), Section 9 (<https://www.usopc.org/governance/dispute-resolution>).

SECTION 12: REQUIRED DOCUMENTS

The following documents are required to be signed by an athlete as a condition of nomination to the Event:

SECTION 13: DISCLAIMERS

These procedures are based on ISA rules and regulations as presently known and understood. Any change in the selection procedures caused by a change in ISA rules and regulations will be distributed to the affected athletes immediately. The selection criteria are based on the latest information available to USA Surfing.

However, the selection criteria are always subject to unforeseen, intervening circumstances, and realistically

may not have accounted for every possible contingency. If any force of nature, pandemic, or force majeure, should cause the alteration or cancellation of any of the selection events listed in this document, these selection procedures may require revisions.

SECTION 14: CONFLICT OF INTEREST

All members of the Selection Committee (Section 5.3) and all individuals who developed these selection procedures (Section 19) must comply with the USA Surfing's Conflict of Interest Policy <https://www.usasurfing.org/governance/policies> to include completing and submitting a disclosure form consistent with the NGB Conflict of Interest Policy before convening the committee.

A conflict of interest exists when a personal, family, financial, professional, club, team or business relationship or interferes with, or maybe perceived to interfere with a committee member's ability to be impartial and participate in the selection process in a fair and impartial manner. Any member of the Selection Committee who has an actual, possible, or perceived conflict of interest must disclose it to USA Surfing's Ethics Committee prior to the start of the selection process and may be required to recuse themselves from the Selection Committee discussions and/or voting.

If a conflict exists, USA Surfing's Ethics Committee shall review the conflict and determine the committee member's level of involvement (e.g., whether that committee member must recuse themselves from participating in discussions and/or voting).

During its review, the USA Surfing's Ethics Committee may ask a Selection Committee member or an affected person for more information at its discretion. For example, if a Selection Committee member is required to recuse themselves from voting, the USA Surfing's Ethics Committee may still determine that a Selection Committee member who has relevant and necessary information related to athlete performance, such as a national team coach or high performance director, may, if requested by the Selection Committee, provide that information to the Selection Committee if the information is provided in a fair and unbiased manner and if the Selection Committee member with the conflict of interest does not vote toward the final decision.

Additionally, any person with a good faith belief that a committee member has a conflict of interest may report the alleged conflict of interest to the USA Surfing's Ethics Committee. Reports may also be made anonymously through the [USOPC's Integrity Portal](#). No committee member shall retaliate in any way against a person who, in good faith, reports an alleged conflict of interest. In addition, the USOPC maintains a strict no retaliation policy that prohibits any employee, contractor, agent, volunteer, or member of the USOPC to take or threaten to take any action against an athlete for reporting information to or seeking assistance from the Office of the Athlete Ombuds.

Any recused individual shall be replaced in accordance with USA Surfing's Selection Committee appointment process.

SECTION 17: NON-RETALIATION

The USOPC and USA Surfing have zero tolerance for retaliation against people who make good faith reports of potential ethical, policy, or legal violations, or who cooperate with investigations of those reports. That means no USOPC or NGB staff, Board or Committee member, or volunteer may threaten, harass, discriminate against, or take any negative employment or related action (e.g., discharge, demotion, suspension, negative review) on that basis.

APPENDIX B – GLOSSARY

Contingency means a future event or circumstance which is possible but cannot be predicted with certainty.

Delegation Event means the Olympic Games, the Olympic Winter Games, the Paralympic Games, the Paralympic Winter Games, the Pan American Games, and the Parapan American Games.

Force Majeure means an event or effect that cannot be reasonably anticipated or controlled (e.g., hurricane, tornado, etc.).

Grievance Procedures means the process that enables an athlete to file a complaint with the NGB or USOPC.

Jurisdiction means the power or authority to make decisions and judgments.

Nominated means an athlete, coach or staff member whose name has been submitted by the Selection Committee to the NGB.

Protected Competition means a Delegation Event or a Qualifying Competition.

Qualifying Competition means either of the following:

- i. **NGB Qualifying Competition:** Any competition or activity organized or approved by the NGB where the athlete's performance or results are considered in the published selection criteria to represent the United States in a Delegation Event.
- ii. **International Qualifying Competition:** Any international sport competition where (i) athletes represent the United States against athletes representing other nations, (ii) the NGB officially designates entrants, as required by the competition organizers, and (iii) athlete results or performance are included in the published criteria to qualify, or be selected, to represent the United States in a Delegation Event.

Selected means an athlete, coach or staff member whose name has been submitted by the NGB to the LOC at the final submission date, as determined by the LOC.
