Vincentians – Who Are We, What Do We Do?



The Society of St. Vincent de Paul is a worldwide community of Catholic laymen and laywomen who seek to grow in faith and community and to live their faith in service to our neighbors in need.

The Society was founded by a group of French university students in 1833 as a way of offering tangible assistance to the poor. Blessed Frederic Ozanam and his companions chose to place themselves under the patronage of the 17th Century French priest and later saint, St. Vincent de Paul, who was renowned for his care of his poor neighbors.

The Society grew rapidly across France and was brought to the United States in 1845.

The first SVdP Conference in the Diocese of Dallas was organized in 1956 at Holy Trinity Catholic Church in Dallas under the leadership of Joe Lang. Today there are 38 active conferences in the Diocese.

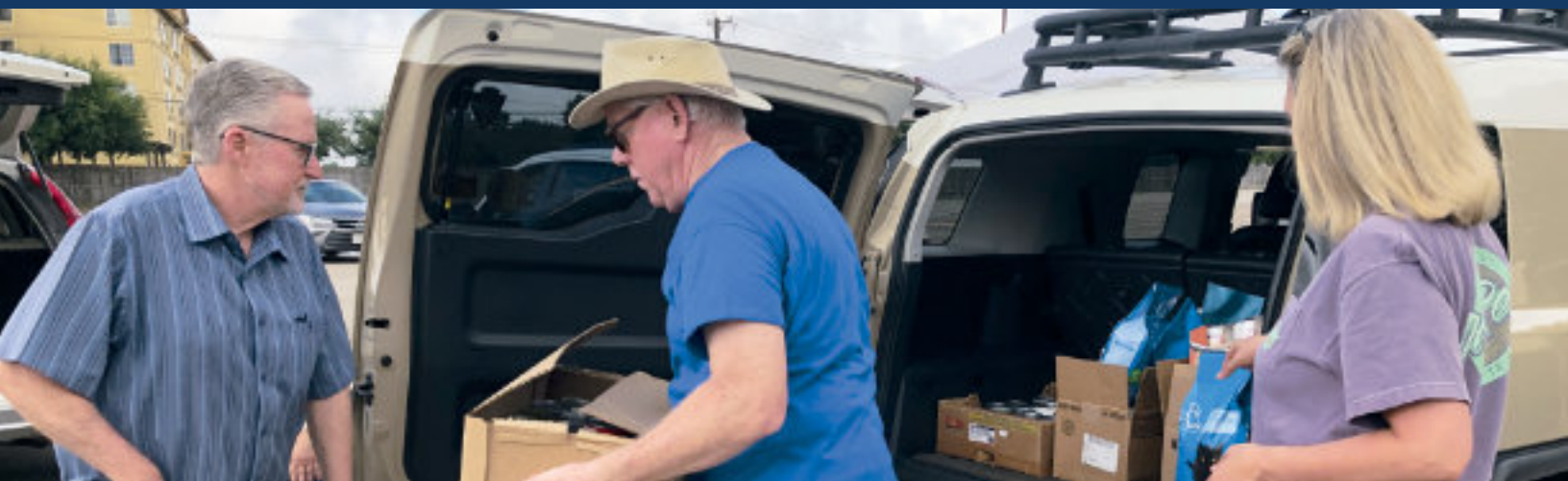

Life in a Conference



Like all other SVdP conferences around the world, a lot of what we do at Holy Family of Nazareth and how we do it can be traced back to 1833 Paris, when Blessed Frederic Ozanam and his friends decided that it was time to start doing something for the poor instead of simply talking about poverty. They went out to find the poor and serve them. Today, the poor find us through our helpline and other outreach efforts, but we still go out to them as Frederic did. We listen to their plight on Home Visits, we pray with them, and we do what we can to



help them by paying a bill or making a partial rent payment. Often, we deliver food to needy families from our SVdP Food Pantry.

At our conference meetings, we pass the hat to raise funds just as Frederic and his friends did. Our fellow parishioners at Holy Family are also very generous. We are extremely grateful for their support and the support of our pastor. This past school semester, two first-year seminarians from Holy Trinity Seminary accompanied us on our

SVdP journey. They shared in our devotion to the poor and we welcomed their enthusiasm and grace-filled energy.

Our conference is a small community drawn together by a shared vocation, our calling. We journey together, finding Christ in the faces of the poor as we go. When we meet weekly, we pray. When we visit the poor, we pray. We pray so we can serve. We serve because we pray.

Conference Meetings

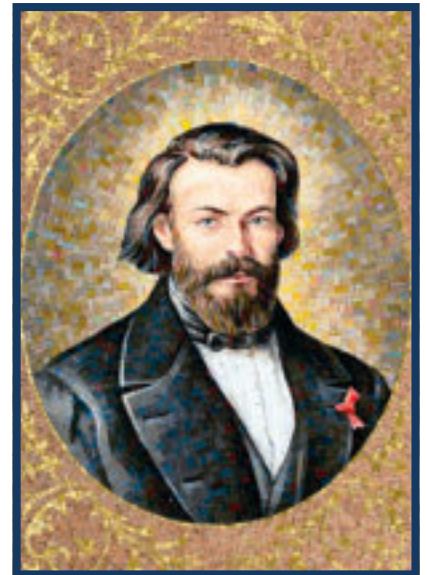
The cornerstone of all service by the Society is a home visit, where two members sit with neighbors in need to learn their story, become friends in the process and offer support and guidance. After that home visit, the two members report back to the Conference, and recommend actions by the Conference.



Ozanam Orientation

The Society offers to each newly recruited member a training session that shares the history, structure and workings of the Society. The one-day training occurs several times each year.

Generous members of the Society share their knowledge and care with these new recruits and others who want to refresh their understanding and commitment to the works of the Society.



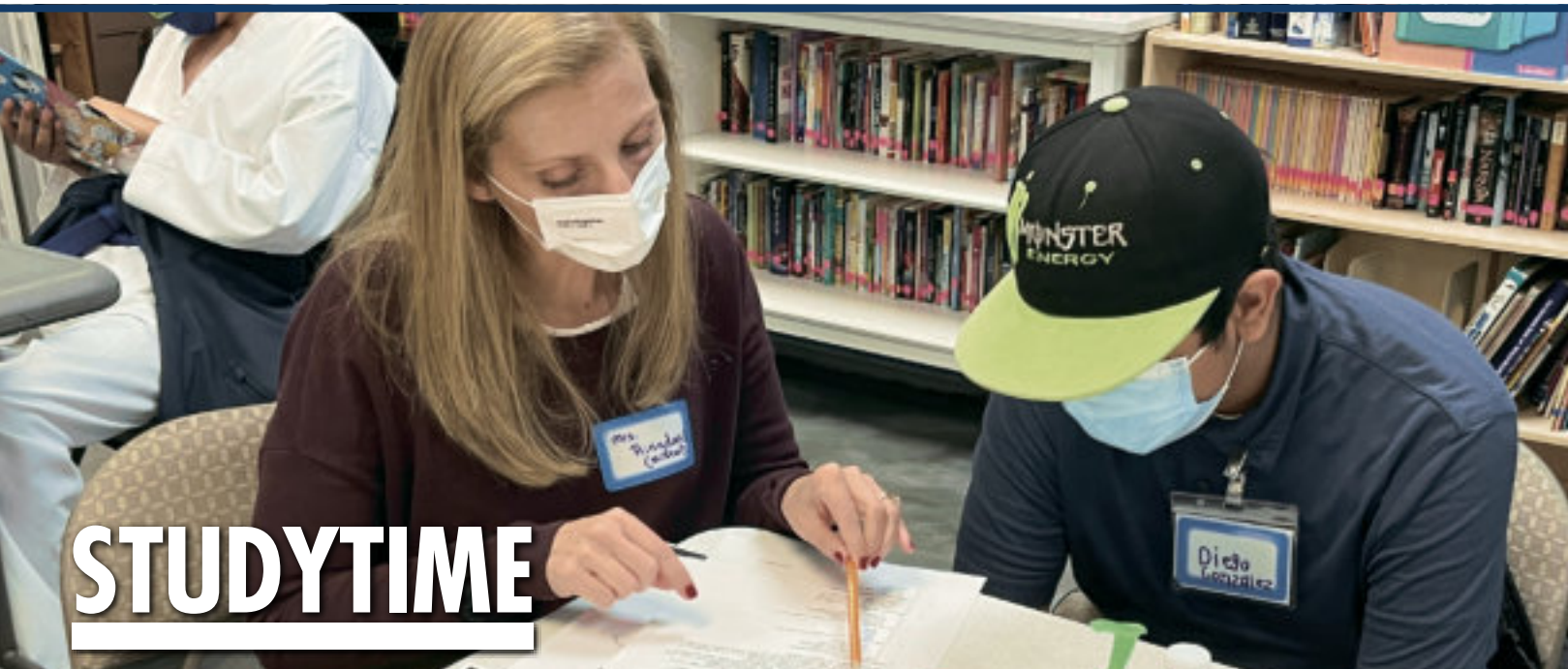
Vincentian Days of Recollection

In February 2023, the Council sponsored “Stepping Out in Faith” at Christ the King Parish in Dallas. This is only one example of several Days of Recollection that the Council offers as times to renew one’s Vincentian spirit and grow in fellowship with other Vincentians. Similar days of recollection are planned at other parishes throughout the year.

Annual Commitment

Each year Vincentians publicly (typically at parish Mass) recommit themselves to the central tenets of Vincentian Spirituality – to grow in faith and fellowship, and to express that faith in service of our neighbors in need.

In February 2023 the Society gathered more than 100 members at Our Lady of Guadalupe Cathedral with Bishop Edward Burns for this recommitment.



Since 2008 the StudyTime program has supported school-age children, working to build math and reading skills, and opening them to the possibilities of scholarships to Catholic or other private college-preparatory schools in the Dallas area.

This past year, we returned to in-person tutoring and enrichment sessions at our two existing locations at Santa Clara School in southwest Dallas and The St. Vincent de Paul Thrift Store on Northwest Highway by Bachman Lake. We were thrilled to open a third campus location at Bishop Lynch High School in the eastern part of Dallas! We saw an average of 125 students each week – roughly 30 students per group.

This year seven 8th grade students in StudyTime were awarded scholarships through the generosity of a donor



who wishes to remain anonymous. These scholarships represent a four-year commitment for the students to attend a private college-prep school, which will pave the way for them to plan for college, oftentimes becoming first-generation college students in their families. In fact, 18 StudyTime graduates are now enrolled in college, including three who graduated this spring.

THE IMPACT OF STUDYTIME ON A FAMILY

Three sisters (Stephanie, Karen and Aileen) each represent the gift of StudyTime. Regular attendees at the Thrift Store location, the girls faced academic struggles in the beginning, but with regular support from StudyTime they have advanced in reading and math. Today they are all at or above grade level in math and reading. Stephanie, now a junior at Bishop Lynch High School, is a regular volunteer – giving back to the program that supported her and the younger girls are following in her footsteps.

HOW YOU CAN HELP

We always need volunteers to serve as homework companions and tutors. Donations to the scholarship fund are always graciously accepted. (Scholarships are awarded as a 4-year commitment to a student, so they range from \$10,000 to \$20,000 depending on the student's need.)





MINI LOAN PROGRAM

Imagine paying 25% interest on a mortgage loan? The thought is frightening, isn't it?

The reality is that for many low-income families who do not have credit histories, the only loans that they can get approved for are predatory PayDay or Car Title Loans where the lenders charge 100% interest or more – usually FAR more than 100% interest.

This means that if they borrow \$1,750, they must pay \$1,750 in interest payments before they pay any of the principle, every year! If they pay \$150 per month it will take 35 years and \$63,000 to pay back the original loan!

The Society's Mini-Loan Program works to provide a true alternative – loans at 3% interest at a trusted bank or credit union. The typical loan we offer is for \$1,750 with a monthly payment of \$150, which means the loan is paid off in 12 months for a total of \$1,800, a savings of \$61,200 compared to the example above!

Our neighbors in the Mini-Loan program build a credit history while paying off the loan in just one year. Upon successful payoff of the loan, the Society makes a gift of \$50 to a savings account at the bank of their choice to help them on their way to financial stability.

“I was in dire need of assistance to pay for my auto title loan from another lender. My interest was at 198% - it went down to 3% because of Saint Vincent de Paul's loan. God is so good! I saved a lot of money because of the MLP loan.”

HOW YOU CAN HELP

The Mini-Loan team needs people willing to help applicants complete the loan application and help prepare them for the responsibility of paying the loan, regularly. The commitment is one week a month, with one to two new clients in that week.



There is no form of charity that is foreign to the Society of St. Vincent de Paul.

Creativity and personal relationships are the keys to the success of the St. Vincent Center in Lancaster, as our program director, Dr. Lisa Hill, responds to the needs of the hundreds of families who look to the Center for support in southern Dallas County. A longtime resident of the area, Dr. Hill knows what the community needs and sets her mind to finding partners to work with us and our hub of collaboration and services.

Rent and utility assistance, clothing, food, hygiene products and a myriad of other forms of assistance occur each week thanks to key collaborative partnerships. A job readiness program, employment referral assistance and a charitable medical clinic are all on the horizon for the St. Vincent Center.

One recent client is indicative of how we try to meet people “where they are.”

Cherron was barely holding it together when her car broke down. She spent so much on paying others for gas, so she could get to work, that she was unable to pay her rent and utilities. The St. Vincent Center team helped her pay the rent and utilities. Since then she has “reinvented herself” – she is now self-employed, has a new car and is on the road to a new life.

The numbers are staggering! Recent US Census data indicates 18.4% of Texans lack health coverage, more than

system, leading to higher costs as conditions worsen, emergency services are overwhelmed and the lives of Texans are at risk.

The St. Vincent de Paul Charitable Pharmacy is helping save thousands of lives by providing life-sustaining medications to the uninsured at no cost to the patients.

twice the national average! An even worse picture emerges when we look closer at cities like Dallas, with 1 in 4 residents having no insurance plan and 3 in 10 being uninsured within its own county borders. Clearly, there's a critical need for increased access to healthcare across our state that must be addressed for the good of our neighbors.

Uninsured patients often put off seeking medical attention until the last moment, with dire consequences for their health and their families. This concerning situation compounds the financial pressures on our healthcare

Since its inception, the Pharmacy has served more than 5,300 patients providing more than 200,000 30-day prescriptions of medicines like insulin, high blood pressure medications and mental health medications. These prescriptions are valued at more than \$53 million.

With the recent installation of a Parata Max robotic pill dispensary and automated telephone service, we plan to expand our reach and distribute more than 125,000 prescriptions in Fiscal 2023 and continue to grow rapidly in the years to come.

HOW YOU CAN HELP:

Let's be the agents of change in healthcare access and advocate for those who need it most. Consider volunteering as a bilingual patient advocate to enroll patients or as a technician to help with inventory. The thrift store team then sorts, qualifies and prices items to go to the sales floor where they are purchased by families looking for a bargain or wanting to stretch their hard-earned dollars as far as possible.

The profits generated by the thrift stores are donated to the Society of St. Vincent de Paul to help provide assistance to our neighbors in need.

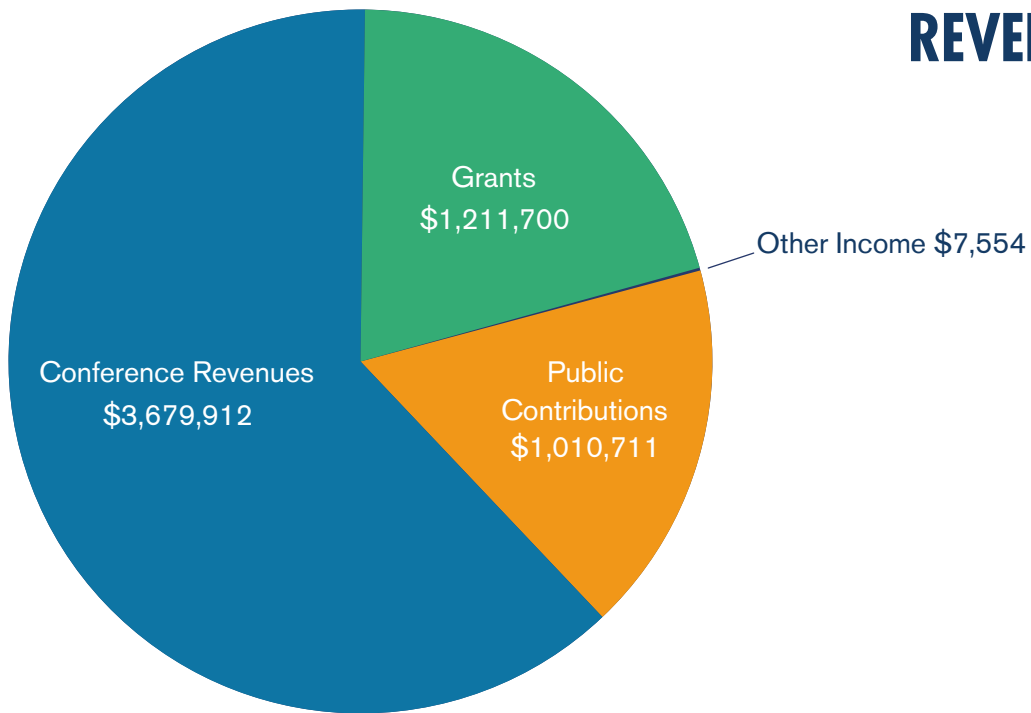

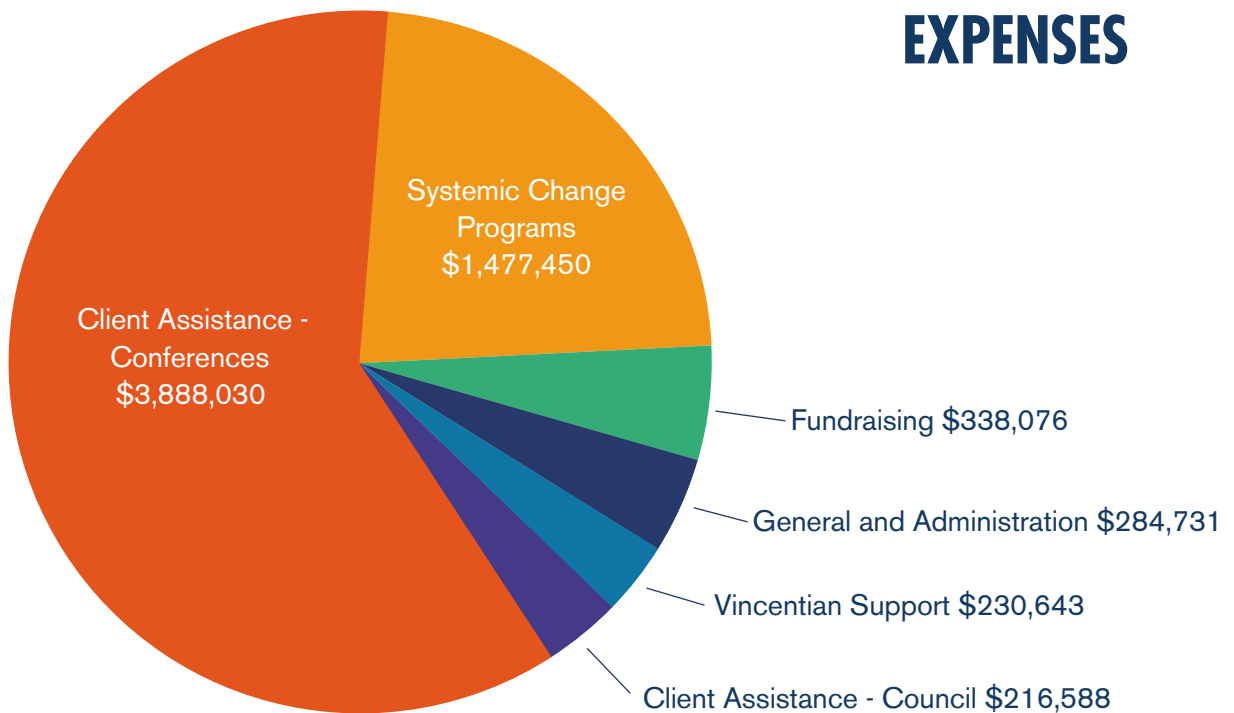
