- Our twelve 8th graders will attend the following high schools in the fall: Arlington Fine Arts and Dual Language Academy, Arlington High School, Bishop Lynch, Cristo Rey, Hillcrest, Innovation Entrepreneurship Design Academy, Jesuit, John Paul II, The Highlands, Thomas Jefferson, Townview-Health Professions, and Ursuline.
- The 2025-26 Scholarship high school students had a combined GPA average of 3.70.
- All five Scholarship seniors will attend college in the fall: TCU, Univ. of Missouri - St. Louis, Texas Tech, UTA, Ogle School - Beauty & Cosmetology
- Parents report that StudyTime provides meaningful support for their children: 100% receive help with their homework, 40% receive individualized tutoring, 90% improve the academic skills they need to succeed in school, and 60% have a safe and nurturing place to go after school
