Hearing: CDBG

Brett Wagner-Governmental Assistance Services in Lawrence KS. There was a publication in the paper required by CDBG for the program. The CDBG program through the State of Kansas has received some covid resiliency money so they are giving out grants. The cities and counties apply for the money and decide how to pass it out to their businesses. The businesses have to have been in operation as of March 1st of 2020. The businesses also have other qualifications to be eligible. Each city or county is eligible for up to \$150,000.00. This is competitive, not all cities and counties will receive funds. Applications must be submitted by the end of the month.

A. Call to Order

The Baldwin City Council was called to Regular Session at 7:00 p.m. at the Baldwin City Public Library, 800 7th Street, with Mayor Casey Simoneau presiding.

Present were Council Members: Cory Venable, Susan Pitts, Julie Constantinescu, Scott Lauridsen, and Jerry Smith.

Also, attending:Glenn Rodden-City Administrator; Amara Packard-City Clerk; Lynn Meador-Communications Director; Dakota Loomis-City Attorney; Chief Mike Pattrick-Police Department; and Russ Harding-Planning Administrator.

B. Approval of Agenda

Cory Venable moved and Susan Pitts seconded to approve the agenda. Motion carried with a vote of 5 yes and 0 no.

Susan Pitts moved and Scott Lauridsen seconded to approve the consent agenda. Motion carried with a vote of 5 yes and 0 no.

F. Old Business

1. Heritage Final Plat

Heritage Subdivision 2B was heard at the Planning Commission on July 11th and approved with a 4-0 vote in favor of moving it on to the council. The engineer of record is at the meeting along with the city's staff engineer.

Sherry Taylor-1808 N. 300 Rd.-Wrote the council members a letter and hoped they had been able to read it prior to the meeting.

Rick Woodhead-1811 N 300 Rd.-Also wrote the council a letter. Rick asked the council to value the people on 300 Rd, value their lifestyle, their needs. He asked for only approving phase one tonight and giving them a chance to work on phase two.

Julie Constantinescu addressed her main two concerns which are greenspace and water run off.

Dean Grobe-engineer for this project, said that he designed a detention facility to handle the water on the west side up to the ridge by Highway 56. They will reduce the peak discharge 34% from the existing condition.

Scott Lauridsen was concerned about the cul-de-sacs meeting the design standards.

Russ Harding addressed the council that the plan meets the requirements for a cul-de-sac. The street would not follow code unless it had two exits, but could be interpreted differently, so would pass on to the attorney. Mayor Simoneau hopes that putting a gate at the N. 300 Rd access point would be sufficient.

Scott Lauridsen asked how they could get sidewalks to align to get people to the crosswalk. There is not currently a sidewalk easement along Highway 56. Dean Grob said that the utility easement is large enough to be dedicated as a pedestrian easement to get it out of the KDOT right-of-way.

Cory Venable moved and Scott Lauridsen seconded to approve the Heritage subdivision final plat as presented. Motion carried with a vote of 4 yes and 1 no.

Jerry Smith-yes, Susan Pitts-yes, Cory Venable-yes, Scott Lauridsen-yes, Julie Constantinescu-no

2. HWY 56

This project came about in the early 2000's. The project is from direction given from prior councils. Current construction cost estimates are around 2.6 million. In the agreement, KDOT will pay up to 100% of that up to 1.673 million leaving the city with around \$900,00.00 to cover on construction costs. Jason Hoskins from BG Consultants gave the council a map with some changes to the plan, eliminating some items to reduce the cost. Reductions were discussed as well as where the funding would come from.

Susan Pitts moved and Cory Venable seconded to accept the reductions recommended by the project engineer for the Highway 56 project. Motion carried with a vote of 5-0.

3. RHID-High St

Susan Buffington-126 E High St.-Provided the council with her analysis of the Housing Needs Analysis from January 2022 and explained her reasoning why the city should not offer incentives to developers at the cost of the city and school district.

Scott Lauridsen said that the developers are waiting on the council's approval to establish a RHID in order to move forward with their plans. He explained that there is no cost to the city. Instead we are foregoing a portion of the property tax that the city would get if they were to build here, for a portion of time. A builder wouldn't want to come to our city to build if we were oversaturated with houses on the market.

Cory Venable moved and Julie Constantinescu seconded to adopt the resolution setting the hearing date for the Trail View rural housing subdivision. Motion carried with a vote of 5-0.






