OVERVIEW

EarShot is the nation's first ongoing, systematic program for cultivating relationships between orchestras and composers.

A national network of new music readings and composer development programs, EarShot identifies fresh voices reflective of the rich stylistic and cultural diversity present in communities across the country. The program is completely customizable; activities are focused to serve each orchestra's programmatic goals and community-defined vision.

EarShot is a program of the American Composers
Orchestra, in partnership with American Composers Forum,
the League of American Orchestras, and New Music USA.

EARSHOT HIGHLIGHTS

Our 2022-23 season of EarShot Readings supported **twenty mid-career composers**, bringing the total number of composers supported through EarShot to **nearly 400**. The season featured collaborations with the Atlanta Symphony Orchestra, Naples Philharmonic, Next Festival of Emerging Artists, and the Dallas Symphony Orchestra, in addition to our own orchestra in New York City.

Highlighting the diversity of composers across the Americas is central to our work; 90% of our 2022–23 participants self-identified as BIPOC and 60% self-identified as women/non-binary/gendervoid. We were thrilled for EarShot Readings to be featured in recent articles by Atlanta's EarRelevant as well as the Dallas Morning News.

EARSHOT OUTCOMES

Each reading generates 3–6 high-level orchestral works from early to mid-career composers, aligned with programmatic priorities.

Composer-orchestra relationships extend beyond the EarShot readings. On average, 1–2 works by participating EarShot emerging composers are programmed on a future concert by partner orchestras; many orchestras commission new works from one or more of the participant composers.

Past participants indicate that EarShot is a defining moment in their early careers, jumpstarting relationships with professionals in the field and building artistic and civic practice skills towards future commissions and residencies.

PROGRAM COMPONENTS

- National call for scores, identifying orchestral composers who have had two or fewer pieces performed by professional orchestras via ACO's vast network of artists and institutional partnerships
- ACO-led preparation of scores, in partnership with copyists and partner orchestras' librarians
- 2-3 reading services with the orchestra, selected composers, and established mentor composers
- Opportunities for feedback from orchestra musicians, librarian, and conductor, leading to score revisions
- Relationship building and professional development opportunities
- Composer-led activities in community spaces and educational settings
- A pipeline to extended commissioning opportunities via ACO and the League of American Orchestras

ACO PROVIDES

- Travel to EarShot partner orchestra city/venue, lodging, and ground transit
- Facilitation of EarShot applications including call for scores, processing of submitted materials, and administering the panel of composers and conductors to review and adjudicate submissions
- Collection and review of all orchestral materials for selected works to ensure scores and parts are of a professional quality
- Professional development workshops with mentors and industry leaders for participating composers
- Communication with EarShot partners including the American Composers Orchestra, League of American Orchestras, American Composers Forum, and New Music USA
- Materials in support of publicity, promotions, and program for the event
- A detailed production schedule and optimal timeline
- 1–2 staff members to facilitate readings and feedback sessions
- Public speaking training and other professional development workshops
- Collaboration with orchestra staff in engaging donors and planning events for supporters and community partners
- Post-reading access to support for commissioning and consortia

PARTNER ORCHESTRA PROVIDES

- Two or more orchestral services, preferably on consecutive days
- Conductor
- Venue for readings and recording session
- Final decision on featured artists/composers
- Catering for working meals while in session during the residency period
- One group dinner and group outing for featured artists, mentors, and EarShot staff
- At least one quality recording of each featured artist's submitted work, made available for each featured artist's personal use and for online streaming
- Library support for preparation and dissemination of parts and scores and return of performance materials to each featured artist
- Pre-/post-event feedback sessions with conductor and musician liaisons
- Commitment to commission one of the final participant composers for a future performance

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CASE STUDY

Detroit Symphony Orchestra

Side-by-Side Educational Programming The Detroit Symphony Orchestra integrated their Education department with the EarShot readings in 2019. Three days before the readings, the chosen participant composers worked alongside ACO Education Director Kevin James, guest artist Jessie Montgomery, and DSO Teaching Artists to create and implement learning modules for students K-12 in local public schools. The learning modules presented at the local schools used the music that the composers had written for the readings to teach concepts of rhythm, improvisation, and harmony.

OUTCOMES

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CASESTUDY

Grand Rapids Symphony Orchestra

Building Community through ArtPrize

Grand Rapids Symphony planned their EarShot readings amidst the city's 2018 ArtPrize festival. ArtPrize is an annual, eighteen-day international art competition which takes place in Grand Rapids, Michigan. The Symphony closed the reading rehearsals to the public but performed the works four times as part of the ArtPrize competition. The widely publicized performances were held in an art museum that was open to the street with speakers amplifying the orchestra's music on the sidewalk, encouraging passersby to come in and participate. The readings consisted of two rehearsals and four short concerts (for a total of four services), and spanned five days.
