Attendance Reminders

- When a student is absent due to illness, parents are asked to verify the absence by either emailing the school office at MBSabsent@mbsbr.org or calling the school office before 9:00am.
- Students who arrive at school after 7:45am must be walked into the school office by a guardian who will sign the student in. The student will be given a tardy slip to admit to class.
- Students who check out of school due to illness cannot return to school until they have been fever-free without medication for 24 hours. Children with a fever at school must be picked up immediately.
- Early check-out procedures are similar. Parent/guardian must report to the school office who will sign the student out. The latest time to check out a student is 2:15pm.

Handbook Reminder (updated weekly)

Grades can be accessed via FACTS online and are provided in 1st through 8th grade. Parents are encouraged to review grades on a regular basis. Teachers are allowed seven calendar days from the assignment due date to post grades. Pre-Kindergarten and Kindergarten student assessments are skills based. Parents will be informed of a student's progress through work papers and tests that are routinely sent home in all grades as well as FACTS Gradebook online. Progress reports for grades 1st - 8th will be posted to FACTS at the midpoint of each marking period.

Report cards will be issued to students in grades Pre-K - 8th grade at the end of the first three nine weeks. Students in Pre-K and Kindergarten will receive paper report cards. Students in 1st - 8th will receive them through FACTS. The fourth and final report card, for all grades, will be printed. Parents will be notified via email when progress reports and report cards have been completed and posted each marking period.

Conferences with teachers may be scheduled by request through written notes or e-mail. Parents requesting a conference with the principal or assistant principal may do so via e-mail or by calling the school office for an appointment. There are two scheduled conference days each year, one in the spring and one in the fall.

Child Nutrition - Allergies

To better serve our students with special diet needs, all dietary orders will need to be renewed EACH SCHOOL YEAR. Dietary requests will be valid only for the school year in which they are written and will expire at the end of the school year. Current dietary requests will expire on the last day of school of this current school year. If you have not submitted a form for this school year, please submit a <u>form</u> to your Café Manager and school nurse on a current Louisiana Special dietary order form. As with new dietary requests, signature from a physician or other recognized medical authority is required. The cafeteria must have the completed form before we can make any accommodations.

School Mass Days

Please take note of the school Mass days on the calendar. Our first school Mass is on Friday, August 15, as it is a Holy Day of Obligation. Please be sure to get your children to school on time so the classes are not late to Mass. Dress uniforms are not required until October. Since it is a Holy Day of Obligation our School Office will be closed to allow our office employees the opportunity to attend Mass.

Carpool Procedures

- Morning carpool begins at 7:20am and ends at 7:45.
- All carpool traffic will enter the school campus through the Church parking lot located at 15655 Jefferson Hwy.
- Cars enter the parking lot on the right side of the church and form two lines.
 - The line on the left is for those students in grades 4-8.
 - The line on the right side is for PK-3rd grade.
- · Both lines proceed through the gate.
- The line on the right will proceed along the buildings and children will be escorted out of their vehicles. The safety patrol students and faculty on duty will open the car doors for you. Thus, all students must be on the passenger side of the vehicle.
- The left line will proceed to the second parking lane. There are no safety patrol or faculty to escort your children from the car. They are to exit the car on their own and proceed to the crosswalk in front of the gym doors.
- · Afternoon carpool begins at 2:50 and ends at 3:15. Students remaining will be sent to extended care for a fee.
- No traffic should enter the front parking lot after 2:15pm.
- Cars enter the parking lot on the right side of the church and form two lines. The lines merge into one at the Car Rider Pro Reader at the back of Holy Family Hall.
- Official MBS hang tags with student's carpool number boldly printed on it must be prominently displayed during carpool.
- Proceed to the line along the buildings and children will be standing at cones to be picked up.
- If you need to assist your child with buckling into the seat, please pull into the gravel parking lot on Baringer to do that.

OFFICE OF CHILD PROTECTION

According to the Safe Environment Policy promulgated by the Diocese of Baton Rouge, **all parish and school ministry volunteers/chaperones must complete a mandatory background check and child protection training**. Child Protection credentials allow the holder of these credentials the opportunity to chaperone/volunteer. All credentialed adults must abide by the sign-up and confirmation process for each event.

PARENTS' COMMITMENT TO CHURCH & SCHOOL

Enrollment and/or continued enrollment at Most Blessed Sacrament Catholic School requires a commitment to ALL of the following:

- Prayer and Mass Families must commit to daily prayer at home. Catholic families must attend weekly, Sunday, Mass on Holy Days of Obligation. Non-Catholic families must attend Sunday services at their home church.
- <u>Service</u> Twenty (20) hours of Time and Talent given to the school and/or Church each year. Hours must be completed between January 1 and December 31 to receive the in-parish tuition rate. These hours are reviewed each year. Definition of an hour of Time and Talent: an actual hour of volunteer work or donation purchases of \$10
- Weekly Church Offering A minimum amount of \$325 will be donated to the Church to support the stewardship program as an Identified Offertory Giver (IOG). Those donations must be made through weekly use of MBS church envelopes, automatic church deductions, or online giving through the church website. Church members who meet the IOG requirement will receive the in-parish tuition. Donations will be verified by December 15 unless otherwise authorized by the Pastor/Principal. Any offerings thereafter will count towards the following year.

Families meeting these requirements will receive the in-parish tuition rate. Any families who have not met the stewardship commitment requirements will receive either the Catholic Out-of-Parish tuition or Non-Catholic rates.

New Students

Time and Talent hours are prorated for new students. However, new families must still meet the IOG requirement of \$325.00 to receive in-parish tuition.

Log your Service Hours into FACTS.

Go to Family > Family Home. You will see "Service Hours" in the middle of the screen. Click "add" to add the hours. You must type in a description. Select "type a custom value," and then type your description.

FROM THE PRINCIPAL

In December, The Catholic Church worldwide, has been celebrating a special time of Grace, filled with opportunities for renewal during this Jubilee Year of Hope. To celebrate the Jubilee Year of Hope, MBS has chosen this year's theme as "Hope is the Anchor of the Soul," Hebrews 6:19. We are excited to begin the school year through this special lens of hope.

Our MBS Faculty, Staff, and Home and School Association have been busy. Our campus and classrooms are gleaming, ready to greet our students and families.

- Friday, our faculty joined over one thousand Diocesan educators at the Diocesan Educators' Gathering, hosted by Most Blessed Sacrament.
- Also on Friday, twenty-five of our faculty members participated in a training called "Stop the Bleed." They learned how to apply a tourniquet, pack a wound, administer Narcan, perform Compression CPR, and how to use an AED.
- Monday, faculty and staff created "Portraits of an MBS Graduate." These portraits shared the characteristics students possess when they leave MBS. Faculty also worked on curriculum scope and sequence for the upcoming year.
- Also on Monday, we installed and learned about an APP called the RAVE Panic Button on our phones. This safety APP allows for anyone on campus to contact emergency responders from anywhere on campus with the touch of a button.
- We ended Monday with a presentation of Artificial Intelligence and a review of the Technology Acceptable Use Policy.
- Tuesday we prayerfully discussed our Catholicity and the MBS Religion Program, had a brief session on the social emotional services provided by MBS, reviewed our health policies and procedures, and reviewed our handbooks.
- Wednesday, we enjoyed a morning at Cypress Springs Mercedarian Center where we celebrated Mass, enjoyed breakfast with the Mercedarian Sisters, had our spirits fed with a retreat led by the sisters and ended the morning with a time for beautiful adoration.

Throughout these days we were able to hear from several people: Bishop Duca, Jason Anquentte, Father Todd, Mother Jeanette, and Sister Trinity. While the messages were different, they all held a central message. We must all make time to let Jesus COME into our life, fill our hearts, and listen to His message so that we can GO and minister to our students and families.


