Attendance Reminders

- When a student is absent due to illness, parents are asked to verify the absence by either emailing the school office at MBSabsent@mbsbr.org or calling the school office before 9:00am.
- Students who arrive at school after 7:45am must be walked into the school office by a guardian who will sign the student in. The student will be given a tardy slip to admit to class.
- Students who check out of school due to illness cannot return to school until they have been fever-free without medication for 24 hours. Children with a fever at school must be picked up immediately.
- Early check-out procedures are similar. Parent/guardian must report to the school office who will sign the student out. The latest time to check out a student is 2:15pm.

Handbook Reminder (updated weekly)

Student Illness

Should the school nurse believe it is necessary for a student to leave school, she will contact the appropriate person to take the student home. We ask that the student be picked up within an hour of being called. Students with fever of 100.4 or above may not attend school until they are fever free for 24 hours WITHOUT Motrin or Tylenol or any other fever reducing medication that may mask symptoms.

Students with vomiting, diarrhea or other symptoms may not attend school until they have been symptom free (without vomiting or diarrhea) for 24 hours. Students being treated for contagious illness requiring antibiotics (such as strep throat), may not return until they have been on an antibiotic for 24 hours. You will be called to pick up your child if he/she returns to school too soon after an illness.

Students absent for 3 consecutive days due to illness should submit a physician's note to mbsabsent@mbsbr.org with instructions on when the student is cleared to return to school.

January 29th : Saint Thomas Aquinas

Yesterday, we remembered St. Thomas Aquinas. Thomas came from a wealthy Italian family. When he was 5, he was sent to a Benedictine monastery in hopes that he would one day become an abbot.

When older, Thomas went to the University of Naples and was introduced to the Dominicans. Their life of prayer and study fascinated him, and he was determined to join them.

Thomas joined the order and became well known for his writings in philosophy and theology. His most famous work, *Summa Theologiae*, contains 5 volumes of thought on all Christian mysteries.

His love for the Eucharist led him to write prayers and hymns that are still used today to honor the Eucharist.

Thomas died at the age of 49 on his way to France.

St. Thomas is a Doctor of the Church and the patron saint of Catholic Schools.

From the Counselor

As we near the first anniversary of the loss of our dear Taylor Melancon, I wanted to provide some brief guidance on navigating this difficult time. I pray it helps you and/or your student(s). And, as always, I am here to support any of you further, so please reach out so that I may do so.

Honoring the anniversary of a sudden, tragic loss is a deeply personal process. You may choose quiet reflection or active commemoration. There is no "right" or "wrong" way to grieve, so focus on what feels necessary or helpful for your healing.

Here are some things to keep in mind:

- Examine (and lower) expectations: Spend some time exploring your expectations and the expectations of others around you. Give yourself grace and patience to feel however you feel. Do not feel pressured to "be okay" or even to commemorate the day if you feel only sorrow or anger.
- Plan ahead: Decide if you prefer to be alone, surrounded by friends, or distracted by activities. But also, allow yourself the flexibility to change any plans when the day actually arrives.
- Express any or all emotions: Allow yourself to cry, laugh, or simply rest—all responses are valid. Feel free to reminisce or not, to look at photos or not, to stay home or go out into the world. Be wherever you are.

OFFICE OF CHILD PROTECTION

According to the Safe Environment Policy promulgated by the Diocese of Baton Rouge, **all parish and school ministry volunteers/chaperones must complete a mandatory background check and child protection training.** Child Protection credentials allow the holder of these credentials the opportunity to chaperone/volunteer. All credentialed adults must abide by the sign-up and confirmation process for each event.

PARENTS' COMMITMENT TO CHURCH & SCHOOL

Enrollment and/or continued enrollment at Most Blessed Sacrament Catholic School requires a commitment to ALL of the following:

- **Prayer and Mass** – Families must commit to daily prayer at home. Catholic families must attend weekly, Sunday, Mass on Holy Days of Obligation. Non-Catholic families must attend Sunday services at their home church.
- **Service** – Twenty (20) hours of Time and Talent given to the school and/or Church each year. Hours must be completed between January 1 and December 31 *to receive the in-parish tuition rate*. These hours are reviewed each year. Definition of an hour of Time and Talent: an actual hour of volunteer work or donation purchases of \$10
- **Weekly Church Offering** – A minimum amount of \$325 will be donated to the Church to support the stewardship program as an Identified Offertory Giver (IOG). Those donations must be made through weekly use of MBS church envelopes, automatic church deductions, or online giving through the church website. Church members who meet the *IOG requirement will receive the in-parish tuition*. Donations will be verified by December 15 unless otherwise authorized by the Pastor/Principal. Any offerings thereafter will count towards the following year.

Families meeting these requirements will receive the in-parish tuition rate. Any families who have not met the stewardship commitment requirements will receive either the Catholic Out-of-Parish tuition or Non-Catholic rates.

New Students

Time and Talent hours are prorated (10 hours) for new students. New families must also meet the IOG requirement of \$325.00 to receive in-parish tuition the following school year.

Log your Service Hours into FACTS.

Go to Family > Family Home. You will see "Service Hours" in the middle of the screen. Click "add" to add the hours. You must type in a description. Select "type a custom value," and then type your description.

Sending Items to School

Please label your items that you send to school from a SignUp Genius:

- **Parent Name (signed up on the SUG)**
- **Name of item**
- **Title of Sign Up (ex: 5th Grade Auction Basket)**


