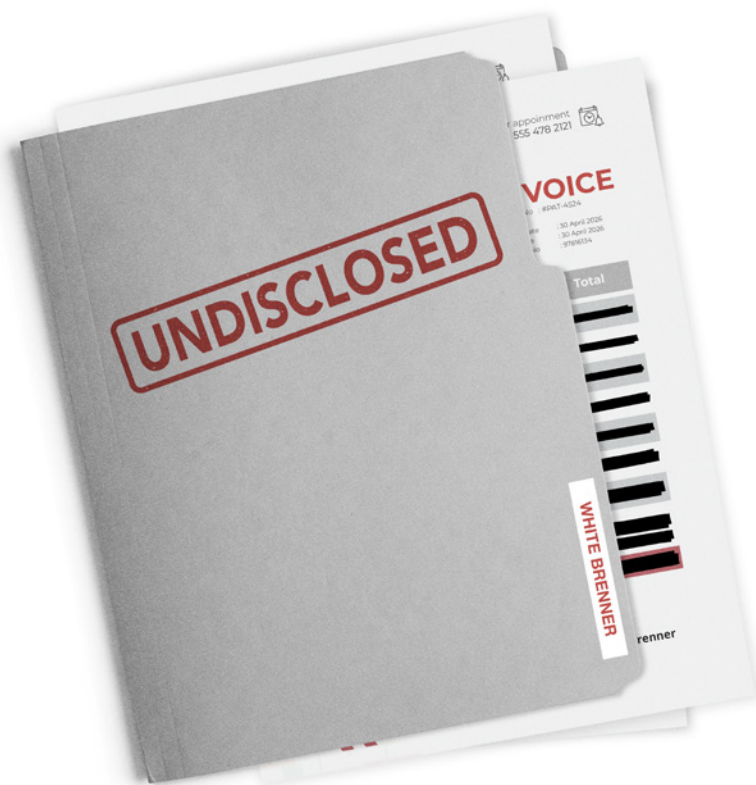


Did White Brenner disclose its lobbying work **for the chemical industry to the city?**

Last week, we revealed that **Patterson City Attorney Nubia Goldstein is a registered lobbyist**, and her law firm, **White Brenner LLP, has been paid approximately \$1 million to lobby for the American Chemistry Council (ACC)**—a powerful chemical trade association that has opposed stronger limits on chromium-6 in drinking water.

Now White Brenner faces serious public scrutiny for failing to disclose its work for the ACC.



Section 9 of Patterson’s Agreement for City Attorney Services requires White Brenner to disclose any activity that could create a conflict of interest. If an actual conflict exists, the firm must withdraw from representing either party.

So, the question is:

Does White Brenner’s lobbying on behalf of the ACC trigger its obligation to disclose a potential conflict of interest to the city?

And if it does:

Did White Brenner disclose its lobbying work for the ACC to the city?

If not, what will the City Council do about it?

How can the firm serve the residents of Patterson while also representing an association fighting against stronger chromium-6 protections?

Patterson families deserve a city attorney who puts their interests first.
