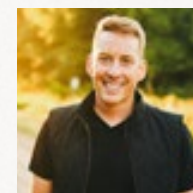
churches and multiplying disciples, building communities grounded in Jesus.

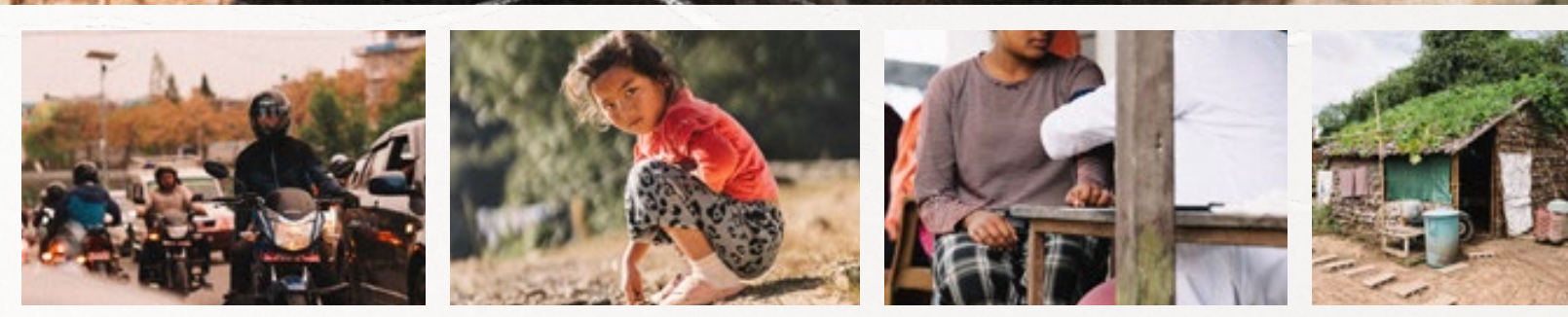

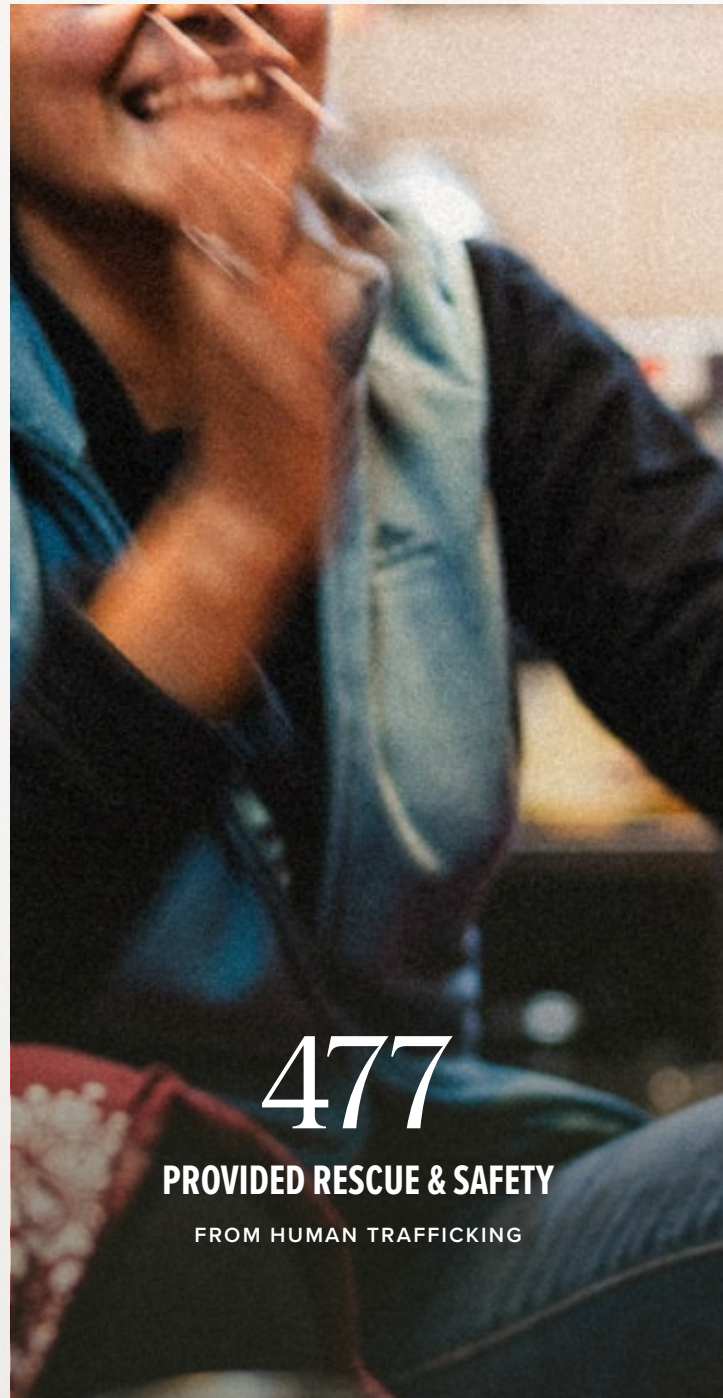

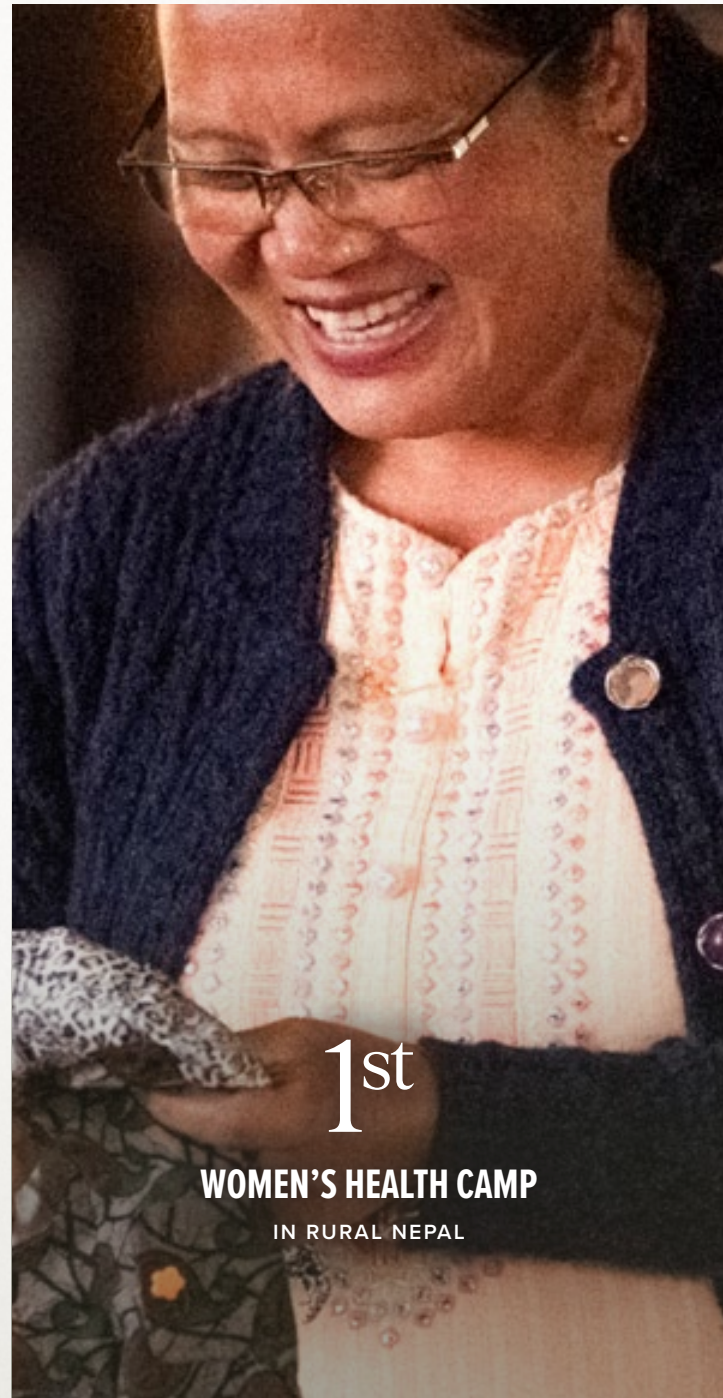

PROGRAM OVERVIEW

Making the Gospel known and fighting injustice are inseparable.

Together, they form the intersection where societal change begins and generational transformation occurs. This approach, *made possible through our courageous partners*, is carried out through four programs.

ANTI-TRAFFICKING

We prevent, rescue, and restore girls from human trafficking by raising awareness, providing safe housing and vocational training, conducting rescues, and offering holistic care rooted in the hope of the Gospel.

WOMEN'S HEALTH

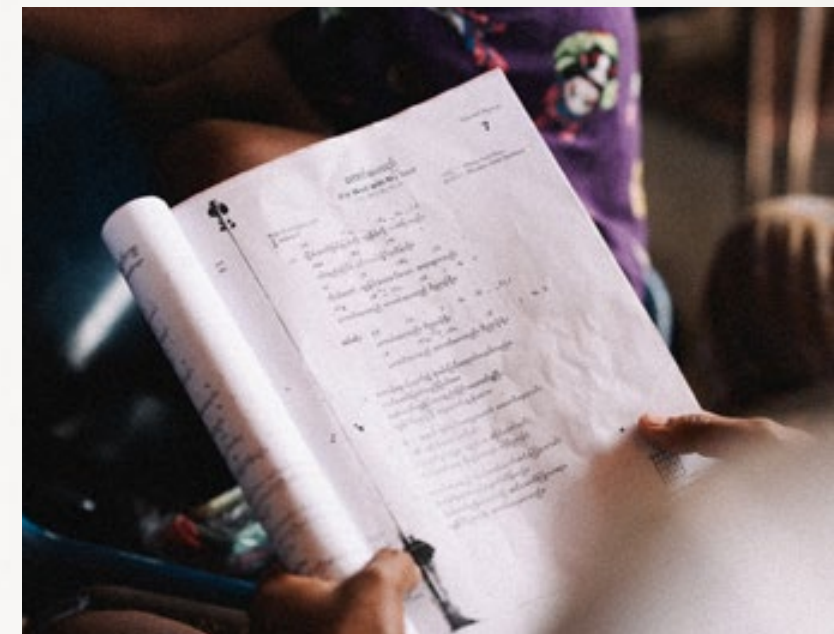
We support marginalized women through health education, Gospel-centered trauma counseling, and vocational training so that they can reclaim their dignity, escape abuse, and build financial sustainability for themselves and their children.

REFUGEE CARE

We provide urgent relief and long-term hope for people displaced by war, addressing immediate physical and spiritual needs while equipping them to begin rebuilding their lives.

CHURCH PLANTING

We share the Gospel in unreached communities—even where sharing your faith is punishable—to multiply disciples and plant house churches, each serving as a vital center for outreach that invites widespread community transformation.



Anti-Trafficking

In Nepal, thousands of girls are targeted by traffickers every year due to extreme poverty, lack of job opportunities, and an oppressive caste system. For these girls, the threat of being sold into slavery is a daily reality. Trained Venture partners free girls from brothels and serve along the Nepal-India border to rescue girls from traffickers. As needed, our partners provide safe housing, trauma counseling, education, and vocational training—all anchored in the hope of the Gospel.

Through prevention, rescue, and restoration, this work allows girls to heal, break the cycle of poverty that makes many vulnerable to being re-trafficked, and create a stronger future.

Choosing Her *Own* Tomorrow

Born into extreme poverty in Nepal, Ruma's* childhood was a constant battle for survival. At just seven years old, she required life-saving surgery to repair a hole in her heart—a procedure far beyond the means of parents who survived by extracting sand from the river for a single meal a day.

Settling a Debt

To save Ruma's life, her family took a significant loan from an aunt—a debt that grew into an insurmountable shadow. The pressure to settle this financial burden fell entirely on Ruma's young shoulders.

When Ruma turned 14, her aunt returned with a promising offer. If Ruma went to India to work at a beauty salon, she could finally clear the family's debt. Trusting her relative and eager to help her parents, Ruma went willingly, unaware that she was being led into a trap.

Ruma was sold into a brothel where she endured years of sexual exploitation. When Ruma begged for her freedom, her aunt claimed the earnings only covered the interest and eventually gave her

an ultimatum: if she left, her eight-year-old sister would take her place. Feeling trapped, Ruma chose to remain in captivity, sacrificing herself and shielding her little sister from the same fate.

A Stronger Future

Ruma's nightmare ended when our partner rescued her, having fought relentlessly for her freedom and clearing the remaining debt.

At 16, Ruma returned to Nepal to live in our partnering safe home with others rescued or diverted from trafficking. While there, she learned cosmetology skills as a reliable way to provide for herself in the future. She graduated in May alongside 36 other girls, each one pursuing a career of her choosing—in beauty, baking, tailoring, electrical work, and beyond.

Ruma and the other graduates look forward to creating stronger futures defined by pursuing their own dreams, inspiring other girls throughout Nepal to do the same.

Refugee Care

Myanmar (Burma) has endured decades of violent conflict. Since the coup in 2021, escalating airstrikes and ground attacks have displaced over 3.6 million people. In the midst of ongoing danger, Venture partners remain present—providing food, medical care, shelter, and the hope of the Gospel to families forced to flee their homes. Along border regions and in communities affected by war, our partners create safe spaces for widows, orphans, and families to heal and rediscover joy. Churches become vital centers for spiritual growth and ongoing relief.

Through relief, development, and discipleship, this work extends far beyond a moment of crisis—equipping refugees to rebuild their lives with dignity and multiply hope for their communities.

Hope that Endures

Global attention turned to Myanmar in March when a 7.7 earthquake shook the nation. Foreign aid began pouring in, yet our partners knew the most likely outcome—the military junta would control distribution, leaving thousands to suffer, unless personal action was taken.

Without hesitation, our partners emptied their emergency food storage to bring immediate relief to families and others affected by the earthquake. As tremors continued, military checkpoints increased and infrastructure collapsed. Dangers intensified, but our partners chose faith over fear. They devised a strategy to pack food into smaller, inconspicuous batches and collaborate with local churches and a grassroots network to distribute meals to those in severely unstable conditions.

Their plan worked. During the immediate aftermath of the earthquake, over **3,200 meals** were distributed to the most vulnerable patients at private health clinics. As needs grew and supplies dwindled, our partners never gave up hope. They prayed for a miracle.

Incredible generosity from individuals, families, and foundations came together to provide three more containers of food, totaling **816,480 extra meals**. Additionally, over **2,500 people** received crit-

ical medical treatment for cholera in severely affected areas, **178 children** received support to stay in grade school, and **199 families**—most of whom were forcibly displaced or lost their homes in the earthquake—received financial assistance for urgent needs and trauma support.

Your decision to give and pray meant that many more people severely affected by the earthquake received emergency food and a critical message of hope. In the short term, you fueled our partners to distribute urgently needed meals, medical supplies, and temporary shelter to thousands who had limited access to formal aid.

For many years, our partners have diligently served in this way because of the war in Myanmar. Their long-term mission to equip refugees and those displaced with the tools they need to rebuild their lives uniquely positioned them to act quickly and strategically during the crisis.

Although the earthquake ended, recovery continues. So does our enduring hope for unity among the people and for the war to end. In the meantime, when children, families, and others in Myanmar and Thailand face food shortages, instability, and airstrikes, our partners continue to come alongside them with relief, rest, and a message of hope.



Women's Health

In rural Nepal, lies passed down for generations lead to silent suffering that only mothers and daughters endure. Venture partners break through cultural stigmas to provide women's health training that's often inaccessible, so women can care for their bodies, prevent infections, and find physical relief. Our partners share about a woman's God-given worth, so they can escape abuse, begin to heal, and believe a stronger future is possible.

Through women's health camps, Gospel-centered trauma counseling, and vocational training, this work equips women to reclaim their physical wellness, dignity, and independence.

Teaching for Transformation

In rural Nepal, extreme poverty and oppression have kept millions of women from accessing basic medical support. Stigmas prevent them from speaking up about their chronic pain, and many die from silent suffering that's often treatable or preventable.

At first, our partner met immediate needs by distributing feminine hygiene kits and health training for women to learn about how God designed their bodies. Since then, it has grown into something far more robust, addressing even deeper needs that impact entire communities.

Expanding a Dream

Our partner, Maya*, has a passion for teaching women's health and economics in Nepal. Blending her passions, she now leads medical teams that bring women's health camps and the hope of the Gospel to extremely rural villages in Nepal. **Our partners break cultural stigmas by serving marginalized women, often traveling long distances across mountains and rivers to reach them.** The health camps treat common gynecological issues such as uterine prolapse—a weakening of the pelvic floor. This condition is painful, highly preventable, and often curable, yet it affects 10% of Nepali women in childbearing years.

The camps also provide life-saving cancer screenings and arrange emergency transport for anyone who requires further treatment or surgery.

Witness the Transformation

As part of the health education, women hear about a God who loves them, seeks out the untouchable, and created their bodies with divine purpose. Long-standing stigmas are shattering alongside this teaching. For the first time, women are seeing themselves differently and caring for each other's needs. Now, the women boldly share this news with their husbands and children. **Entire families are becoming healthier as women share about common health issues, hygiene practices to prevent disease, and God's design.** Each family continues to improve the overall well-being of the entire village.

Our first women's health camp this year brought critical healing and transformation to a rural village in Nepal. Your continued generosity helps marginalized women reclaim their health and wellbeing. Together, we're breaking stigmas and bringing life-saving care to women who would otherwise go without, creating powerful change for generations to come.

Church Planting

Generational lies and societal stigmas have long distorted power structures, suppressing people's worth and purpose in unreached communities. When Venture partners plant a church in these areas, it becomes a source of community outreach and transformation. As people hear about a God who loves them and overcame death to save them, they begin to confront the lies that have held them hostage. Their view of themselves and others shifts, allowing the Gospel to restore dignity, protect the vulnerable, and bring lasting hope.

Through leadership training, discipleship multiplication, and collaborative sustainable solutions, the Gospel takes root and grows. Entire communities transform for generations.

A Song in the Night

In Nepal, the Harijan people traditionally work as shoemakers and leather workers—jobs considered “unclean” in Hindu society. Because of their work and caste, the Harijan community has faced social hardships, usually shunned to the fringes of society as “untouchables.”

A Seed Is Planted

Ram Naryan was well known in his Harijan community as a devout Hindu who practiced witchcraft passed down from his grandfather. However, his entire way of life changed when a traveling pastor and his wife stopped by his home. The couple prayed for his sick aunt, and Ram witnessed a miraculous healing. When the couple shared about the hope of the Gospel, he was the first person in his village to accept Jesus.

Immediately, he turned from witchcraft. The village looked down on him for this, but he courageously practiced

God’s Word, going into the village at night to play music. Crowds gathered around his campfire, eager to listen. Ram sang about God’s love and how it had changed him. Later, he began teaching about the dangers of drug use—a prevalent problem among his people—and helping them learn how to escape addiction.

Transformation Takes Root

Miracles happened, and word spread of a God who heals. More people became believers, and Ram’s ministry grew. Over a ten-year period, 700 people heard the Gospel for the first time, and his entire village accepted Christ. The community began to believe in a more meaningful way forward. Everyone started loving their neighbor, and their entire way of life changed. They became healthier and more sustainable in family relationships, education, and beyond, to support one another.

The Gospel Flourishes

Since Ram accepted Jesus, about 8,000 Harijan people have come to know the Lord, about 700 house churches have been planted in surrounding Harijan communities, and a Harijan man entered parliament—representing the people group in local government for the first time in history.

This transformation demonstrates the power of sharing the Gospel and the inseparable work of bringing hope and fighting injustice in tough places.

How the Gospel is Changing Harijan Villages

- 98% ▶ of families have toilets, when no one used to have proper sanitation to prevent disease.
- 90% ▶ of children go to school, when pursuing an education once seemed impossible.
- 85% ▶ of people have learned about their legal rights for the first time.
- 80% ▶ of people have started jobs in agriculture.
- 60% ▶ of families have houses.
- 20% ▶ of people give back to their church’s local mission.

**These numbers are from Ram’s Harijan village. The cumulative impact extends beyond this.*

Great World Race for Freedom

Four athletes set out to do the impossible: run seven marathons on seven continents in one week—all to raise \$500,000 to rescue and restore girls from sex trafficking. Halfway through the race, the team found themselves caught up in something much bigger than any of them could have imagined.



Brent Silkey, Ellie Romnes, Jacky Hunt-Broersma, and Paul Hurckman trained for months to prepare their bodies to finish one of the most grueling endurance events on the planet: The Great World Race.

From November 15-21, each team member raced 91 to 183 miles (199,000 to 400,000 strides). One day, they faced

blinding snow and negative temps in Antarctica. The next day, they faced a 100-degree temperature swing in Perth, Australia, for the next marathon. They started at midnight in Colombia, running for 6 hours in darkness. The body became weak as their mental, physical, and emotional tolls stacked, yet team morale remained high.

No matter what was thrown at them, they pressed forward, pushing through pain, mental fatigue, and sleepless flights. Struggle became part of the journey, continually demanding their grit, courage, and relentless determination to cross all seven finish lines.

Their story inspired others to join the fight because people saw what happens when courage meets action. Friends and supporters joined through their prayers, encouragement, and generosity. Others stepped into the story through the Unreal Challenge by running laps, shooting baskets, surfing, baking cookies, crafting bracelets, and even selling a cow.

After finishing the fifth marathon in Portugal, the \$500,000 goal had already

been surpassed. A new dream quickly took hold: could the community rally to reach \$1 million?

People leaned in. Moved by the team's remarkable courage, thousands followed the story online and shared it with their circles. Engagement grew. Sacrificial giving poured in from individuals, families, church communities, and businesses, leading to a historic outcome.

In the end, what began as a seemingly impossible endeavor by a team of four finished with seven marathons completed on seven continents in one week—and a global community joining the movement to raise **\$1,009,297** to rescue and restore girls from sex trafficking.



Core Seven

Building Something Bigger

Providing stable, independent housing and services for people who have been historically marginalized while giving back to the community has driven Supportive Living Solutions (SLS) since its founding. In 2022, the company focused its give-back efforts on organizations that not only take care of people but also share the hope of Jesus.

The CEO, Angelica Young, met with Venture around that time and felt an instant connection to the 1-to-1 give-back model: for every client served, SLS could feed a child living in extreme poverty. The mission was clear, and something everyone could easily rally around.

SLS management has been deeply inspired by Venture's partnership. In September, a senior manager started her first trimester of pregnancy, yet she was determined to participate in the company's annual Venture Miles fund-

raising event. She ran every mile she normally would have, even though it was extremely difficult. She still talks about how hard it was.

SLS is one of 20 businesses that all weave generosity into their business models, coming alongside Venture to bring hope to tough places. Thousands of lives are being changed, thanks to purpose-driven business owners inspired to build impact into their everyday work.
