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NOTE FROM THE HEAD OF SCHOOL

Many of you will have had the opportunity to meet Helen Bansback our new SENDCo and we would like to take this opportunity to thank her for her efforts since joining in September.



The SENDCo is the Special Educational Needs Coordinator and it is Helen's job to ensure children with Educational Health and Care Plans receive the provision which allows them to make progress; to ensure that the 60 or so children who are on our SEN register – most commonly with dyslexia or autism – are able to flourish; and, importantly, that teachers are ensuring classrooms are SEN-Friendly environments: we know the strategies employed for specific needs are often beneficial for neuro-typical pupils.

When you consider the array of external practitioners who Helen co-ordinates, including speech and language therapy, occupational therapy and educational psychologists to name just a few, it is quite a job.

This week Helen supported children to deliver the first of our 'celebrating difference' assemblies – this time on hearing impairment.

She also attended our Local Governing Body meeting and presented a mid-term report on our SEND action plan. Governors were walked

through the first two actions on embedding adaptive teaching strategies in the classroom and enhancing the skills of our Learning Support Assistants in delivering effective support with pupils with SEND. Governors were also introduced to our new Sensory Space which is now open and in regular use by pupils in need of sensory regulation. See the picture on the left. It's great to see our community become more and more inclusive as we enhance our practice.

What we've been doing in January:



PC Baadjes arrested the male for two cases of shoplifting and the suspect was charged to court.

PC Baadjes has been working on progressing casefiles for reported crimes within Dulwich Village alongside his proactive work. This includes the investigation into a dangerous dog where advise has been sought from

our Status Dogs Unit. Close work with our colleagues in Lambeth Safer Neighbourhoods has identified a suspect and conditions have now been applied. PC McGahan has been working closely with our Intelligence Team to identify crime trends and allow further targeted patrols to bring offenders to justice within Dulwich Village Ward.
