


Welcome to the QRC Newsletter for June 2025; as always thank you to all service users, relatives and staff for their contributions to this edition.

To the right are Louise, Jonathan, Alex and Julie pictured attending the monthly in-house service user meeting. All four like




to attend the meetings and appear to enjoy putting forward ideas for forthcoming activities.



### 35 Barnhorn Road


