
Party Food!


Valley View Barn

Jamie and Jeremy spent time at a local café this month after completing their weekly shopping.





Staff Training

All staff at Valley View Barn have completed a refresher in first aid skills training with Amy. Amy covered basic emergency first aid skills such as choking, CPR, using an AED, bleeding, stroke, heart attack and sepsis. Staff were able to practice CPR on Annie who gives live feedback on how accurate the CPR is including depth, rhythm and breaths. Amy also taught staff how to use the Restore2 tool to recognise physical deterioration in service users.



Restore2 is used in GP, paramedic and hospital settings and therefore is a universal communication tool for all involved in a service users physical health.

Amy is currently in the process of teaching first aid skills to staff working in the QRC Dom Care services over the next few months.

Amy would like to thank staff for continuing to complete online training at home and on shift. Throughout August over 80 online courses have been completed by staff throughout the QRC services.
