





Valley View Barn



Jordan attended Phab club this month with her father and got to meet some very exotic animals, some of which she held. Jordan was braver than most and got very close!














Lushington Road

Pictured below are Jonathan and Louise at Phab club which has now re-opened after the summer break. Alex is also pictured trying out the punching machine at the Townhouse pub.








35 Barnhorn Road
