Evie reached her two-year anniversary of living at 35 Barnhorn Road in May, so the ladies marked the occasion with a lovely lunch at the pub!

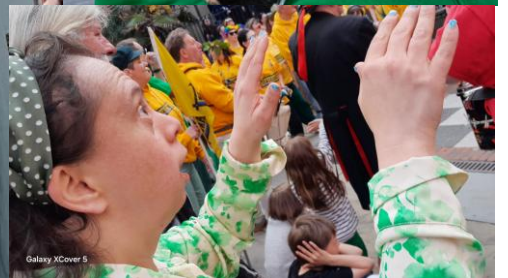




A trip to Alexandra Park was the order of the day for Amelia, Dani, and Evie, who enjoyed a stroll around the grounds and a relaxed lunch together.

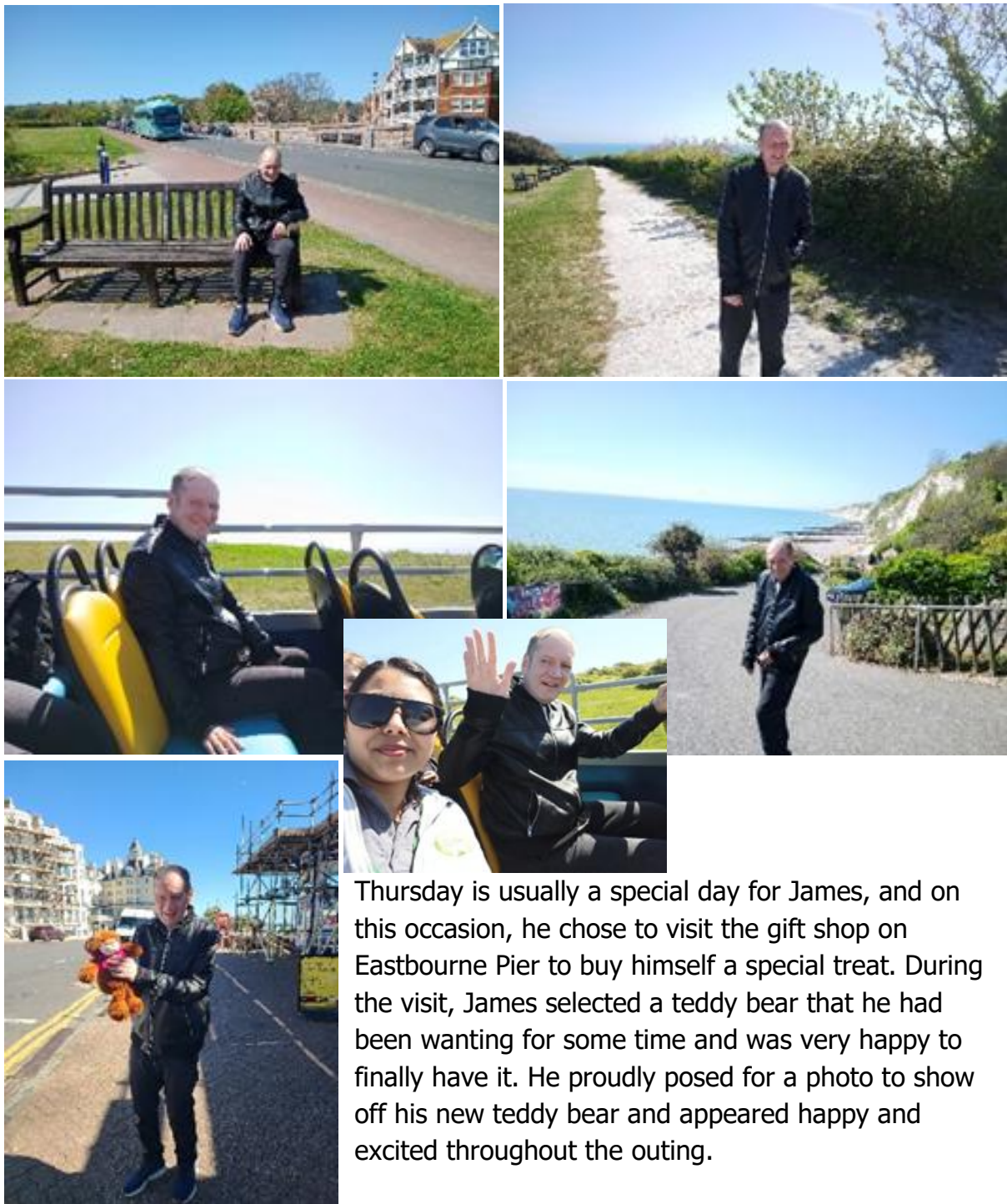

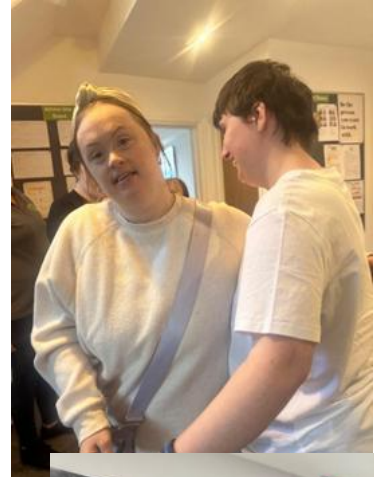




Valley View Barn

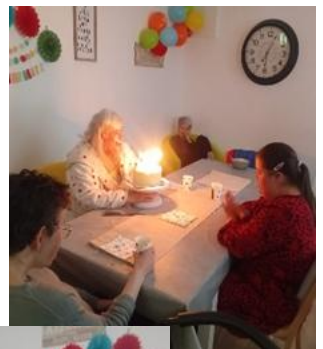




374 Battle Road

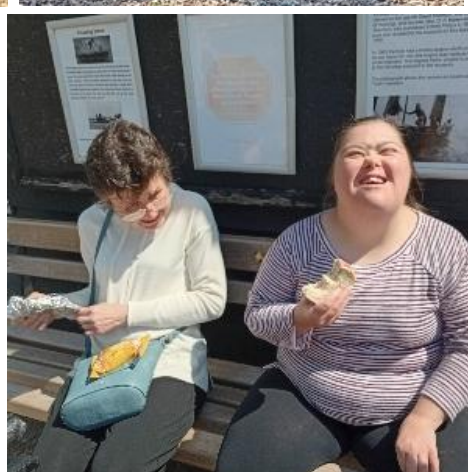

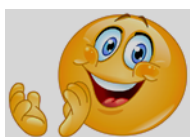

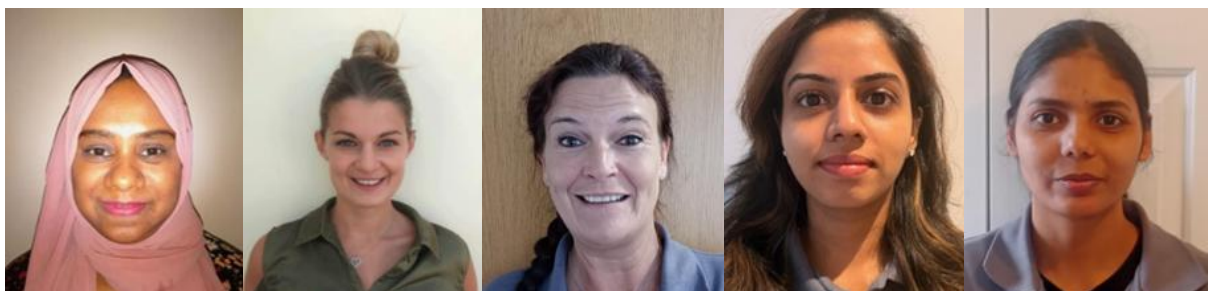
Staff Training
