
## Investment Objective



The Herzfeld Preferred Composite is comprised of portfolios which invest in preferred shares, baby bonds and senior notes. Our objective is to maximize risk adjusted total return.

The strategy is implemented through separately managed accounts and through a private fund structure. As of November 1, 2019, the strategy as implemented through the private fund structure was modified to include private placements, utilize leverage, and hold foreign securities. The strategy as implemented through separately managed account structures does not invest in private placements, utilize leverage or hold foreign securities. The strategy anticipates the use of leverage, potentially through investments that include significant embedded leverage and also through direct borrowings via a prime broker, repo agreement or other lending facility. While providing the opportunity for a higher return on investments, the use of leverage also increases the volatility of such investment and the risk of loss.

**About the Benchmark:** Prior to 11/1/2019, our benchmark was the S&P Preferred Stock Total Return Index which is a total returns index, and includes the reinvestment of dividends. Effective 11/1/2019, no benchmark is presented for the composite because the composite is an absolute return objective and, as a result, we believe that no benchmark that reflects this strategy exists.

Comparison to the U.S. Aggregate Bond Index refers the iShares Core U.S. Aggregate Bond ETF and is for illustrative purposes only. The iShares Core U.S. Aggregate Bond ETF seeks to track the investment results of the Bloomberg Barclays U.S. Aggregate Bond Index (the "Underlying Index"), which measures the performance of the total U.S. investment-grade (as determined by Bloomberg Index Services Limited (the "Index Provider" or "Bloomberg")) bond market. The Underlying Index includes investment-grade U.S. Treasury bonds, government-related bonds, corporate bonds, mortgage-backed pass-through securities ("MBS"), commercial mortgage-backed securities ("CMBS") and asset-backed securities ("ABS") that are publicly offered for sale in the U.S. A significant portion of the Underlying Index is represented by MBS and U.S. Treasury securities. The components of the Underlying Index are likely to change over time. The iShares Core U.S. Aggregate Bond ETF returns are calculated using monthly NAV returns rebalanced monthly, and reflect the deduction of all expenses and transaction costs incurred by the ETF. The expense ratio was 0.03% as reflected in the fund's current prospectus, but may not include extraordinary expenses incurred by the fund over the past fiscal year. Comparison to the IG Corporate Bond Index refers the S&P 500® Investment Grade Corporate Bond Index and is for illustrative purposes only. The S&P 500 Investment Grade Corporate Bond Index, a subindex of the S&P 500 Bond Index, seeks to measure the performance of U.S. corporate debt issued by constituents in the S&P 500 with an investment-grade rating. The S&P 500 Bond Index is designed to be a corporate-bond counterpart to the S&P 500, which is widely regarded as the best single gauge of large-cap U.S. equities.

Effective November 1, 2019, returns are presented gross and net of management fees and include the reinvestment of all income. The Preferred Composite was inceptioned December 31, 2014 and created June 30, 2017.

The Morningstar Rating™ for funds, or "star rating", is calculated as of 12/31/2025, for managed products (including mutual funds, variable annuity and variable life subaccounts, exchange-traded funds, closed end funds, and separate accounts) with at least a three-year history. Exchange-traded funds and open-ended mutual funds are considered a single population for comparative purposes. It is calculated based on a Morningstar Risk-Adjusted Return measure that accounts for variation in a managed product's monthly excess performance, placing more emphasis on downward variations and rewarding consistent performance. The Morningstar Rating does not include any adjustment for sales loads. The top 10% of products in each product category receive 5 stars, the next 22.5% receive 4 stars, the next 35% receive 3 stars, the next 22.5% receive 2 stars, and the bottom 10% receive 1 star. The Overall Morningstar Rating for a managed product is derived from a weighted average of the performance figures associated with its three-, five-, and 10-year (if applicable) Morningstar Rating metrics. The weights are: 100% three-year rating for 36-59 months of total returns, 60% five-year rating/40% three-year rating for 60-119 months of total returns, and 50% 10-year rating/30% five-year rating/20% three-year rating for 120 or more months of total returns. While the 10-year overall star rating formula seems to give the most weight to the 10-year period, the most recent three-year period actually has the greatest impact because it is included in all three rating periods.

The Herzfeld Preferred Composite was rated against the following numbers of Morningstar™ Preferred Stock Category funds over the following time periods: 29 funds in the last three years, 28 funds in the last five years and 24 funds in the last ten years.
