Call 844-620-6050 and we'll walk through it with you. Or text **I need help** to that same number and answer the prompts.



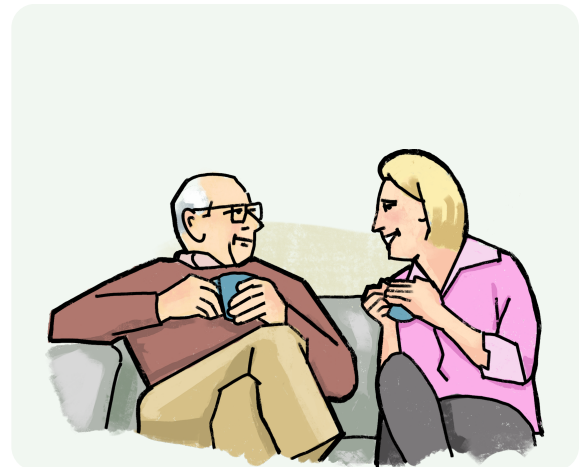
Ask an Advocate

An agency, caseworker, family member, friend, or neighbor can submit requests on your behalf (with your permission).

WHAT WE TAKE ON

Neighbor-sized requests of every kind — not just the handy ones. If you're not sure your need fits, feel free to ask us!

-  **Home Maintenance** — plumbing, electrical, painting, flooring, window repair, wheelchair ramps.
-  **Outdoor** — yard work, leaf raking, gutter cleaning, snow removal, fence repair, tree cleanup.
-  **Neighboring** — cleaning, errands, paperwork, meals, moving help, electronics help, mentoring, prayer.
-  **Items for the Home** — furniture, appliances, home goods, baby and kids' items, temporary food.



Asking on someone else's behalf? The neighbors who need help most are often the least likely to ask. With their permission, submit the request and stay in the loop as their advocate. Agencies and caseworkers: send us the neighbor-sized needs you can't serve in-house.

Someone who shows up. Someone who helps. Someone who cares.
