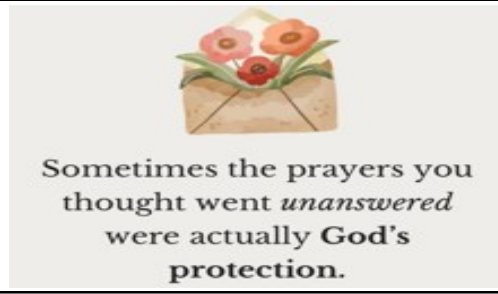

ENCOURAGING WORDS

Give And Take

"The way of a fool seems right to him, but a wise man listens to advise" (Proverbs 12:15). Do I always have everything figured out and every situation sized up properly? Am I completely without "blind spots" in my judgement? Are my opinions on given matters always on the money? Is my insight infallible? Of course not, to all the above. What about you? Ok! That's true with all of us. We should be open to suggestions, to advice. Concerning advice, someone once said, "It takes a great man to give sound advice tactfully, but a greater to accept it graciously."

Advice is like snow, the softer it falls, the longer it remains, and the deeper it sinks into the mind! This is a good thought to keep in mind when attempting to give advice, know your facts. Know the person. Speak out of loving concern and interest. Be careful not to be like Job's counselors. "Miserable," Job called them! An old Arab proverb says, "Never give advice in a crowd. Admonish privately but praise them openly."

He was intelligent enough to listen to advice, but not smart enough or wise enough to properly evaluate it. As a result, his kingdom was divided (1 Kings 12).
