# **TRUST COMES FIRST**

In early childhood education, everything starts with **trust**. It's more than routines or policies—it's the feeling parents have when they step through your doors. It's in the warmth of a teacher's smile, the way staff lift each other up, and the trust that deepens when leaders listen first and lead with heart.

#### A strong culture of trust shapes:

- How your team communicates and collaborates
- How families feel about entrusting their children to your care
- How children flourish in an environment where adults feel connected and grounded

In a field where high turnover is common, **intentionally building connection among your team isn't optional—it's essential**. It creates the kind of trust that helps people stay, grow, and give their best.



### Why try it?

Quick. Genuine. Uplifting. These three activities are designed for busy directors and ever-changing teams. No awkward icebreakers—just real ways to help your people feel **seen**, **supported**, and **part of something meaningful.** 

# **TWO TRUTHS & A CHILDHOOD**

This activity is a fun, quick way to learn about each other through personal stories. It blends play and nostalgia while offering glimpses into each person's personality and background—without feeling forced.

#### **Materials:**

Just your voices

#### How it works:

Each person shares:

- Two true facts about themselves
- One detail from their early childhood (favorite toy, snack, or memory)

The group then guesses which one is the childhood story.



**Pro tip:** Following this activity, take time to discuss why these childhood details were memorable and how you can help children in your center create similar memories. 2

This activity sparks one-on-one connections that might not happen in the daily hustle. It gives early childhood educators a chance to build relationships beyond their usual roles and routines.

### **Materials:**

Question prompts

### How it works:

- Every staff member rotates seats and pairs up with someone new each round.
- Each pair gets 1–2 minutes to answer a fun, lowstakes question prompt.
- Keep it light, fun, and open-ended! Rotate pairs every few minutes as time allows.



**Pro tip:** Switch it up! Encourage staff to sit with people they don't normally work with. This creates fresh conversations and helps build a stronger, more connected team.

# **3 STORY BEHIND THE OBJECT**

This activity encourages vulnerability and personal sharing in a safe, supportive way. It sparks empathy, laughter, and helps staff see one another beyond their job titles.

#### Materials:

A common object (toy, crayon, puppet, block, etc.)

#### How it works:

- Place the object in the center of the group or pass it around.
- Each team member briefly shares a story, memory, or personal connection related to that object—or something similar from their own childhood.
- Example: Holding a stuffed bear, someone might share, "I had a teddy bear named Max that I took to preschool every day. My mom said it was the only way she could drop me off without tears."
- Encourage storytelling over perfection. This is about connection, not performance.

**Pro tip:** Have a leader or confident team member go first to set the tone. Keeping stories short and light helps everyone feel comfortable opening up.

# **TRUST MATTERS**

Building trust doesn't take big budgets or elaborate retreats. Often, it's simply about pausing long enough to truly notice one another. These small moments of connection lay the foundation for a supportive, caring, and strong team culture.

Keep it simple. Be yourself. And keep building trust one moment at a time.

- What's the most unusual talent or skill you have?
- What's a sound or smell that instantly brings you back to your childhood?
- Do you prefer coffee, tea, or something else entirely?
- What's a value you learned from your family that you carry with you?
- Who's someone who had a big impact on your life?
- What does a "great day" at work look like to you?
- What's one thing you admire in others?
- What's a funny or silly thing you did often as a young child?
- What's one thing that always makes you laugh?
- What's your favorite way to unwind after work?
- What inspires you most about working with children?
