#### **ACTIVITY OVERVIEW**



#### **Purpose:**

Your greatest PD resource might be right down the hall. Inspired by Principal Diane Beninato, this low-lift rotation gives teachers a chance to step into each other's classrooms, spark new ideas, and spotlight great teaching—without adding to their plates. It builds connection, professional growth, and a culture of celebration.



#### When to Use It:

This idea works all year long. Try launching it in:

- September to kick off a collaborative tone
- January to re-energize midyear
- Spring to finish strong and collect great ideas to carry forward Aim for once a semester—or even once a quarter if your schedule allows. The key is consistency over perfection.



#### **Key Benefits:**

- Encourages professional growth by sharing real strategies and ideas from fellow teachers
- Strengthens relationships and trust across grade levels and teams
- Spotlights everyday excellence and builds a culture of recognition and celebration.

#### **ACTIVITY DIRECTIONS**

Here are the steps to try out this activity with your team throughout the school year.

#### 1. Draw a Name

Teachers randomly draw a colleague's name each semester to determine which classroom they'll visit. This ensures they don't just pick their friends—and opens the door to surprising inspiration.

#### 2. Take a 10-Minute Visit

Teachers schedule a 10-minute visit during the school day. The principal steps in to cover a duty—like recess or lunch—so it's not "one more thing."

#### 3. Leave a Note

After the visit, the teacher fills out a quick "I Noticed..." card. For example:

- "When I was in your classroom, I noticed \_\_\_\_\_.
- It stood out because \_\_\_\_\_.
- Thanks for doing what's best for kids!"

#### 4. Celebrate It!

The principal takes a photo of the note and sends it to both the observer and the teacher who was observed. Then, the note gets posted on a hallway bulletin board to showcase the great things happening across classrooms.

# OPTIONAL ACTIVITY ADD-ONS



- Tie It to Your School Theme: Diane used a TEAM theme (Together Everyone Achieves More) and printed die-cut cards with TEAM symbols to make it fun and on-brand.
- Newsletter Shout-Outs: She also includes a staff spotlight in her "Cool Things from My Colleagues" section in her monthly professional learning newsletter. A great way to reinforce the celebration and share ideas schoolwide! Check out an example below!
- Photo-Friendly: Add a headshot or quick quote from the observing teacher if they're comfortable —this makes the bulletin board feel even more personal.



#### **ALPACA PRO TIP:**

Use your classroom rotation board to spark future peer learning days or invite teachers to lead mini-PD sessions based on what was observed. **Learning grows stronger when it's shared.**
