## LOCATION & FACILITIES

We have a large beautiful purpose-built campus in the An Phu Area of Thu Duc City which houses 2 Swimming Pools, 2 Gymnasiums, 2 Libraries, 2 Football Fields and a Golf Driving Range. Classrooms are large, well lit, and are filled with discussion, laughter, and purpose. The Auditorium is located on Levels 3 and 4, just below 9 Science Labs, and a Rooftop Garden complemented by a Tennis Court.

## TAS TEACHING FACULTY

The vast majority of teachers hail from North America/UK and all possess qualified teacher status, experience in their subject, and are caring, positive role models for student population. The Western Foreign Faculty is supported by knowledgeable and bilingual Vietnamese Staff, made up of Assistant Teachers, Specialist Roles, and Division Administrators.

## TAS STUDENT BODY

The student body is globally diverse with students coming from all over the world. More than 400 students are enrolled at The American School with 60% of the students enrolled in Middle School and High School. The graduating class of 2024 consisted of 36 students who came from countries such as France, Russia, South Korea, U.S.A, and Vietnam. About 80% of the students who complete their education at The American School continue their academic career abroad in countries such as America, Australia, Canada, and more.

From 2013–2023, TAS students have raised USD 71,700 to provide over 50 underprivileged Vietnamese children life-saving heart surgery.

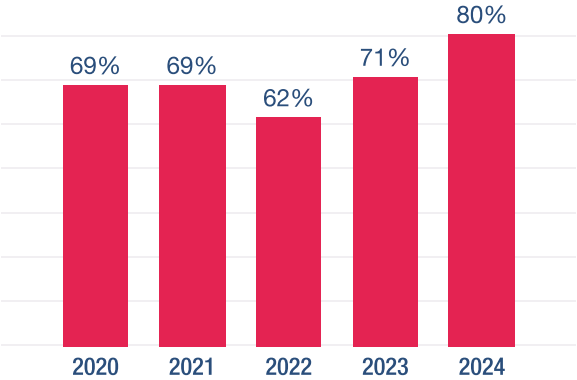


### Habitat for Humanity Vietnam

# Early Childhood & Elementary School Program from Pre-Nursery to Grade 5



## Early Childhood Center

Students at The American School Early Childhood Center (ECC) learn a variety of cognitive, social, and emotional skills from activities and lessons built around the GELDS (Georgia Early Learning Development Standards). The students begin their day exploring their Muti-Purpose Area which contains a rotating arrangement of play-based learning centers.

There is ample free play and individual classroom time which allows them to learn next to other students of the same age and development range. Specialist teachers are also available to them throughout the week, educating them in a variety of skills such as music, art, dance and swimming.

Although academics are a priority, the focus of the ECC is to increase each student's independence, confidence, self-care, and awareness.



## Elementary School

TAS Elementary follows American content standards across the curriculum. Classroom instruction is in English, but consistently focused on differentiating learning activities that provide challenges for each child in her or his zone of proximal development. Units of study are developed beginning with assessments which allow students to demonstrate mastery of the standards in a variety of ways and lead to holistic learning experiences, integrating subject areas and reflecting the world our students encounter every day.

In addition to the homeroom experience where students engage in the core subjects (Math, English, Social Studies, and Science) students also attend Vietnamese studies or Vietnamese as an Additional Language (VAL) classes to preserve the host country's rich tradition and heritage. In addition, students attend specialist classes eachweek including: Music, Visual Arts, Physical Education, and library skills to provide a large variety of dynamic learning experiences.

Every Elementary Homeroom is led by an Internationally Licensed Educator and supported by a trained local Assistant Teacher.

(\*) Vietnamese Nationals are required to take Vietnamese Studies classes in literature, culture, history, and geography. Non-Vietnamese Nationalities, are required to take Vietnamese as an Additional Language (VAL).

(\*\*) Although all TAS Teachers and Support Staff are trained in EAL/ESL, additional support can be requested during appropriate class time and after-school for students who require additional time and preparation. This will be considered on a case by case basis and purely dependent on what is best for each individual child.

(\*\*\*) During Semester 2 of Grade 5, students will take part in a series of “Transitional Activities” to allow them to see, hear, and learn about all changes that will take place in Grade 6 (Middle School). During this process, they will meet with older middle school students, teachers, and administrators.

# Middle School Program from **Grade 6** to **Grade 8**



TAS Middle School is a 3-year transitional level between primary and high school. Students are expected to already be developing independent study skills and will be empowered to understand that they play a very important role in assuming responsibility for their learning, for their own actions, and for the world that they are living in.

At this academic level of development, Middle School Teachers and Support Staff are tasked with creating an appropriate blend of challenge, guidance, and opportunity so that students can begin to extend their knowledge and skills in preparation for Advanced Placement (AP) Courses.

In addition to their core subjects and elective teachers, middle school students are engaged in meaningful collaboration with advisory teachers, guidance counselor, and the student council.

Middle School is a fantastic time in the development of a student. They begin to learn about who they are, what they excel at, what requires more practice, and maybe most importantly, they begin to develop ideas about the world they live in.

# University Counseling from **Grade 9** to **Grade 12**





TAS employs a dedicated Western trained licensed University Counselor, who supports and handles all the questions and needs of our high school students who are starting and/or finalizing their plans for life upon graduating from TAS!

The University Counselor serves as a student advocate and team collaborator that works closely with our learning community to ensure that our students and families are up to date on university application processes, understanding of deadlines and are taking the appropriate courses to support the vision of each family and their educational goals.

High School Students also have the use of our Student University Lounge which is located on the mezzanine level of the gymnasium. Students can use this space to access university websites, recruiting tools, and is a quiet atmosphere where they can go to think about what they want and how they are going to achieve it.

# Student Council Introduction

The student council is an organization dedicated to representing the student body and creating a productive and positive school community for all. The student council is responsible for organizing events that promote school spirit and camaraderie, as well as acting like a bridge between students and teachers/administrators to express student voice.

Elections for student council positions are held at the beginning of each year. Interested students apply through the student council advisor and create a speech to demonstrate and convince their peers of their responsibility and leadership skills. All middle school and high school students then vote for their top candidates. New this year, the student council is comprised of 4 core members – instead of the usual president, vice-president, etc. – and a senator representative for each grade level in high school. The core members are in charge of the main organization of events, splitting responsibilities between them, and leading the senators to help carry out such events.
