



CASE CHALLENGE

A 3-year-old child presented with a persistently worsening rash and concurrent pain. Further questioning revealed recent upper respiratory infection symptoms of cough and rhinorrhea, occurring 2 days prior to the appearance of the rash.

A review of systems was negative for recent medications, fever, chills, nausea, vomiting, diarrhoea, constipation, joint swelling or pain, or change in sensorium.
