"Target educational institutions" refers to any formal/semi-formal school for children and/or adolescent (primary/secondary school) targeted by the project, including speed schools. Pre-primary schools (early childhood education) may also be included.

Literacy or vocational training for adults should not be included in the reporting.

Instructions Other initiatives to increase enrolment rates for children with disabilities (e.g. awareness raising of parents)

may contribute towards this outcome, but there is a need for a cooperation/partnership with the educational

institution through the project to be able to track the accurate number of enrolled learners.

and gradual growth rather than large-scale operations.
