Overview

A New Way to Photograph Polar Bears

Regulations in Svalbard have changed in recent years, increasing the required distance between vessels and polar bears. While these rules are important for protecting wildlife, they also make traditional wildlife viewing from crowded expedition ships far more limited.

Our answer is simple: go where the bears actually live.

Instead of waiting along the edges of the archipelago, we travel deep into the drifting pack ice, where polar bears hunt, travel and live naturally across the frozen Arctic Ocean.

Out here the experience is completely different. Vast landscapes of moving sea ice stretch to the horizon, wildlife encounters happen on the bears' terms, and the sense of wilderness is absolute.

Photographing polar bears in their true habitat, deep in the pack ice, is one of the most powerful wildlife experiences on Earth.

The MS Kvitungen – Built for the Ice

To make this possible we operate from a very special vessel: the MS Kvitungen.

This is not a luxury cruise ship. It is a serious Arctic expedition vessel, built for strength, endurance and the ability to travel where most ships cannot.

With a reinforced Ice Class hull, the MS Kvitungen is designed to withstand the immense pressure of shifting sea ice and safely push through dense pack ice conditions. This strength allows us to venture far beyond the normal routes of tourist ships and explore remote areas of the Arctic Ocean.

Simply put, the stronger the ship, the deeper we can go.

And deeper in the ice is exactly where the best wildlife and most dramatic photographic opportunities exist.

For photographers, the MS Kvitungen offers an outstanding platform. Open decks provide excellent vantage points for shooting, while the vessel's size and manoeuvrability allow us to position ourselves quickly when wildlife appears.

THIS IS IMPORTANT TO READ - The Refitted Expedition Vessel

During the 2026/2027 season, the MS Kvitungen will undergo an interior refit with upgraded cabins and modern finishes. This refit process will take place over stages starting in 2026. At this point the engineers and architects cannot guarantee how long each stage will take given that they are working on a vessel that has active duty. For this reason we do not have a clear cut indication on how far the refit will be once we start our voyages in Aug 2027.

While the vessel remains a rugged expedition ship at heart, the updated interiors will provide comfortable accommodation after long days working on the ice.

At this point we know that the ship will have 3 double / twin rooms with private facilities and 4 single rooms with shared facilities.

With only 10 guests onboard, the atmosphere remains quiet, spacious and focused entirely on the journey.

The Photographer's Arctic – September

Our expeditions take place in September, one of the most rewarding times to work in the high Arctic.

By this point most expedition ships have already left the Svalbard archipelago, leaving the vast pack ice quiet and largely empty. This gives us the freedom to explore a truly wild Arctic landscape without crowds.

The returning darkness of autumn also brings beautiful low-angle light, long shadows across the ice and dramatic skies perfect conditions for wildlife and landscape photography.

With endless horizons of drifting ice and constantly changing weather, every day offers new photographic possibilities.

Costings

The Kvitungen: Rooms and options

The MS Kvitungen has the capacity to take 12 guests. However we at TuskPhoto have decided to limit that number to only 10 guests. This will ensure the best possible opportunities when working with bears and space on Zodiacs etc.

By the time we do our expeditions in 2027 the MS Kvitungen would have had a partial interior refit. We can confirm that the ship will have 3 double / twin rooms with own private facilities. Further more there will be 4 single rooms with shared facilities.

Pricing for the rooms will be as follows:

Double / Twin room with private facilities - €14,500 per person

Single room with shared facilities - €13,500 per person

Cost:

Our expedition is priced at EU€ 14,500 per person in town / double rooms with private facilities and €13,500 for single rooms with shared facilities.

Please note that any bank charges incurred during the payment process are not covered by Tusk Photo. We kindly request the full amount indicated on the invoice, including any fees imposed by Paypal if you choose to use this payment method.

Deposit:

To secure your reservation, a 50% deposit of the full price is required within 14 days of making your booking. Once we receive your deposit, your booking will be confirmed. Please make sure to complete this step within the given timeframe to secure your spot.

Balance:

The remaining balance is due at 6 months prior to the safari. If you are making a booking within 6 months of the safari, the full price will be payable at the time of booking.

Cancellation Policy:

We understand that plans can change, and in the event of a cancellation, the following fees will apply unless Tusk Photo is able to fill your safari space:

- Cancellation more than 365 days prior to departure: 30% of the full price
 - Cancellation 180 - 365 days prior to departure: 60% of the full price
- Cancellation less than 180 days prior to departure: 100% of the full price

Itinerary

Day 0 - Arrival day in Longyearbyen and not included in the tour

- It is recommended you arrive in Longyearbyen, Svalbard, at least 1 day before we set sail to the North.
- There are a number of hotels in Longyearbyen all very close to each other. Our Tusk Photo hosts will more than likely be staying at the Radisson Blu Hotel.

DAY 1

- Transfer to the MS Kvitungen
- We set sail to the Polar ice cap.

DAY 2 to 10

- Exploration of Svalbard and Polar ice cap.
- Photographing Polar Bears, whales, walrus, sea birds and more.

DAY 10

- Return to Longyearbyen.
- End of tour.

Flights and Transport

- Guests can book flights to Svalbard Airport from various major cities, with connecting flights often available from Oslo, Norway.
- From the airport, a convenient transfer service is available to transport guests to the heart of Longyearbyen.

Photography and Gear

It is not advisable to take photographs of border posts, airports, military, police posts or any other related government structures. Doing so can lead to an unpleasant situation and even arrest.

It is advisable to bring the following camera equipment:

- At least 2x Camera bodies (a backup will mean peace of mind)
- Spare memory cards and batteries
- Long telephoto lens 300/400/500/600/800
- Medium telephoto lens 70-200 or equivalent
- Wide angle lens(es) for landscapes and wide-angle wildlife
- Tripod with Gimbal head & Ball head is optional if you would like to photograph birds and wildlife and your equipment is too heavy to hand hold
- Flash with off-shoe cord and battery pack is optional
- Notebook or additional storage devices.
- Please remember that it is very likely that you could possibly photograph thousands of images over the safari period. We therefore strongly advise you to have sufficient storage and battery arrangements in place. If you are unsure of anything, please contact us for more details.

Tour Info

INSURANCE

- **Travel Insurance:**

While it is highly unlikely, there is a possibility of scheduled flights in and out of your destination being delayed due to unforeseen circumstances. To provide peace of mind and cover any potential flight disruptions or missed connections, we strongly recommend purchasing additional travel insurance.

- **Medical Insurance:**

For your safety and well-being, we highly recommend having medical insurance that covers unforeseen medical emergencies and evacuation. Please let us know in your booking form whether you have taken out any medical insurance for this safari.

PASSPORTS AND CUSTOMS

- Passports are required by all foreign visitors and must be valid for 6 months after the intended length of stay. Please ensure that there are two blank pages per country to be visited.
- Visas are required by most countries to enter Norway which is the entry point to Svalbard – please make sure you check with your local embassies regarding visa requirements. Alternatively have a look at www.visaHQ.com for country specific visa requirements as well.
- It is advisable to declare any cameras, lenses, laptops and other valuable items when leaving your country. We normally recommend keeping a detailed list of all items including serial numbers and descriptions. This makes the customs process that much quicker.

MONEY AND CURRENCY

- The currency accepted in Norway and Svalbard is NOK.
- Banks and foreign exchange bureaux are available at all international airports and in all main towns in Europe but limited while in Longyearbyen.
- Credit card payments can be processed by most retail outlets, hotels and Inns as well as for your drinks on the MS Kvitungen.

HEALTH

- The Arctic has little to no health hazards apart from illnesses like influenza and other related conditions associated with extreme cold environments.
- Alternatively, should you require additional advice, we suggest you contact your local travel clinic.

LANGUAGES

- The official language is Norwegian. However, nearly everyone speaks English.

DIETARY REQUIREMENTS

We understand the importance of accommodating diverse dietary needs, and our team is dedicated to ensuring that we can cater to most dietary requirements. Please provide us with any specific dietary needs in your booking form.

CLIMATE

The climate in Svalbard and the Polar ice region is generally quite cold during summer months. During this time of year the sun does not set and we will experience



CLOTHING AND WHAT TO PACK

We will experience arctic conditions on this tour, so please be prepared for the cold!

- Windproof garments are highly recommended!
- Good thermal underwear, long johns and long sleeved thermal under-shirts.
- Warm insulated trousers, similar to those used for skiing – no loud colours please!
- Waterproof (preferably Gore-Tex or similar) over-trousers.
- A down or hollow fibre jacket or waterproof (preferably Gore-Tex or similar) jacket layered with a thick warm fleece under it.
- Thermal / Pac boots with a sole good for walking on snow and ice, and thick warm socks. We recommend looking at MuckBoots or similar 'Wellies' that will keep your feet dry and warm. A rating of -40C is advisable.
- A pair of thermal 'camp booties' is advisable for use on the boat.
- Warm hat / beanies (bring a spares)
- Thin pair of thermal gloves.
- A second, larger pair of insulated over-gloves. Also consider bringing a spare pair in case your gloves get wet.
- Polar Fleece; a few thin fleeces to aid layering.
- A fleece neck gaiter is very useful for protecting your face.
- Hand and foot warmers.
- Sun glasses, Lip balm and sun block.
- If you are concerned about or prone to sea sickness, see your doctor or ask a qualified pharmacist for advice on what sea-sickness medication you should use, and bring some for our mornings on the boat out to the sea ice
- Please bring a pair of Binoculars to help us find Polar Bears.
