Last Updated: June 1, 2026

This Privacy Notice for U.S. Residents (this “**Notice**”) supplements the information contained in the Oregon Jewish Community Foundation (“**we**,” or “**us**”) [Privacy Policy](#) and applies solely to residents of certain U.S. states with data privacy laws that may extend rights to individuals interacting with nonprofit organizations. As a nonprofit, the Oregon Jewish Community Foundation is not subject to many state consumer privacy laws. COLORADO

We adopt this section of this Notice to give Colorado residents (“**you**”) additional information required by the Colorado Privacy Act and its implementing regulations (the “CPA”). This section applies to you when you are acting in an individual or household context, but *not* when you are acting in a commercial or employment context, including as a job applicant. Any terms defined in the CPA have the same meaning when used in this section of this Notice.

Collection, Use, and Sharing of Your Personal Data

We may rent or sell the personal data we collect to partner organizations. We may disclose your personal data to our third-party service providers for a business purpose as described in the [How We Share Your Information](#) section in our [Privacy Policy](#). We obtain consent from a parent or guardian before processing personal data from children under the age of 13. We do not engage in targeted advertising or profiling in furtherance of decisions that produce legal or similarly significant effects concerning consumers, as defined in the CPA.

Your Colorado Privacy Rights

If you are a Colorado resident, you can make certain requests regarding your personal data. Once we receive your request and confirm your identity, we will review your request to see if an exception allowing us to retain the data applies. If we are unable to comply with your request in whole or in part, we will notify you with reasons for the denial. Your rights include:

- **Right to Know:** You have the right to know whether we control the collection of your personal data.
- **Right to Access:** You have the right see what personal data we have collected about you in a usable format.
- **Right to Delete:** You have the right to request that we delete personal data that we collect from you, subject to applicable legal exceptions.
- **Right to Correct:** You have the right to request that we correct inaccurate personal data.

If we determine that the request warrants a fee, we will tell you why we made that decision and provide you with a cost estimate before completing your request. We will delete or de-identify personal information not subject to a legal exception from our records and will direct our service providers to take similar action. For data portability requests, we will select a format to provide your personal information that is readily useable and should allow

you to transmit the information from one entity to another entity without hindrance.

- **Instructions for Using an Authorized Agent to Make Requests:** You may use an authorized agent to submit a request to know or an access, deletion, correction, or opt-out request on your behalf. An authorized agent must have your signed permission to submit a request on your behalf or provide proof that they have power of attorney in accordance with applicable law. Before completing requests from authorized agents, we may contact you directly to confirm you've given your permission and/or to verify your identity. NEVADA

- **Identifiers**, such as name, telephone number, physical address, and email address.
- **Device Information and Online Activity**, such as keystroke patterns indicative of human or bot website/app usage, mobile and web network activity, and related information (such as Mac address, IP address, cookie IDs, browser activity, other information associated with your browsing history), and social media information.
- **Commercial Information**, such as purchase, donation, and transaction history information, health and safety-related information, and information about participation in Events.
- **Communications**, such as the content of emails, text messages, call logs or other communications, and calendar information where we are a party to the exchange.
- **Demographic Information**, if voluntarily provided, such as age, gender, citizenship, ethnicity, date of birth, family, or marital status,
- **Financial Information**, such as credit or debit card numbers, and claims information.
- **Approximate Geolocation Information**.

- **Sensitive Personal Data**, if voluntarily provided (for example, in an application to participate in one of our Events), such as data that reveals a racial or ethnic background, national origin, religious beliefs, mental or physical condition or diagnosis, sexual orientation, status as transgender or nonbinary, status as a victim of crime, or citizenship or immigration status.

- Conduct internal audits and investigate complaints, grievances, and suspected violations of our policies.
- Respond to law enforcement requests as required by applicable law, court order, or government regulations.
- Exercise or defend our legal rights and the rights of our employees, customers, contractors, and agents.

To the extent we process deidentified information, we will maintain and use the information in deidentified form and will not attempt to reidentify the information unless permitted by applicable law.
