

Oregon Jewish Community Foundation Children's Privacy Notice

Last modified: June 1, 2026

Oregon Jewish Community Foundation (“**we**,” or “**us**”) recognizes the importance of children’s privacy. This Children’s Privacy Notice (this “**Notice**”) explains our information collection, disclosure, and parental consent practices with respect to information provided by children under the age of 13 (“**child**” or “**children**”). Capitalized terms used in this Notice but not defined herein have the same respective meanings specified in our [Privacy Policy](#).

This Notice informs parents/legal guardians of:

- The types of Personal Information we collect from children.
- How we use the child’s Personal Information we collect.
- Our practices for disclosing collected child’s Personal Information.
- All operators that collect or maintain Personal Information from children through our Website (<https://www.ojcf.org> and portal <https://ojcf.fcsuite.com/erp/portal>).

This policy only applies to children under the age of 13 and supplements our [Privacy Policy](#).

Information We Collect from Children

Children can access many parts of the Website and its content and use many of its features without providing us with personal information. However, some content and features are available only to registered users or require us to collect certain information, including personal information, from them. In addition, we use certain technologies, such as cookies, to automatically collect information from our users (including children) when they visit or use the Website.

We only collect as much information about a child as is reasonably necessary for the child to participate in an Event, including applying for our youth programs and scholarship and campership opportunities, and we do not condition his or her participation on the disclosure of more personal information than is reasonably necessary.

Information We Collect Directly

A child must provide us with the following information to apply to participate in our youth programs and scholarship and campership opportunities: the child’s name, address, email address, telephone, birth date, school name, camp name, grade level, information that may identify their religious beliefs, synagogue affiliation, youth group affiliation, and parent/legal guardian’s contact information.

A child must provide us with their email address to register with our Website. We also require the child to create a password once their email address is registered.

We may request additional information from your child, but this information is optional. We specify whether information is required or optional when we request it. This information may include:

- first and last names;
- gender;
- age;
- education information (e.g., grade, school, teacher, etc.);
- any other data or information that identifies or assists in identifying an individual child.

We may use persistent identifiers to support internal operations, including to improve our Services. We do not combine persistent identifiers with Personal Information nor use or disclose them to contact an individual, to create a profile, or for any other purpose, except to provide support for our internal operations.

Automatic Information Collection

We use technology to automatically collect information from our users, including children, when they access and navigate through the Website and use certain features. The information we collect through these technologies may include:

- **Activity, usage, viewing, technical, and device data** when user visit our Website or open emails we send. This includes the content users view, how often users use our Website, users' browser or device type, unique device identifier, and IP address. We may obtain this information from a third party, such as a site or platform provider.
- **Location information**, including approximate location information provided by a mobile or other device when accessing one of our Website or our social media pages, or associated with a user's IP address or other device identifier.

How We Use Your Child's Information

We use the personal information we collect from your child to:

- Evaluate their application(s) to participant in our youth programs, scholarship and campership opportunities, and other Events we may host;
- Market and promote youth programs, opportunities, and Events; and
- Provide acknowledgement of grants.

We use the information we collect automatically through technology (see [Automatic Information Collection](#)) and other non-personal information (i.e., Anonymous Information and Aggregated Information) to:

- Present our Website, its contents, and our Services to users.
- Provide users with the experiences, donation opportunities, and services users request, view, or engage with.
- Communicate with users about their account, donations, and applications to participate in our Events, and send users information or request feedback about features on our Website and changes to our policies.
- Send users offers and promotions for our services, information regarding fundraising, scholarship, campership, and our youth programs, or information about community activities and services hosted by third-party community partners.
- Recognize user's generous donations or participation in our Events by displaying their name and photos, if provided, on our Website.
- Operate, understand, optimize, develop, or improve our Services and operations, including by using analytics tools.
- Detect, investigate, and prevent activities that may violate our policies, pose safety issues, or be fraudulent or illegal.
- Notify users of safety issues.
- Fulfill the purpose for which users provided the information, or any other purpose described at the time of collection, or for another purpose with user's consent.

Our Practices for Disclosing Children's Information

We may disclose Anonymous Information and Aggregate Information about our users without restriction.

We do not share, sell, rent, or transfer children's information other than as described in this section.

We may disclose children's personal information:

- To third parties we use to support our internal operations and the operation of our Website, and who are bound by contractual or other obligations to use the information only for such purpose and to keep the information confidential. Below is the list of these services providers:
 - Mailchimp – email addresses for communications;
 - Foundant – name, email address, mailing address for contact management;

- Google – for maintaining and sharing documents among program participants; and
- Dropbox – all collected information for contact management.

Please direct inquiries about any third-party operator's privacy practices and use of children's information to the third party.

- To grantees for purposes of a grant acknowledgement.
- If we are required to do so by law or legal process, such as to comply with any court order or subpoena or to respond to any government or regulatory request.
- If we believe disclosure is necessary or appropriate to protect the rights, property, or safety of the Oregon Jewish Community Foundation, our members or others, including to:
 - protect the safety of a child;
 - protect the safety and security of the Website; or
 - enable us to take precautions against liability.
- To law enforcement agencies or for an investigation related to public safety.

If Oregon Jewish Community Foundation is involved in a merger, divestiture, restructuring, reorganization, dissolution, or other sale or transfer of some or all of its assets, whether as a going concern or as part of bankruptcy, liquidation, or similar proceeding or event, we may transfer the child's information we have collected or maintain to the buyer or other successor.

Accessing and Correcting Your Child's Personal Information

At any time, you may review your child's personal information maintained by us, require us to correct or delete the personal information, and/or refuse to permit us from further collecting or using the child's information.

If we learn that we have collected children's information without your consent, we will delete that information as quickly as possible.
