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




I hope you enjoy this special issue. Please join us in celebrating His Holiness' birthday and helping to spread his message of compassion this year!

July 6, 2025 will be a landmark birthday for His Holiness the Dalai Lama as he turns 90 years old. The Dalai Lama's birthday is among the most auspicious occasions for Tibetans every year and is marked by celebrations around the world (though not inside Tibet, where the Chinese government forbids celebrations of the Dalai Lama).

His Holiness' 90th birthday holds special significance for Tibetans, as the Dalai Lama has previously said he would convene with senior Buddhist leaders to discuss the future of his reincarnation upon reaching this age. As we go to press, a new book by the Dalai Lama titled *Voice for the Voiceless* asserts that his successor will be born in the free world, outside China (see more on page 10). No additional announcement has been made yet.

His Holiness was born on July 6, 1935, to a simple farming family in the village of Taktser in Amdo Province, northeastern Tibet. And today, the 14th Dalai Lama has become one of the world's great exponents of peace and nonviolence in the tradi-



tion of Mahatma Gandhi and Martin Luther King Jr. For this he has won the admiration of the world and was awarded the Nobel Peace Prize in 1989 and the Congressional Gold Medal in 2007.

At a broader level, the Dalai Lama devotes himself to his principal commitments of promoting human values, promoting religious harmony, preserving Tibetan culture and environment, and reviving ancient Indian knowledge of "karuna" (compassion) and "ahimsa" (nonviolence) that can benefit the world today.

On the political issue of Tibet, the Dalai Lama espouses his Middle-Way Approach, which proposes a resolution to the Tibet-China crisis that takes into consideration the in-

terests of both the Tibetans and the Chinese people. Therefore, instead of a restoration of Tibetan independence, this approach treads a middle path to achieve a genuine autonomy for all Tibetans living in the three traditional provinces of Tibet within the framework of the People's Republic of China.

The Dalai Lama is the person with the moral authority to ensure that such a solution could be acceptable. Between 2002 and 2010, nine rounds of dialogue were held between the Dalai Lama's representatives and Chinese officials. However, there have been no talks since.

The International Campaign for Tibet believes there is a historic opportunity to find a solution for the Tibetan people in the lifetime of the Fourteenth Dalai Lama. More than ever before, we remain determined and steadfast in garnering support for the Dalai Lama's vision for Tibet and urging the weight of international support to press the Chinese leadership to peacefully resolve the Tibet issue in a mutually acceptable way.

## A Lifetime of Compassion, Wisdom & Peace



#### **IN TIBET**

**1935:** His Holiness the 14th Dalai Lama is born in Taktser, Amdo, Tibet, on July 6.



**1940:** The formal official enthronement ceremony takes place in Lhasa, Tibet, and His Holiness begins monastic education.

**1949:** The Chinese invasion of Tibet begins.

**1950:** His Holiness assumes full temporal (political) power.

**1951:** The 17-Point Agreement is signed by a Tibetan delegation in Beijing under duress.

**1954 to 1955:** His Holiness visits China for talks and meets with Mao Zedong and other Chinese leaders.

**1959:** The Tibetan People's Uprising begins in Lhasa on March 10. On March 15, artillery shells fired by Chinese troops land outside Norbulingka Palace, the Dalai Lama's summer home in Lhasa, and on March 17 His Holiness escapes at night.

The Tibetan government is formally reestablished in exile, and the 17-Point Agreement repudiated. The Dalai Lama reaches India after a harrowing 14-day escape and begins life in exile.

#### IN EXILE

**1959:** In India, His Holiness establishes his first residence in Mussoorie, before moving to a more permanent residence in Dharamsala in 1960.



**1963:** The first Tibetan Parliament in exile (Assembly of Tibetan People's Deputies) is established.

**1967:** His Holiness makes his first visits abroad since going into exile, to Japan and Thailand.

**1973:** His Holiness makes his first visit to the West (Italy, Switzerland, Netherlands, Belgium, Ireland, Norway, Sweden, Denmark, UK, West Germany, and Austria).

**1979:** The Dalai Lama makes the first contact with the government of the People's Republic of China since going into exile in 1959.

**1987:** His Holiness delivers the historic Five Point Peace Plan for Tibet in Washington, DC, to members of the US Congress.

**1988:** Speaking to members of the European Parliament in Strasbourg, France, the Dalai Lama delivers the historic Strasbourg Proposal for Tibet.

1989: His Holiness is awarded the Nobel Prize for Peace in Oslo, Norway for his advocacy of peaceful solutions rooted in tolerance and mutual respect. His efforts to preserve the historical and cultural heritage of Tibetan people reflect his deep commitment to peace and humanity.

**1992:** His Holiness initiates numerous major democratic steps in the Central Tibetan Administration (CTA), the Tibetan government in exile, including the direct elections of ministers and the establishment of a judiciary branch.

**2001:** The Tibetan people hold the first direct democratic elections in the history of Tibet, for the post of Kalon Tripa (Chairman of the Cabinet).

**2007:** His Holiness the Dalai Lama received the US Congressional Gold Medal from US President George W. Bush on Capitol Hill in Washington DC on October 17, 2007.

**2011:** On March 14, His Holiness the Dalai Lama devolves his temporal power to the elected Tibetan leadership in order to establish a sound democratic system of governance. On May 29 His Holiness signs into law the formal transfer of his temporal power to the democratically elected leaders.

**2017:** The Dalai Lama offers the Kalachakra Initiation in Bodh Gaya, India. This is the 34th time he has presided over this important Buddhist practice, to promote world peace and harmony through the cultivation of love, compassion and wisdom.

**2025:** Today, His Holiness the Dalai Lama continues to reside in exile in India, with a deep hope that one day the Tibetan people will be able to live in their homeland with rights and dignity. He remains fully committed to the Middle Way approach.



# QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS WITH THE DALAI LAMA

The Dalai Lama : Questions and Answers Extracted from dalailama.com


Question: How do you view yourself?

**Answer:** I always consider myself as a simple Buddhist monk. I feel that is the real me. I feel that the Dalai Lama as a temporal ruler is a man-made institution. As long as the people accept the Dalai Lama, they will accept me. But being a monk is something which belongs to me. No one can change that. Deep down inside, I always consider myself a monk, even in my dreams. So naturally I feel myself as more of a religious person.

Even in my daily life, I can say that I spend 80% of my time on spiritual activities and 20% on Tibet as a whole. The spiritual or religious life is something I know and have great interest in. I have some kind of confidence in it, and thus I want to study it more. Regarding politics, I have no modern education except for a little experience. It is a big responsibility for someone not so well equipped. This is not voluntary work but something that I feel I must pursue because of the hope and trust that the Tibetan people place on me.

Question: When you became a refugee, what helped you gain this strength? Was it the loss of your position and country, the fact of everyone suffering around you. Were you called on to lead your people in a different way than you had been accustomed to?

Answer: Being a refugee is really a desperate, dangerous situation. At that time, everyone deals with reality. It is not the time to pretend things are beautiful. That's something. You feel involved with reality. In peace time, everything goes smoothly. Even if there is a problem, people pretend that things are good. During a dangerous period, when there's a dramatic change, then there's no scope to pretend that everything is fine. You must accept that bad is bad. Now when I left the Norbulinka, there was danger. We were passing very near the Chinese military barracks. It was just on the other side of the river, the Chinese check post there. You see, we had definite infor-




mation two or three weeks before I left, that the Chinese were fully prepared to attack us. It was only a question of the day and hour.

Question: Are there any of your predecessors in whom you have a special interest or with whom you have a particular affinity?

Answer: The Thirteenth Dalai Lama. He brought a lot of improvement to the standards of study in the monastic colleges. He gave great encouragement to the real scholars. He made it impossible for people to go up in the religious hierarchy, becoming an abbot and so forth, without being totally qualified. He was very strict in this respect. He also gave tens of thousands of monks' ordinations. There were his two main religious achievements. He didn't give many initiations, or many lectures. Now, with respect to the country, he had great thought and consideration for statecraft. The outlying districts in particular. How they should be governed and so forth. He cared very much how to run the government more efficiently. He had great concern about our borders and that type of thing.


Heart to Heart delivers a powerful message about solving the Earth's environmental challenges and practicing compassion toward all living beings. Its main character is a panda who decides to make a pilgrimage to Dharamsala, India, the exile home of the Dalai Lama, to get some answers about what is going on in the world. His Holiness and the panda go on a little walk in the nearby forest and have a heart-to-heart conversation on the ways of the world.

For 2026, moving illustrations from the book have been selected for each month of ICT's upcoming 2026 wall calendar. Although *Heart to Heart* pulls no punches about the devastation humankind has caused the planet, McDonnell's illustrations paired with His Holiness' words offer a message of hope. With his arm wrapped around the panda's shoulder, His Holiness talks about how real change in the world can only come about through a change of heart.

"What I propose is a compassionate revolution," he says. "Everything we do has some effect—even a simple act. Although it might seem insignificant, when we multiply it by billions of others who might do the same thing, we can have an enormous impact."



# VOICE FOR THE VOICELESS By His Holiness the Dalai Lama

After nearly 75 years of peaceful advocacy for Tibet and the Tibetan people, His Holiness the Dalai Lama has published a new book delving into his personal reflections on his struggles with China to save his homeland—and the path forward for Tibet.

He writes, "In my role as the Dalai Lama, there is no issue more important than what I describe in these pages".

As he approaches the age of 90, this most recent book presents an inside look at his efforts to pursue the Middle Way Approach, which calls for a negotiated solution to China's occupation of their historically-independent country. It also lays out how important international support has been for the Tibetan cause.

He also writes about the plan for his succession in the clearest terms yet, illustrating the geopolitical importance of Tibet: "Since the purpose of a reincarnation is to carry on the work of the predecessor, the new Dalai Lama will be born in the free world so that the traditional mission of the Dalai Lama—that is, to be the voice for universal compassion, the spiritual leader of Tibetan Buddhism, and the symbol of Tibet embodying the aspirations of the Tibetan people—will continue."

The Dalai Lama expresses his hopes that the book will stimulate fresh thoughts and conversations today and provide a framework for the future of Tibet even after his lifetime.

He writes: "To all the nations and peoples of the world, especially those who have stood in solidarity with the Tibetan people: Your expressions of concern and support, as well as the attention of the international media on Tibet, continue to encourage us and give us comfort. I thank you and ask you not to forget Tibet at this critical and challenging time in our people's long history."

He also says that despite all the suffering of the Tibetan people, they still hold hope for a peaceful resolution: "My hope is that the book will stimulate fresh thoughts and conversations today and provide a framework for the future of Tibet even after I am gone." While it is becoming less likely that His Holiness will be able to return to his homeland in his lifetime, his enduring hope and the global support for Tibet keep the dream of his return alive.

At this critical juncture in time as His Holiness celebrates his 90th birthday—it is our firm belief to stand resolute and steadfast with His Holiness and the Tibetans as the Chinese government signals that they will interfere in his future succession plans - we are asking ICT members and the international community to affirm their commitment to standing with His Holiness and helping protect the aspirations and rights of the Tibetan people, their culture and traditions.
