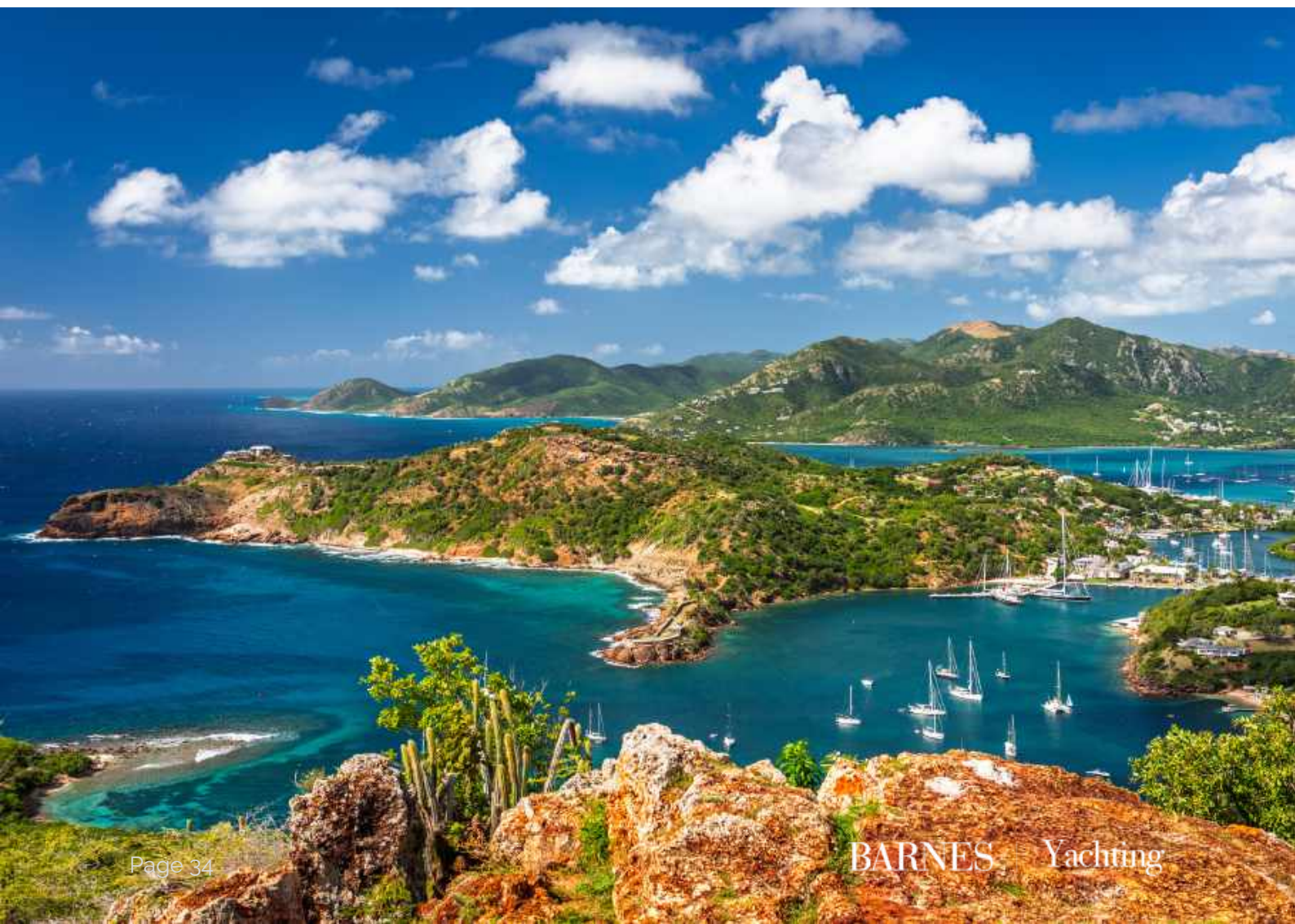


Caribbean Hideaways

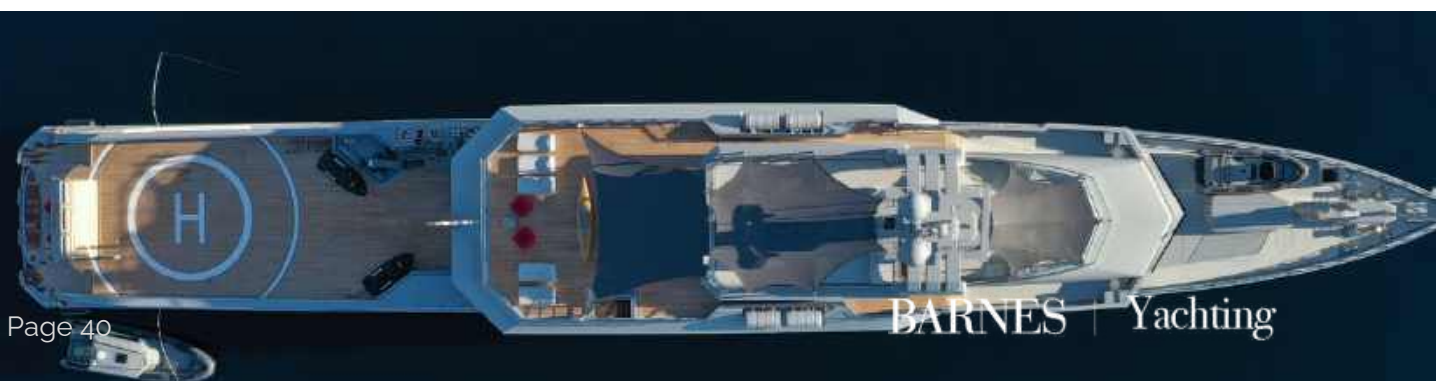

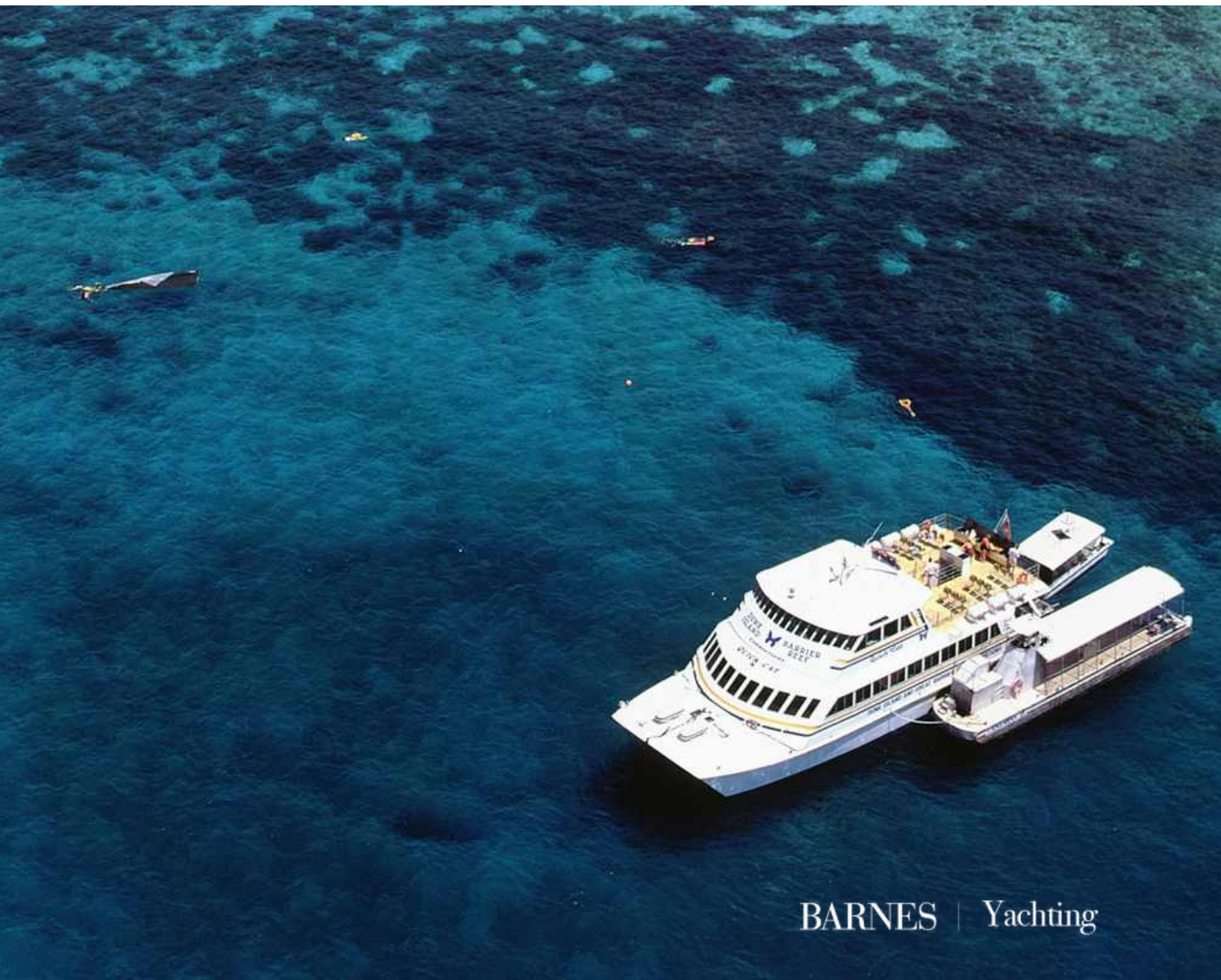

- Remember names. Reference details. Follow up after disembarking with elegance.
- Don't pitch. Invite. The most effective business moves are born from shared values, not shared spreadsheets.
- Know when to step back. Not every moment is a networking opportunity. Some are simply... life.

6. Departing with Poise

The most lasting impression is often made when you leave.

- Thank the crew by name. Leave gratuities if appropriate—but always leave respect.

- Follow up with fellow guests thoughtfully—reference shared conversations, extend invitations, and cultivate what was begun onboard.
