



The Center for Courageous Kids' Bourbon Raffle Returns, Turning Rare Bottles Into Life-Changing Experiences

Fifth annual raffle features an extraordinary lineup of bourbon prizes, with proceeds supporting free camp programs for children with disabilities and lifelong illnesses

SCOTTSVILLE, KY (September 15, 2026) – The Center for Courageous Kids (CCK) today announced its fifth annual Bourbon Raffle, giving bourbon enthusiasts the chance to win one of 15 prize packages valued at more than \$41,000 while supporting CCK's mission to provide life-changing camp experiences for children with lifelong illnesses and disabilities at no cost to their families.

Only 1,000 tickets will be available for \$100 each. Each ticket is entered into all 15 drawings until it wins, giving participants multiple chances to take home a rare bourbon prize while making a difference in the lives of courageous kids.

“Every ticket purchased helps make it possible for a child to experience the magic of camp,” said Darren Dannelly, President & CEO of The Center for Courageous Kids. “While these rare bourbon bottles are exciting prizes for collectors, the true reward is knowing each ticket helps give children the opportunity to laugh, explore, build friendships and simply be kids in a place created just for them.”

This year's collection, curated by renowned bourbon collector and longtime CCK supporter Curt Rafferty, features an extraordinary lineup of rare and sought-after bottles. The grand prize is a six-bottle Pappy collection, including Pappy Van Winkle 23-year, valued at up to \$11,000. The first prize is a rare 1992 decanter commemorating the 1968 Chevrolet Corvette. The second prize is a complete Buffalo Trace Antique Collection, valued at up to \$9,000. The remaining 12 prize packages feature coveted bottles from Blanton's, William Heaven Hill, E.H. Taylor and other sought-after brands.

All prizes come with guaranteed authenticity and are backed by Rafferty, whose collection features some of the most highly coveted bottles in the bourbon world.

Proceeds from the Bourbon Raffle help fund CCK's free, medically supported camp programs for children with lifelong illnesses and disabilities. During its nine week-long summer sessions, CCK welcomes up to 128 campers each week, with sessions designed around specific medical conditions. Campers participate in activities, such as horseback riding, fishing, swimming, arts and crafts and archery, while building confidence, independence and lasting friendships in a supportive community.



CCK also hosts fall and spring family weekend retreats, giving families the opportunity to relax, reconnect and strengthen bonds with others who understand their experiences.

Ticket sales close at 7:30 p.m. Nov. 21, during CCK's Stars and 6 Strings event. Attendance is not required to win. Founded in 2008, The Center for Courageous Kids (CCK) is a not-for-profit medical camp facility located in Scottsville, Kentucky, offering specialized recreational programs for children with disabilities or lifelong illnesses with no cost to their families. The 168-acre camp hosts nine separate week-long summer camp sessions that can serve up to 128 kids per week with each week designated to a different illness. In addition to summer camp, CCK hosts family weekend retreats in the spring and fall seasons for kids, siblings and parents and provide joy, respite and lasting memories. Now in its 19th year, CCK has served more than 46,000 campers and families living with medical diagnoses and IDD (intellectual and developmental disabilities) from 46 U.S. states and 13 countries.
