 - Americas:
 - Permitting Reform: high on the agenda to enable the potential of the Inflation Reduction Act
 - Lower Energy Cause Act: under discussion in Congress to make O&G projects go ahead (supported by the Republicans but Democrats threaten to veto)
 - Following Inflation Reduction Act, more attention paid to bioLNG, green methane and emphasis on developing "hydrogen hubs"
 - Asia: Security of Supply high on the agenda vs less interest on GHG compensation
 - Australia: introduction of price caps, limit exports in case of short supplies
 - Singapore: Government purchased LNG vessels and established strategic storage (FSRU) that electricity companies could use to prevent prices going up
 - Thailand: market opening: open importation to new market entrants (7) who will be allowed to bring the LNG into the pool price
 - Philippines: new LNG import terminal, awaiting to bring the first commissioning cargo
 - Europe:
 - ACER (Agency for the Cooperation of Energy Regulators) is providing a public price for LNG Trade
 - Disconnection between European needs for more LNG vs. Fitfor55 Package (Decarbonization package)
 - Demand destruction (Gas demand down by 13% in 2022, 4% in gas to power and 20% in industry)
 - Ongoing discussion on regulation on imports of renewable energy.






