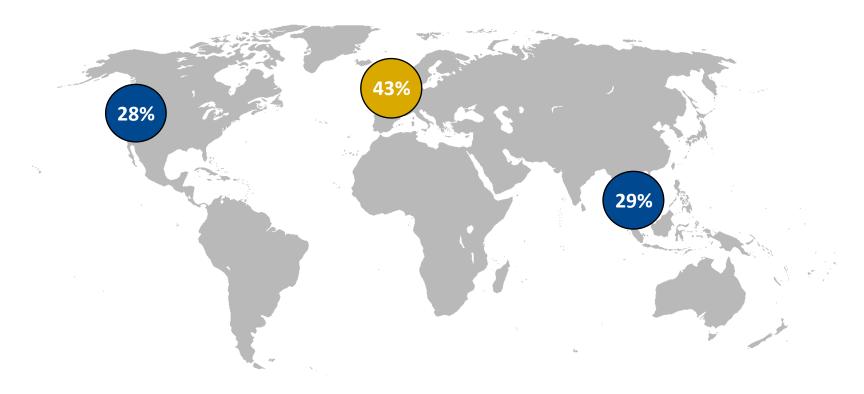
Objective:

Develop the strategies required for immediate changes.

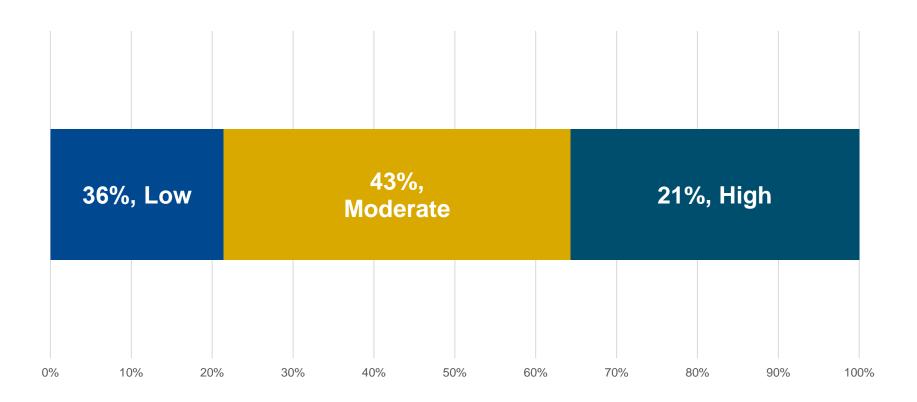
Based on Survey: 64% of companies had a well-established crisis management team and 36% implemented a new team during the pandemic.

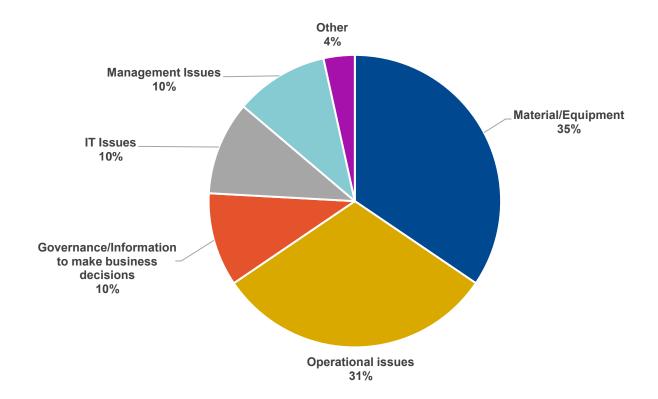

Implement and adapt policies, procedures needed for Governance

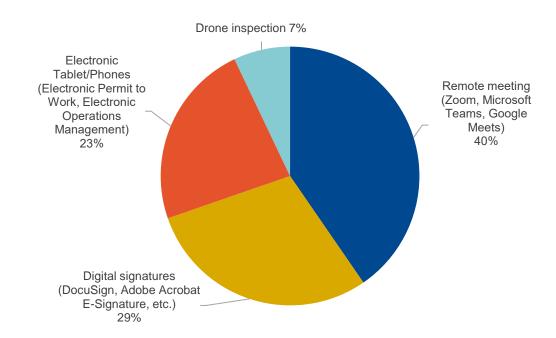
Expeditious general requirements for organization change, communication protocols, management

Technology was an important enabler.

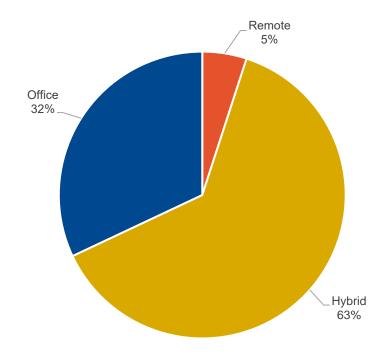
86% of member companies implemented a certain degree of technology

Member companies reported various work schedule transitions during the pandemic.





Services / Consumables / Spares:

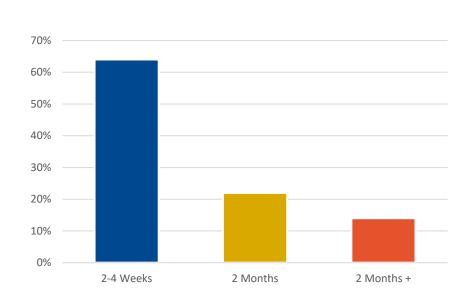
Nearly 40% of companies reported services and consumables shortage.

Stabilization Period 1 (Lock Down)

Stabilization Period 2 (New Norm)

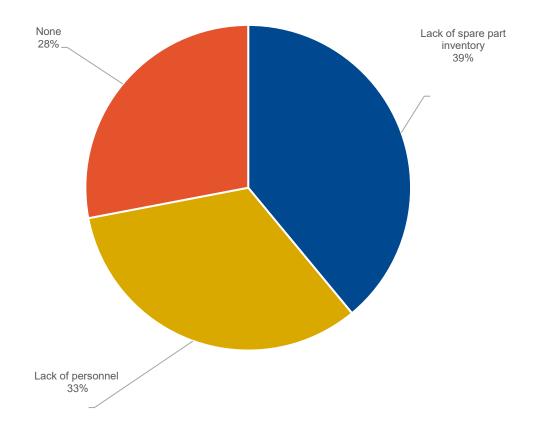


Maintenance:

Maintenance activities reduced to an acceptable minimum

Greater impact on projects in the execution stage

72% of the companies reported some degree of maintenance backlog induced by the pandemic





Operations:

Reduced amount of essential personnel

Key personnel were set in camps, nearby hotels where available

Shift handover was done by phone to avoid direct contact with each other

71% reported remote custody transfer of LNG unloading process

Implemented digital signature, electronic permit to work management system.



LESSONS LEARNED

- 2. Critical activities sense of urgency
- 3. Timely policies and procedures
- 4. Informed workforce
- 5. Phycological and motivational support
- 6. Company technology plan

- 7. Fully functional emergency/crisis room
- 8. Rotating crisis team members
- 9. Emergency procedures update
- 10. Dry runs with executives and higher management
- 11. Long lasting crisis scenarios in your areas



GIIGNL members identified the following items as best practices:

- 12. Adaptability as a key factor in company governance
- 13. Plan for remote workplace implementation.
- 14. SME bank
