

Shell LNG-Related Business Activities and Deals in 2025

November 2024

- The christening took place of Europe's largest LNG bunkering barge, the Energy Stockholm. The vessel, which can carry up to 8,000 cubic metres of LNG, is on long-term charter to Shell for operations at the ports of Zeebrugge, Antwerp, Rotterdam, and Amsterdam.

December 2024

- QatarEnergy and Shell have entered into a new long-term sale and purchase agreement for the supply of three million tons a year of LNG to China.
- Shell and Argentina's YPF signed a deal to develop phase one of an LNG project with an initial capacity of 10 million tonnes of LNG a year.

March 2025

- Capital Markets Day: Shell reaffirmed LNG as a core growth pillar, targeting 4–5% annual LNG sales growth through 2030.
- 2024 LNG Bunkering Milestone Announced (13 March): Shell delivered 1.1 million tonnes of marine LNG in 2024, achieved via 1,000 bunkering operations across 26 locations in 12 countries. Shell also began delivering mass-balanced bio-LNG.

April 2025

- Pavilion Energy Acquisition Finalised (1 April): Shell acquired 100% of Pavilion Energy, gaining 6.5 mtpa of LNG contracts, 2 mtpa regasification capacity (UK, Singapore, Spain), 5 LNG vessels, and LNG bunkering business.

June 2025

- LNG Canada Startup: Shell-led LNG Canada began cooling its first liquefaction train on 16 June, with first LNG production on 22 June.
- LNG Canada First Cargo Exported (30 June): Shell shipped the first cargo of LNG from the LNG Canada facility in Kitimat, British Columbia.

September 2025

- BOTAS Mid-Term LNG Supply Agreement Announced at Gastech (9 September): Shell signed a three-year LNG supply deal with Türkiye's BOTAS.
- Edison LNG Supply Agreement (10 September): Shell signed a 15-year deal with Italy's Edison to supply 0.7 mtpa of U.S. LNG starting in 2028.
- Hapag-Lloyd Bio-LNG Bunkering Agreement (11 September): Shell signed a multi-year liquefied biomethane (Bio-LNG) deal with Hapag-Lloyd. Bio-LNG available at 22 global bunkering locations.
- New LNG Bunkering Location Announced – Portland Port, UK (17 September): Shell completed its first LNG bunkering in Portland, UK
