

# Enel Group

## Company profile

Enel is a multinational power company and a leading integrated player in the global power and renewables markets.

At global level, it is the largest renewable player, the foremost electricity distribution network player by number of grid customers served and the biggest retail operator by customer base.

Enel is present in 28 countries worldwide, producing energy with more than 92 GW of total capacity.

Enel Grids, the Group's global business line dedicated to the management of the electricity distribution service worldwide, delivers electricity through a network of 1.9 million kilometers with approximately 69 million end users. Enel's renewables arm Enel Green Power has a total capacity of more than 67 GW and a generation mix that includes wind, solar, geothermal, and hydroelectric power, as well as energy storage facilities, installed in Europe, the Americas, Africa, Asia, and Oceania. Enel X Global Retail is the Group's business line dedicated to customers around the world with the aim of effectively providing products and services based on their energy needs and encouraging them towards a more conscious and sustainable use of energy. Globally, it provides electricity and integrated energy services with more than 54 million customers worldwide, offering flexibility services aggregating 9.8 GW, managing around 3 million lighting points, and with 30,500 owned public charging points for electric mobility.

## Description of current LNG activities

The Enel Group manages a well-diversified gas portfolio, serving final customers in its core markets and Group gas-fired power plants, as well as optimizing part of its volumes in the international markets.

Enel first entered the LNG business in the early nineties and, to date, can count on a substantial size presence. The LNG business is managed through a global organization and several offices, throughout different countries, in particular in Italy, Spain and Chile. Enel has also had a presence in Singapore since 2018 with an Enel Global Trading branch dedicated to the management of activities in the Asian LNG markets.

During 2024, about 8 bcm of LNG were sourced through a well-diversified portfolio of contracts, in terms of origins, counterparts, durations and indexations. More than one-hundred cargoes were delivered in multiple countries, spread all over the LNG markets. In most of the cases, thanks to the regassification capacities contracted (i.e. Spain, Portugal, Italy, Chile, others), Enel had the ability to deliver directly into the final markets.

On the LNG shipping field, Enel's fleet is currently based on a mix of Long and Medium Term MEGI/XDF modern vessels.
