## 1. Changes in company leadership / shareholding

## 2. Description of current LNG activities

- In 2024, CNOOC remained China's largest LNG importer, with total imports reaching approximately 30.12 million tonnes. The volume accounted for 40% of China's total LNG imports, with supplies mainly sourced from Australia, Qatar, Malaysia, Indonesia, and the United States.
- On April 23,2025, LNG carrier *Kool Frost* chartered by CNOOC called at Bangladesh's Summit LNG terminal, marking CNOOC's first self-operated LNG delivery to the country. The delivery expands CNOOC's trading network into South Asia.

## 3. Notable deals or key events

- CNOOC has taken delivery of three new 174,000 cu m LNG carriers under its mid-to-long term FOB supply project, all built by Hudong-Zhonghua shipyard. The second vessel, Greenergy Pearl, was delivered on December 18, 2024, followed by the third and fourth, Greenergy Star and Greenergy Moon, on September 26, 2025.
- CNOOC has commissioned two massive 270,000 cu m LNG tanks. The first, located at the Yancheng Green Energy Port in Jiangsu Province, began operation on January 6, 2025. The second, at the Jinwan Green Energy Port in the Guangdong-

Hong KONG – Macao Greater Bay Area, was commissioned on February 24, 2025. Both are among the world's largest single -tank LNG storage facilities.
