Introduction to GIIGNL

- Privately funded LNG-import terminal in northern Germany located in Stade at the river Elbe, 17 nautical miles down-river from Hamburg
- Terminal currently under construction:
 - 13.3 bcm/a land-based terminal, exempt from regulation
 - two LNG storage tanks with 240,000 cbm capacity each
 - one jetty up to Q-Max size and one small-scale jetty
 - four truckloading bays
 - gas-grid connection in place, access to hydrogen backbone grid in 2028
 - regasification via residual heat from neighboring industries
- Capacity sold long-term to Shippers EnBW, SEFE and CEZ
- COD expected Q4 2027
- First terminal approved in Germany as being ammonia-ready under the LNG Acceleration Act
