

Mizuho USA Foundation Awards \$1.1 million in Grants in 2024

The Mizuho USA Foundation, the charitable foundation of Mizuho Americas, a subsidiary of Japan-based Mizuho Financial Group, supports innovative nonprofits in New York City that help underestimated young adults acquire technology and professional skills necessary to gain access to competitive-wage jobs. Since its formation on January 1, 2003, the Foundation has awarded nearly \$15 million in grants. We are pleased to announce our 2024 round of awards in our two competitive grant programs, as well as Community Involvement Grants awarded this year to nonprofit volunteer partners.

- 1) **Mizuho FutureReady Grants**: Grant support for new, signature initiatives that provide training in technology skills, expand exposure and access to career paths, and provide the tools and skills necessary to secure gainful and sustainable employment. The Foundation awarded two grants totaling \$550,000.
 - Mizuho awarded NPower New York a three-year \$450,000 grant to support the launch and development of the Path2Tech: Networking & Systems Administration Program, a new training and job placement initiative in New York City. NPower is a national nonprofit organization providing young adults (ages 18-26), military-connected individuals, and women from under-resourced communities with pathways to prosperity through free tech training, professional development, social support services, and job placement assistance with leading employers.
 - Mizuho awarded America On Tech a one-year \$100,000 grant for its Tech Talent Pipeline
 Powered by AI initiative, an effort to integrate AI across its educational curriculum, helping to
 ensure its students and alumni remain competitive in the future workforce. America On
 Tech's mission is to prepare the next generation of technology leaders from underestimated
 communities in New York City and other US cities.
