Catalog Choice sends merchants your catalog opt-out request on your behalf, but please note that we have no control over how and when merchants will process your opt-out request. We're constantly trying to work with merchants to encourage

them to comply with your opt-out requests.

Please note that signing up for this service will not stop all of your incoming paper junk mail in one fell swoop, as Catalog Choice does not have the capacity to stop mail

from your local USPS or from prospecting lists. Catalog Choice recommends that our users sign up for DMA choice in tandem with our service to take your name off of these prospecting lists, because many catalog merchants share lists of personal information with other merchants.

Catalog Choice is a non-profit organization unaffiliated with the mail marketing industry. Catalog Choice does not mail out merchant catalogs or other paper mail, and does not assist with product orders of any kind. Contact the appropriate merchant directly for product-related inquiries.

What Do I Put Into the Organics Cart?

The reason Organics Carts are so important is that using them helps divert materials away from our landfills which is better for the environment. Here is a list to help you use your cart efficiently. Thank you for helping us provide you with the best possible service.

Organics Acceptable List

- Grass and weed clippings
- Shrubs and tree prunings (less than 4" in diameter)
- Leaves, plants and flowers
- Food scraps and food soiled paper products

Non-acceptable Organics List

- No household garbage
- **No plastic bags**
- No dirt or rocks
- No overloading - lid must be closed

Household Hazardous Waste Service Change

As of March 25, 2019 Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) facilities can no longer accept **Prescription Medication** at the Oakland, Livermore, and Hayward drop-off facilities. Prescription Medication is accepted at over 70 drug stores, hospitals, and law enforcement sites throughout the county, for more information visit www.stopwaste.org.

Disposal Options:


Medicines should never be flushed down the toilet or placed in the trash.

- Dispose of your unneeded drugs at local pharmacies, hospitals, and law enforcement sites, see the list below for details.
- Go to stopwaste.org and search Recycle Where? for other locations.



Special Instructions:

- Pills should be poured out into Ziploc bags (it protects your privacy and lowers disposal costs). All of your pills may be mixed together in one bag.
- Needles and other sharps must be packaged in approved sharps containers made with puncture and leak-resistant plastic.
- Liquids and creams: leave in their original container and secure caps/lids. Black out any personally identifying information and place in a Ziploc bag.
