



Reducing Holiday Waste

The holidays can generate a lot of waste—from wrapping paper, packaging, to single-use items. Try these simple swaps to celebrate sustainably:

Wrapping & Packaging Tips

- Use reusable materials like scarves, fabric, newspaper, or gift bags.
- Repurpose baskets, tins, or boxes for creative gift wrapping.
- Choose wrapping paper made with post-consumer recycled content if you buy new.

Shopping & Gifting Tips

- Bring your own bags when shopping for gifts.
- Make your own gift tags and cards or choose ones printed on recycled paper.
- Give gifts that encourage sustainability—like reusable totes, food containers, water bottles, or travel mugs.

Where Your Compost Goes and Why Sorting Matters

AVI delivers compost collected in Dublin to the Altamont Landfill's Covered Aerated Static Pile (CASP) composting facility. The facility turns 156,000 tons of organic material into over 346,000 cubic yards of nutrient-rich compost annually. Ton per ton, CASP composting reduces greenhouse gas emissions by 80% compared to traditional windrow composting—making it a major win for climate action.

To protect the integrity of the compost, proper sorting at the source is essential. By composting correctly, residents help reduce methane emissions, improve soil health, and contribute to a more sustainable, circular economy. Composting just one ton of organic waste can cut emissions equivalent to removing a car from the road for two months.

SB 1383 Reminder: Compost Your Holiday Food & Decor

Reminder that SB 1383 requires all organics, including holiday food waste and decorative organics like pumpkins, poinsettias, and wreaths to be sorted into your compost cart. Composting your organics reduces landfill waste and greenhouse gas emissions.

Resolutions For 2026

Recycle correctly: Put what is allowed in your containers. Many common items like metallic wrapping paper and ribbons do not belong in the recycling bin.

Reconsider before letting go: If it's time to part with some things, do so with intention. Many items like clothing, furniture, and toys can either be repaired or donated for reuse.

Shop at local stores: Shop local and support businesses that focus on sustainable, lasting goods, when possible.

Choose a natural tree this season—it's easy to recycle and helps turn holiday cheer into nutrient-rich compost! Below are your options for holiday tree recycling and safe disposal.



AVI Special Holiday Tree Pick Up

Property managers can order a drop box for clean trees (no decorations and no flocked or plastic trees). Drop boxes range in size from 15-40 cubic yards and service is provided Monday - Friday. Please contact AVI at **(925) 479-9545** for information and to schedule.



Holiday Tree Drop-Off Sites

Bring your clean holiday tree to the Dublin Sports Grounds parking lot and place it into the holiday tree collection boxes between January 5 and January 31, 2026.



Boy Scouts Tree Pickup

Dublin's Troop 905 will pick up trees on Saturday, January 3, 2026 for a \$10 minimum donation.

Reservations required at Troop905.org starting December 1, 2025 through 3 PM, January 2, 2026.

Only clean trees accepted—no flocking, tinsel, or stands.



Flocked or Tinselled Trees

AVI can pickup non-recyclable holiday trees. Call **(925) 479-9545** to schedule a dispose of your tenants flocked or tinselled trees. Fees may apply unless using one of your three **free large item pickups**.



Got Extra Waste?

Remember not to overload your carts. If you have extra garbage or compost, call AVI to arrange an extra pickup or large item pickup.

Extra cardboard may be placed next to your recycling cart for collection at no additional cost.
