



## Residential Landlord Hazardous Waste Service

Because residential landlords are classified as businesses under state and federal law, they are not eligible for the HHW Residential Drop-off Service. Alameda County provides a free hazardous waste drop-off service specifically for landlords.

### TO PARTICIPATE:

1. Provide an EPA Hazardous Waste Identification Number. If you don't have one, visit the [California EPA website \(dtsc.ca.gov\)](https://www.dtsc.ca.gov) or call (800) 618-6942.
2. **Apply for an account** as a Very Small Quantity Generator (VSQG) with Alameda County HHW.
3. Call Alameda County HHW at **(800) 606-6606** to make an appointment. Landlords must have an account and cannot schedule online.
4. Find out **what materials are accepted**.

## Smart Choices When Dining Out



### Bringing Your Own Reusables Is Safe and Allowed

California state law (AB 619) allows customers to bring clean, reusable food and beverage containers for takeout orders and leftovers. When sanitary guidelines are followed, containers may be filled by either food facility staff or the customer.

### California's "Upon Request Only" Foodware Law

Since January 2022, California law (AB 1276) requires disposable foodware accessories and condiments to be provided upon request only.

Choosing to skip single-use utensils, straws, and condiment packets (regardless of whether they are plastic, compostable, bamboo, or paper) is an easy way to reduce waste.



## StopWaste Regulatory Fee

A new StopWaste Regulatory Fee will appear as a separate line item on your garbage bill starting July 1, 2026. The fee funds state-required programs to help keep compostable and recyclable materials out of landfills, reduce food waste, recover surplus edible food for donation, and prevent plastic bag pollution. For residential customers, the fee adds 30 cents per month, and for commercial customers, about \$2 per month, depending on account type and service level. ## Don't Forget Your Reusable Bags!

California's No More Plastic Bags law (SB 1053) encourages shoppers to bring their own reusable bags when heading to the store. Plastic bags are no longer provided, and paper bags are available for a \$0.10 fee. Remembering your reusable bag is an easy way to save a little money and help reduce waste every time you shop.
