

# PERISSOS<sup>+</sup>

In September of 2025, we changed our name. This is the promise of PERISSOS.

The oldest, most deceptive lie in the world traces all the way back to humanity's origin story in Genesis 3.

"You will not certainly die," the serpent said to the woman. "For God knows that when you eat from it your eyes will be opened, and you will be like God..." (Genesis 3:4-5)

In other words: "**God's holding out on you.**"

There's more than what God has offered...If you obey Him, you'll be settling for less.

It's a lie that's fooled billions—convincing people to chase status, sex, money, significance, and whatever else society labels as "more," instead of trusting the way of Jesus.

The lie whispers:

God is restrictive. God is a control freak. Following Jesus means missing out.

But Jesus directly confronted this deception in John 10:10:

"The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy; I have come that they may have life, and have it abundantly."

ABUNDANTLY.

The Greek adjective for the life Jesus described is PERISSOS — it means more than necessary. Extravagant. Overflowing. Even superfluous. Jesus didn't come to bring us less — He came to bring us more.



Not a timid, watered-down existence. Not a beggar or getting-by mentality. But a passionate life marked by more joy, more power, more purpose and more... life.

If you're wondering what PERISSOS looks like, look to the life of Jesus. Perissos is everywhere:

His first miracle wasn't healing or raising the dead — it was turning water into wine. The party was already winding down. But Jesus made the best wine, in abundance, after everyone had already had enough.

That's PERISSOS.

When a leper took 49 forbidden steps toward Jesus, the 50th was up to Christ. What did Jesus do? Well, He didn't shout healing from a distance. No, He reached out...and touched the man. He didn't just heal a disease—He restored a person.

That's PERISSOS.

Remember what Jesus made of those five loaves of bread and two fish? 10,000 full stomachs and 12 baskets of leftovers. Do you know what the number “12” signifies in the Bible? You guessed it. Abundance. More than enough.

That's PERISSOS.

God could've saved us in a weekend. But instead, He came to live among us for thirty-three years. He chose to walk with us, talk with us, eat with us, laugh and cry with us. He took on flesh and gave away abundant life with every breath He breathed.

That's more than necessary. Extravagant. Outlandish even.

That's PERISSOS.

If perissos is what Jesus promised, then perissos is what we must pursue.

If Jesus came to bring abundant life, then we cannot settle for anything less.

As followers of Jesus, we weren't meant to survive or even manage our faith — we were made to audaciously live it out.

So, we refuse to shrink back. We refuse to play it safe. We refuse to be and build a church marked by moderation and scarcity.

Instead, we will exist to point people to perissos by embracing a culture marked by perissos.

- + A culture of **extravagant zeal for God**.
- + A culture of **relentless pursuit of the lost**.
- + A culture of **uncommon community**.
- + A culture of **radical generosity**.
- + A culture of **vigilant hope for heaven**.

This is the life God promised to provide. This is the life Jesus died to redeem. This is the life the Holy Spirit empowers us to live. This is the life our world is desperate to experience.

Less is a lie.

**Life+Life Abundant in Christ** is the promise.




GOING TO OUTLANDISH
