










ASSET GROWTH OVER TIME


2020 COMMUNITY IMPACT

JERI BELL SCHOLARSHIP FUND: AN EDUCATOR WITH A HEART OF GOLD



AFTER HER RECENT PASSING IN 2020, JERI BELL'S FAMILY PARTNERED WITH THE FOUNDATION TO CREATE THE JERI BELL MEMORIAL FUND. SEVERAL MEMBERS OF HER FAMILY, FRIENDS AND FORMER STUDENTS AND TEACHERS ALL CONTRIBUTED TO REMEMBER JERI IN THIS VERY SPECIAL WAY.

JERI SPENT THE MAJORITY OF HER LIFE DEDICATED TO HELPING CHILDREN IN OUR COMMUNITY AS AN EDUCATOR AND COMMUNITY VOLUNTEER. SHE WAS A VOLUNTEER AT ROBERT GRAY ELEMENTARY FOR MANY YEARS WHERE TWO OF HER GRANDCHILDREN ATTENDED. SHE WOULD POP POPCORN ON FRIDAYS FOR THE KIDS, LISTEN TO KIDS READ IN THE CLASSROOM AND WOULD ANONYMOUSLY ADOPT SEVERAL ROBERT GRAY FAMILIES TO BUY THEM CHRISTMAS GIFTS.

HER DAUGHTER JULIE REMEMBERS HER MOM AS SOMEONE WHO WENT ABOVE AND BEYOND FOR HER STUDENTS AND FELLOW TEACHERS SAYING, *"WHEN SHE WAS TEACHING, SHE OFTEN TALKED ABOUT THE CHILDREN WHO CAME UNPREPARED AND WITH NO SUPPLIES. SHE ALWAYS HELPED THEM, GAVE THEM WHAT THEY NEEDED AND ENCOURAGED THEM ALWAYS. SHE JUST WANTED TO HELP ALL OF HER STUDENTS SUCCEED. SHE WOULD PURCHASE MOUNDS OF SUPPLIES TO GIVE TO THE KIDS IN HER CLASSROOM. SHE SHARED TIME AND SUPPLIES WITH HER FELLOW TEACHERS, ESPECIALLY THE NEW ONES WHO NEEDED MENTORING."*

JERI NOT ONLY GAVE BACK TO HER STUDENTS SHE ALSO SUPPORTED SEVERAL NONPROFITS DURING HER LIFETIME INCLUDING: THE ABERDEEN FOOD BANK, AHS FOOTBALL, AHS MARCHING BAND, AHS BOOSTER CLUB, PAWS AND WOULD ALWAYS SUPPORT ANY FUNDRAISER THAT HER FRIEND'S CHILDREN WERE INVOLVED IN. SHE ALSO ANONYMOUSLY HELPED MANY FAMILIES IN NEED.

CAMP VICTORY AGENCY ENDOWMENT FUND: PROVIDING HEALING TO CHILDHOOD SURVIVORS



IN 2020, CAMP VICTORY RECENTLY CREATED AN AGENCY ENDOWMENT FUND WITH THE FOUNDATION TO ENSURE A STABLE SOURCE OF FUNDING FOR THE FUTURE. ALL AGENCY ENDOWMENT FUNDS AT THE FOUNDATION ARE ELIGIBLE FOR A 20% MATCH PER YEAR UP TO \$10,000.

THEIR MISSION IS TO EMPOWER SURVIVORS OF CHILDHOOD SEXUAL ABUSE TO DISCOVER AND EMBRACE THEIR SELF-VALUE AND ENCOURAGE MOVEMENT TOWARD HEALING BY PROVIDING CAMPS AND SUPPORTIVE PROGRAMS THAT CREATE COMMUNITY AND BUILD RESILIENCY.

CAMP VICTORY PROVIDES A SAFE, NURTURING ENVIRONMENT WHERE CAMPERS CAN HEAL AND THRIVE IN A SUPPORTIVE COMMUNITY. THERE IS NO COST TO ATTEND. VOLUNTEERS ARE CAREFULLY SCREENED AND TRAINED. CAMP VICTORY IS A PRIVATE, 501 (C) (3), NON-PROFIT ORGANIZATION.

CAMP VICTORY HAS BEEN A PART OF OUR COMMUNITY FOR 30 YEARS. THEY HAVE ALL OF THE TRADITIONS OF A GREAT CAMP—CRAFTS, SINGING, HIKING, CAMPFIRES, SKITS & STORIES, S'MORES AND ALL KINDS OF FUN ACTIVITIES—ALL INFUSED WITH THE INTENTIONALITY OF A CARING AND SAFE COMMUNITY WHERE YOUTH CAN GROW, PLAY, HEAL, AND THRIVE. CAMPERS GET TO SHOW UP AND BE THEIR BEST SELVES AND ARE CELEBRATED, ATTENDED TO AND ENCOURAGED.

AGENCY ENDOWMENTS ARE POOLED WITH OUR ASSETS TOTALING \$83.4M AND ARE A GREAT WAY TO ENSURE FUNDING CAN LAST IN PERPETUITY.

AGENCY ENDOWMENT FUNDS ARE OPENED AND HELD AT THE GRAYS HARBOR COMMUNITY FOUNDATION BY NONPROFIT ORGANIZATIONS WHO WISH TO ESTABLISH A FUND THAT IS KEPT IN PERPETUITY TO PROVIDE AN ONGOING STREAM OF REVENUE GENERATED BY THE INVESTMENT OF PRINCIPAL. AGENCY ENDOWMENTS CAN ALSO BE ESTABLISHED BY DONORS WHO WISH TO SPECIFY A PARTICULAR CHARITABLE AGENCY OR ORGANIZATION TO RECEIVE PROCEEDS FROM THEIR FUND.

AS AN EXTRA BONUS, THE FOUNDATION WILL MATCH 20% OF ANY NEW GIFT TO AN ELIGIBLE AGENCY ENDOWMENT THAT HAS AGREED TO COMPLY WITH OUR SPENDING POLICY. DONATIONS ARE SUBJECT TO A MAXIMUM OF \$10,000 IN MATCHING FUNDS FOR EACH ENDOWED AGENCY FUND PER CALENDAR YEAR.

REMEMBERING A COMMUNITY CHAMPION: THE LIFE AND LEGACY OF JANE GOLDBERG



A COMMUNITY IS ONLY AS STRONG AS THE PEOPLE THAT LIFT IT UP AND CONTINUE TO BE ITS CHAMPION THROUGH GOOD TIMES AND BAD. JANE GOLDBERG EMBODIED THE VERY ESSENCE OF WHAT IT MEANS TO BE A TRUE COMMUNITY CHAMPION DURING HER 50 YEARS WORKING AND SERVING GRAYS HARBOR. HER RECENT PASSING HAS LEFT A HOLE IN THE LIVES OF ALL THAT KNEW HER AND SO MANY LOCAL AGENCIES THAT WERE TOUCHED BY HER KINDNESS AND WIT. FORTUNATELY FOR SO MANY OF US, A LIFE SO MEANINGFUL WILL CONTINUE TO SHINE BRIGHT LONG AFTER SHE IS GONE.

JANE'S ENTHUSIASM COULD LIGHT UP A ROOM AND HER CONNECTEDNESS TO SO MANY DIFFERENT PARTS OF OUR COMMUNITY WAS ADMIRABLE. SHE CAME TO GRAYS HARBOR IN THE EARLY 1970S AFTER SHE MET HER HUSBAND, LARRY AT THE UNIVERSITY OF WASHINGTON, WHERE SHE WAS A JOURNALISM STUDENT. HE RETURNED TO ABERDEEN TO BE PART OF HIS FAMILY'S FURNITURE BUSINESS, AND SHE WENT TO WORK AS A REPORTER FOR THE DAILY WORLD.

AS A LOVING MOTHER AND WIFE, AS WELL AS DEDICATED MEMBER TO OUR COMMUNITY, JANE WAS PASSIONATE ABOUT EDUCATION. SHE SERVED ON THE ABERDEEN SCHOOL DISTRICT BOARD FOR 20 YEARS AND WAS A HUGE ADVOCATE FOR GRAYS HARBOR COLLEGE. SHE WAS A SUPPORTER OF SO MANY LOCAL NONPROFITS, NEVER WORRYING ABOUT SEEING HER NAME ON A DONOR WALL OR RECEIVING PUBLIC ACKNOWLEDGEMENTS, JUST SOMEONE WHO CARED DEEPLY ABOUT OTHERS AND WANTED TO HELP TO THE BEST OF HER ABILITIES.

JANE WAS A LONGTIME GRAYS HARBOR COMMUNITY FOUNDATION BOARD MEMBER AND ALTHOUGH HER BATTLE WITH ALS PROGRESSED QUICKLY OVER THE LAST FEW YEARS, SHE NEVER MISSED A GRANTS COMMITTEE REVIEW, EVEN IF IT MEANT WRITING OUT HER NOTES ON EVERY APPLICATION AND SENDING THEM ELECTRONICALLY.
